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## **Proposed Ordinance Language:**

## § 515-16 **Refilling excavations.**

[Amended 1-25-1989 by Ord. No. 3003; 11-13-2019 by Ord. No. 5691]

## **A**.

All persons opening or digging any of the streets of the City for any purpose whatever shall refill the same in the following manner: Spaces excavated for but not occupied by structures shall be backfilled with suitable material as approved by the City Engineer. All standing water shall be removed prior to backfill. Backfill material shall be placed in uniform horizontal layers of not more than a loose four-inch depth for full width of the cross section. Each layer is to be thoroughly compacted by adequate tamping. This procedure shall be followed from the bottom of the excavation until the excavation is solidly filled to street level. Frozen material shall not be used for backfill at any time. Surfacing material, other than earth, removed for trench excavation shall not be used for backfill and shall be removed from the site. All excavations shall be backfilled within a reasonable time allowed for the work to be performed. The City Engineer shall notify the permittee when such sufficient time has elapsed. No permit shall be issued for the opening or digging up of any street in the City between December 1 of any year and March 1 the following year for any purpose other than for repairing leaking or damaged water, gas pipe, sewer or drain damage or other specific emergencies and then only with the consent ofunless approved by the City Engineer.
