

**ARTICLE 10: NON-CRIMINAL DISPOSITION BYLAW**

Move the Town vote to amend the Town’s General Bylaws, Article 1, Section 2, Subsection B by amending and inserting the following in **Bold**;

**§ 1-2 Noncriminal disposition; enforcement.**

- A. Whoever violates any provision of Chapter 52, Personnel Policies, or Chapter 187, Abandoned Vehicles, of the Code of the Town of Orange, the violation of which is subject to a specific penalty, may be penalized by a noncriminal disposition as provided in MGL c.40, § 21D.
- B. It is the intention of this provision that the following bylaws and sections of bylaws are to be included within the scope of this section, that the specific penalties as listed here shall apply in such cases and that in addition to police officers, who shall in all cases be considered enforcing persons for the purpose of this provision, the municipal personnel listed for each section, if any, shall also be enforcing persons for such sections. Each day on which any violation exists shall be deemed to be a separate offense. [Amended 5-2-2005 ATM, Art. 11, approved 8-4-2005]
