BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Poughkeepsie, pursuant to a duly noticed public hearing held on November 1, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall, Town of Poughkeepsie, One Overocker Road, Poughkeepsie, New York, does hereby adopt the attached local law amending Chapters 76 and 210 relating to "Seasonal Sales"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proposed local law, with minor refinements suggested by the Code Update Committee dated October 18, 2023, is annexed hereto as Exhibit A and the Town Board does direct that said proposed Local Law be spread across the record as if it, in fact, had been read verbatim; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legal Notice of Public Hearing was posted on October 10, 2023 and published in the Poughkeepsie Journal on October 17, 2023; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board had previously declared its intent to act as Lead Agency under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act and declared this action to amend the Town Code as a Type 1 Action under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, and an Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) is annexed hereto; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that after reviewing the proposed local law and the annexed Full Environmental Assessment Form (Full EAF), this Board determines that the adoption of this local law will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact and it authorizes the Supervisor or his designee to answer "no" to each of the questions on Part 2 of the EAF, and to complete the Part 3 Negative Declaration, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a written recommendation was received from the Dutchess County Department of Planning and Economic Development dated October 3, 2023 stating that the proposed amendment was a matter of local concern; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a written recommendation dated October 20, 2023 was received from the Town of Poug, keepsie Planning Board in which said Board recommended adoption of the proposed local law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk notified the Clerks of the surrounding municipalities of the public hearing pursuant to GML 239-nn; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, and that said local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

#### TOWN OF POUGHKEEPSIE LOCAL LAW NO. (PROPOSED) OF THE YEAR 2023

# A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 76 ENTITLED "COMMUNITY EVENTS, OUTDOOR" AND CHAPTER 210 ENTITLED "ZONING" FOR SEASONAL SALES

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Poughkeepsie as follows:

## SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This local law amends Chapter 76 entitled "Community Events, Outdoor" to delete references to seasonal sales, and it amends Chapter 210 entitled "Zoning" to include provisions for seasonal sales. The proposed amendments to the Town Code are designed to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public. The amendments are consistent with the recommendations of the Town's 2021 Comprehensive Plan, and with "Greenway Connections: Greenway Compact Program and Guides for Dutchess County Communities" pursuant to Chapter 18 of the Town Code.

#### SECTION 2. APPLICATION

This Local Law shall apply within the Town of Poughkeepsie.

#### SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY

The invalidity of any word, section, clause, paragraph, sentence, part, or provision of this Local Law shall not affect the validity of any other part of this Local Law, which can be given effect without such part or parts.

# SECTION 4. AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 76 OF THE CODE ENTITLED "COMMUNITY EVENTS, OUTDOOR"

- § 4.1. The existing § 76-3D of the Code is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following new § 76-3D:
- $\S$  76-3D. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to garage sales, tent sales, or seasonal sales which are regulated by  $\S$  210-72 of the Town Code.
- § 4.2. The existing § 76-6B of the Code is hereby amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following new § 76-6B:

§ 76-6B. Community event, seasonal. The Town Board may by resolution authorize the issuance of a permit for a seasonal outdoor community event that is not classified as a short-term event, such as a farmers' market or other event associated with a season or a long-term cultural event, for a designated location on private property and for designated dates and times approved by the Town Board, subject to the following:

- (1) Such events shall be permitted as an accessory use to a non-residential use in the following classes of districts as set forth in § 210-10 of the Town Code: Center and Hamlet Districts, and Business and Commercial Districts.
- (2) The applicant shall provide a sketch plan sufficient to indicate that all structures associated with the event shall be sited in a location that does not obstruct or interfere with the free flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic, does not restrict visibility at any driveway or intersection, and does not block fire lanes or access roads for emergency vehicles.

## SECTION 5. AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 210 OF THE CODE ENTITLED "ZONING"

§ 5.1. Section 210-9 of the Code is hereby amended by deleting the definition of "garage sale" in its entirety and replacing it with the following new definition of "garage sale."

#### GARAGE SALE

See "temporary sales."

§ 5.2. Section 210-9 of the Code is hereby amended by deleting the definitions of "Temporary/Tent Sales" and "Tent Sale" in their entirety and replacing them with the following new definition of "Temporary Sales."

#### TEMPORARY SALES

- A. Garage Sale. Any sale of merchandise sold from a residence, whether it is indoors or outside.
- B. Seasonal Sale. The use of any lot or portion thereof by any vendor or person who is not an owner of or a regular lessee tenant of said building or lot for the wholesale or retail sale of merchandise to the general public when such sale is for a specified, limited period of time.
- C. Tent Sale. The use of any lot or portion thereof for the wholesale or retail sale of merchandise to the general public when such use is for a specified, limited period of time. The sale of merchandise must be the normal business of the establishment, and the merchandise for sale must be the normal stock-in-trade of the establishment.
- § 5.3. Section 210-9 of the Code is hereby amended by the addition of the following new definitions:

#### SEASONAL SALE

See "temporary sales."

#### TENT SALE

See "temporary sales."

§ 5.4. The heading of § 210-72 is hereby amended to add "seasonal sales" so that it reads "Garage sales; tent sales; seasonal sales."

### § 5.5. A new § 210-72C is hereby added to Chapter 210 of the Code to read as follows:

- § 210-72C. A revocable, nonrenewable permit issued by the Zoning Administrator is required in order to conduct a seasonal sale, such as the sale of Christmas trees or fireworks, subject to the following:
  - (a) Such sales shall be permitted as an accessory use to a non-residential use in the following classes of districts as set forth in § 210-10 of the Town Code: Center and Hamlet Districts, and Business and Commercial Districts.
  - (b) The applicant shall provide a sketch plan sufficient to indicate that all structures associated with the sale shall be sited in a location that does not obstruct or interfere with the free flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic, does not restrict visibility at any driveway or intersection, and does not block fire lanes or access roads for emergency vehicles.
  - (c) Such sales shall occur only between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 910:00 p.m.
  - (d) Temporary signs shall be permitted in accordance with § 210-120 of this chapter.
  - (e) The permit is automatically revoked should the Zoning Administrator or the Town of Poughkeepsie Police, Senior Officer in Charge, determine in writing that the sale is creating an unsafe traffic condition.

#### SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE

This local law shall take effect immediately after it is filed with the Secretary of State as provided in section twenty-seven of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
