## ORDINANCE NO.10-24

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF AIRPORT DRIVE, MISSOURI, AMENDING ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 135, <u>PROCUREMENT, CONFLICT OF INTEREST</u>, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF AIRPORT DRIVE, MISSOURI, BY THE REENACTMENT OF SECTION 135.060, <u>FINANCIAL INTEREST DISCLOSURE</u>, IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROVISIONS OF SECTION 105.485.4 OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI REVISED STATUTES.

**WHEREAS,** it appears the Village of Airport Drive has an operating budget of over One Million Dollars for the time period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provision of RSMo Section 105.483 et. seq., the Village is required to comply with the provisions of Missouri's Personal Financial Disclosure Statement and Conflict of Interest Law or opt out of those provisions by adopting its own Conflict of Interest and Financial Disclosure provisions; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Trustees desires to opt out of the provisions of Section 105.483 et. seq., RSMo, by the adoption of this Financial Interest Disclosure and Conflict of Interest policy.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Airport Drive, Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 135, <u>Procurement, Conflict of Interest</u>, of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Airport Drive, Missouri, be and the same is hereby amended by the reenactment of a Section 135.060, <u>Financial Interest Disclosure</u>, to read as follows:

## ARTICLE II FINANCIAL INTEREST

"135.060. Financial Interest Disclosure.

A. <u>Declaration of Policy</u>. The proper operation of municipal government requires that public officials and employees be independent, impartial, and responsible to the people; that government decisions and policy be make in the proper channels of the governmental structure; that public office not be used for personal gain; and that the public have confidence in the integrity of its government. In recognition of these goals, there is hereby established a procedure for disclosure by certain officials and employees of private financial or other interest in matters affecting the Village.

B. <u>Conflicts of Interest</u>. The Chairman or any member of the Board of Trustees who has a substantial personal or private interest, as defined by State law, in any bill shall

disclose on the records of the Board of Trustees the nature of his interest and shall disqualify himself from voting on any matters relating to this interest.

C. <u>Disclosure Reports</u>. Each elected official and the Village Clerk shall disclose the following information by May 1 if any such transactions were engaged in during the previous calendar year:

1. For such person and all persons within the first degree of consanguinity or affinity of such person, the date and the identities of the parties to each transaction with a total value in excess of Five Hundred and No/100 (\$500.00) Dollars, if any, that such person had with the political subdivision, other that compensation received as an employee or payment of any tax, fee, or penalty due to the political subdivision, and other than transfers for no consideration to the political subdivision; and

 The date and the identities of the parties to each transaction known to the person with a total value in excess of Five Hundred and No/100 (\$500.00)
Dollars, if any, that any business entity in which such person had a substantial interest, had with the political subdivision, other than payment of any tax, fee, or penalty due to the political subdivision or transactions involving payment for providing utility service to the political subdivision, and other than transfers for no consideration to the political subdivision; and

3. The Village Clerk and Deputy Village Clerk shall each also disclose by May 1 for the previous calendar year, the following information:

- a. The name and address of each of the employers of such person from whom income of One Thousand and No/100 (\$1,000.00) Dollars or more was received during the year covered by the statement;
- b. The name and address of each sole proprietorship that he owned; the name, address and the general nature of the business conducted of each general partnership and joint venture in which he was a partner or participant; the name and address of each partner or co-participant for each partnership or joint venture, unless such names and addresses are filed by the partnership or joint venture with the Secretary of State; the name and address and general nature of the business conducted of any closely held corporation or limited partnership in which the person owned ten (10%) percent or more of any class of the outstanding stock or limited partnership units; and the name of any publicly traded corporation or limited partnership that is listed on a regulated stock exchange or automated quotation system in which the person owned two (2%) percent or more to any class of outstanding stock, limited partnership units, or other equity interests; and
- c. The name and address of each corporation for which such person served in the capacity of a director, officer, or receiver.

D. <u>Filing of Reports</u>. The reports shall be filed with the Village Clerk and with the Ethics Commission. The reports shall be available for public inspection and copying during normal business hours.

E. <u>When Filed</u>. The financial interest statements shall be filed at the following times, but no person is required to file more than one financial interest statement in any calendar year:

1. Each person appointed to office shall file the statement within thirty (30) days of such appointment or employment;

2. Every other person required to file a financial interest statement shall file the statement annually, not later than May 1, and the statement shall cover the calendar year ending immediately preceding December 31; provided that any member of the Board of Trustees may supplement the financial interest statement to report additional interests acquired after December 31 of the covered year until the date of filing of the financial interest statement.

Section 2. <u>Filing of Ordinance</u>. The Village Clerk shall send a certified copy of this ordinance to the Missouri Ethics Commission within ten (10) days of its adoption.

Section 3. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval and shall remain in effect until amended or repealed by the Board of Trustees."
