LOCAL LAW NO 2 OF 2023

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE BOARD, THE PLANNING BOARD AND THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS OF THE VILLAGE OF ADAMS TO USE VIDEOCONFERENCING TECHNOLOGY TO PARTICIPATE IN PUBLIC MEETINGS

## **Section 1. Legislative Intent**

It is the intent of this Local Law to give the Village Board, the Planning Board, and the Zoning Board of Appeals the authority to participate in meetings via videoconference in a manner consistent with the Village's videoconferencing policy and the authority granted in Public Officers Law § 103-a.

## **Section 2. Authority**

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to Public Officers Law § 103-a which expressly authorizes the Village Board to adopt a local law giving the Municipal Boards the authority to participate in meetings via videoconference from locations not accessible to the public so long as a quorum of the board/body participates from locations where the public may be physically present and other conditions are met.

## **Section 3. Videoconferencing for Public Meetings**

The Village Board of the Village of Adams hereby authorizes members of the Village's boards to participate in meetings using videoconferencing technology in a manner consistent with Public Officers Law § 103-a and the Village's videoconferencing policy adopted by the Village Board.

## **Section 4. Severability.**

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

## **Section 5. Effective date.**

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.



## RESOLUTION # 7 of 2023 ENACT A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE BOARD, PLANNING BOARD and ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS TO USE VIDEOCONFERENCING TECHNOLOGY TO PARTICIPATE IN PUBLIC MEETINGS

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board for the Village of Adams, New York has considered expanding options for participation at meetings; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board intends to adopt legislation to Authorize the Village Board, Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals to Use Videoconferencing Technology to Participate In Public Meetings.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Village Board for the Village of Adams, New York as follows:

1. The forgoing recitations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if set forth hereafter.
2. The Village Board hereby enacts the Local Law Authorizing the Village Board, the Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Appeals to Use Videoconferencing Technology to Participate in Public Meetings as being in the best interests of the Village of Adams.
3. A policy addressing that use will be adopted and must be followed by the Village's boards.
4. The Mayor for the Village of Adams and the Village Clerk for the Village of Adams, their respective agents and employees are authorized to sign all documents and take all steps necessary to enact this legislation.

5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

# VILLAGE OF ADAMS

## Procedures for Member Videoconferencing Pursuant to Public Officers Law §103-a

In compliance with Public Officers Law (POL) §103-a(2)(a), the Village of Adams, including the Village Board of the Village of Adams, the Planning Board of the Village of Adams and the Village of Adams Zoning Board of Appeals (collectively known as the "Village") following a public hearing, authorized by resolution on Feb. 21st, 2023 the use of videoconferencing as described in POL §103-a.

The following procedures are hereby established to satisfy the requirement of POL §103-a(2)(b) that any public body which in its discretion wishes to permit its members to participate in meetings by videoconferencing from private locations – under extraordinary circumstances – must establish written procedures governing member and public attendance.

1. Village members shall be physically present at any meeting of the Village unless such member is unable to be physically present at one of the designated public meeting locations due to extraordinary circumstances.
2. For purposes of these procedures, the term "extraordinary circumstances" includes disability, illness, caregiving responsibilities, or any other significant or unexpected factor or event which precludes the member's physical attendance at such meeting.
3. If a member is unable to be physically present at one of the designated public meeting locations and wishes to participate by videoconferencing from a private location due to extraordinary circumstances, the member must notify the Mayor and/or Chairman of their respective Board no later than four (4) business days prior to the scheduled meeting in order for proper notice to the public to be given.
4. If there is a quorum of members participating at a physical location(s) open to the public, the Village may properly convene a meeting. A member who is participating from a remote location that is not open to in-person physical attendance by the public *shall not* count toward a quorum of the Village but may participate and vote if there is a quorum of members at a physical location(s) open to the public.
5. Except in the case of executive sessions conducted pursuant to POL §105 or §108, the Village shall ensure that its members can be heard, seen, and identified while the meeting is being conducted, including but not limited to any motions, proposals, resolutions, and any other matter formally discussed or voted upon. This shall include the use of first and last name placards physically placed in front of the members or, for members participating by videoconferencing from private locations due to extraordinary circumstances, such members must ensure that their full first and last name appears on their videoconferencing screen.
6. The minutes of the meetings involving videoconferencing based on extraordinary

6. The minutes of the meetings involving videoconferencing based on extraordinary circumstances pursuant to POL §103-a shall include which, if any, members participated by videoconferencing from a private location due to such extraordinary circumstances.
7. The public notice for the meeting shall inform the public:
  - (i) that extraordinary circumstances videoconferencing will (or may) be used,
  - (ii) where the public can view and/or participate in such meeting,
  - (iii) where required documents and records will be posted or available, and
  - (iv) the physical location(s) for the meeting where the public can attend.
8. The Village shall provide that each open portion of any meeting conducted using extraordinary circumstances videoconferencing shall be recorded and such recordings posted or linked on the Village's website ([www.villageofadams.com](http://www.villageofadams.com)) within five (5) business days following the meeting and shall remain so available for a minimum of five (5) years thereafter. Such recordings shall be transcribed upon request.
9. If members of the Village are authorized to participate by videoconferencing from a private location due to extraordinary circumstances, the Village shall provide the opportunity for members of the public to view such meeting by video, and to participate in proceedings by videoconference in real time where public comment or participation is authorized. The Village shall ensure that where extraordinary circumstances videoconferencing is used, it authorizes the same public participation or testimony as in person participation or testimony.
10. Open meetings of the Village conducted using extraordinary circumstances videoconferencing pursuant to the provisions of POL §103-a shall be broadcast pursuant to the requirements of POL §103(f) and shall utilize technology to permit access by members of the public with disabilities consistent with the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), as amended, and corresponding guidelines. For the purposes of this guideline, "disability" shall have the meaning defined in Executive Law § 292.
11. The in-person participation requirements of POL §103-a(2)(c) shall not apply during a state disaster emergency declared by the governor pursuant to Executive Law §28 if the Village determines that the circumstances necessitating the emergency declaration would affect or impair the ability of the Village to hold an in-person meeting.
12. These procedures shall be conspicuously posted on the Village's website ([www.villageofadams.com](http://www.villageofadams.com)).
13. These procedures may be amended, changed or repealed by resolution by the Village Board.
