# Town of Arbor Vitae, Vilas County, Wisconsin Ordinance #01-2024 Amending Ordinance #2-2016/Chapter 306 Vehicles-All Terrain

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Arbor Vitae enacted Ordinance No. 2-2016 which regulated the use of All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility Terrain Vehicles for the Town of Arbor Vitae; and

WHEREAS, the original Ordinance is referenced as Ordinance #2-2016 or Chapter 306. Vehicles, All-Terrain; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Arbor Vitae would like to amend the original Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the matters before the Board, the Town Board of the Town of Arbor Vitae does hereby ordain to amend Chapter 306 or Ordinance No. 2-2016 as follows:

Amend section 306-4 to match the age requirement set by the State of Wisconsin. The Amendment to state the following:

To operate an all-terrain vehicle or utility terrain vehicle a person must:

<u>A</u>

Comply with the age requirements set by the State of Wisconsin in Wis. Stats., § 23.33 B.

Possess an all-terrain vehicle safety certificate unless the operator was born on or before January 1, 1988;

<u>C.</u>

Operate at a speed no faster that vehicle speed limit of 25 miles per hour or as posted; <u>D.</u>

Operate only on the right side of the roadway;

<u>E.</u>

Operate with headlights on at all times.

Amend Section 306-8 Sunset Clause to state the following: All paved townmaintained roads will be open to year-round ATV/UTV use unless posted otherwise. Vandercook Road, Plum Vitae Road, Day Lake Road and any other town-maintained gravel road is subject to a sunset clause and open to ATV/UTV use from May 1 until October 31 unless affirmatively reauthorized by the Town Board.

#### Add Section 306-9 Definition

All-Terrian Vehicle - An engine-driven device which has a net weight of 900 pounds or less, which is originally manufactured with a width of 50 inches or less, that is not tracked, which is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator and which is designed by the manufacturer to travel on three or more low-pressure tires.

Utility Terrain Vehicle-A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device that does not meet federal motor vehicle safety standards in effect on July 1, 2012, that is not a golf cart, low-speed vehicle, dune buggy, minitruck, or tracked vehicle, that is designed to be used primarily off of a highway, and that has, and was originally manufactured with, all of the following:

### <u>(a)</u>

A net weight, without fluids, of 3,000 pounds or less.

## <u>(b)</u>

Four or more low-pressure or nonpneumatic tires.

## <u>(c)</u>

A steering wheel.

### <u>(d)</u>

A taillight.

#### <u>(e)</u>

A brake light.

## <u>(f)</u>

Two headlights.

## <u>(g)</u>

A width of not more than 65 inches.

## <u>(h)</u>

A system of seat belts, or a similar system, for restraining each occupant of the device in the event of an accident.

#### <u>(i)</u>

A system of structural members designed to reduce the likelihood that an occupant would be crushed as the result of a rollover of the device.

That the remainder of Chapter 306/Ordinance #2-2016 remains in full force and effect unless modified herein.
