ORDINANCE NO. 2024:05**

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PARSIPPANY-TROY HILLS, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, NAMING STREETS WITHIN THE PARQ DEVELOPMENT AND RENAMING LANIDEX PLAZA TO PARQ LANE

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of ParsIPPany-Troy Hills (“Township”) has received a request from the developer of the PARQ Developments to change the name of Lanidex Plaza within the PARQ Development and name private streets within the PARQ Development; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:67-1(k) provides that the governing body of a municipality may make, amend, repeal, and enforce ordinances to provide for changing the names of streets within such municipality; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of ParsIPPany-Troy Hills, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION I:

1. The name of the street currently designated as Lanidex Plaza is hereby redesignated as PARQ Lane.
2. The unnamed streets currently within the PARQ Development shall be named Cypress Lane, Cedar Lane, Sycamore Lane, Willow Lane, and Elm Drive in accordance with the attached diagram annexed hereto as Exhibit A.
3. The Township Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the United States Postal Service; the New Jersey Department of Transportation; the Township Engineering Department; The Township Police Department; the 911 Coordinator; and all fire, rescue, and emergency services which serve the Township of ParsIPPany-Troy Hills, as well as any other State, County, of Federal agencies which may require notification of a street name change.

SECTION II:

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION III:

If any article, section, subsection, paragraphs, phrase or sentence is, for any reason, inconsistent with the Code of the Township of ParsIPPany, or is held to be unconstitutional or invalid, said article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence shall be deemed severable.

SECTION IV:

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.
