STATE OF NEW YORK COUNTY OF ALBANY

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Berne was held on the above date with the following officers present:

Supervisor Crosier

Councilmembers Golden, Crounse, Huth, & Hamilton Town Clerk Favreau, and Highway Superintendent Storm.

Also present were Attorney Conboy and interested citizens. Supervisor Crosier called the meeting to order at 8:00 PM and the minutes of the previous monthly meeting were approved as presented.

The Supervisor then opened the meeting to guests.

Several residents who were in attendance were given an opportunity to speak. Many expressed opposition to the proposed zoning amendments and some stated that they were in favor of the passage of the amendments.

Attorney Jeffrey Baker, representing the Berne Hamlet Neighborhood Association, presented a petition to the Board signed by 35 residents of the TNMU-1 Zone which stated that they "object to the proposed rezoing because it will add inappropriate commercial uses in a traditionally residential area and will be inconsistent with the existing community character and will be detrimental to the property values".

Attorney Baker further stated that his is aware of a town law which states that if 20% of the landowners in an area to be rezoned sign a petition in opposition, a vote by 3/4 of the board would be required in order for adoption.

Mary Alice Molgard, Library Board Chair, requested a copy of the January 1, Organizational Meeting minutes. She stated that her reason for being present was to inform the board that she objected to the fact that the Library Board was not consulted regarding the most recent appointment of a library trustee.

Sue Hawks-Teeter asked why it is necessary to allow gas stations in the hamlet in order to enact the TNMU-1 Zone plan. Councilman Golden identified the boundaries of the current existing neighborhood commercial zone which permits gas stations as well as many other uses which would not be permitted in the proposed amendments. Councilman Huth stated that the definite intent of the rezoning study indicated that it is logical to keep the option for having gas stations, where the population is concentrated (in the hamlet) in order that the rural areas can be kept rural and scenic.

Correspondence included:

- 1. A proposal from the City of Albany to renew its agreement for use of the landfill facility at the current tipping rate of \$52.
- 2. A notice from the tax collector stating that the rate per thousand for 2005 is \$10.83.
- 3. A letter of resignation from Library Trustee, Jim O'Shea
- 4. A notice from the Albany County Executive stating that the County Legislature is considering reimbursing the towns for expenses incurred as a result of the special primary and general election of the Albany County Legislators.

5. Twenty plus letters in support of the passage of the "Hamlet Plan".

OLD BUSINESS

RESOLUTION #3 SEQR REVIEW

Supervisor Crosier led a discussion on the adoption of the issuance of a SEQRA Negative Declaration for the proposed zoning ordinance. Councilman Hamilton stated that he believed a full environmental impact statement should be undertaken.. After the discussion that continued, during which both Councilmembers Huth & Golden stated that the opinions of the hired professionals should be carefully considered, Councilman Hamilton made the motion that a full environmental impact statement be completed, seconded by Councilwoman Crounse. The motion was defeated by the following roll call vote:

PROPOSED ZONING AMENDMENTS

Regarding the previously presented petition, Attorney Conboy concurred that state law does require vote by 75% of the board in order to pass the rezoing ordinance if indeed the petition is signed by owners of 20% of the land designated in the TM1 zone. He further stated that nothing precludes the board from voting at this time and whether or not the amendments are adopted, depends on the determination to made subsequent to the vote.

Councilman Hamilton suggested that the provision for gas stations be removed from the proposed ordinance. Whereupon, Attorney Conboy stated that if any substantive modification is made to the proposed amendments, another public hearing would be required.

RESOLUTION FOR ADOPTING ZONING CHANGES

Whereas, the Town of Berne Town Board has undertaken a planning process to update their zoning ordinance that included the following:

A. Review of the Town Comprehensive Plan,

B. Held a public forum to discuss business development needs in the Hamlet of Berne, and

C. Conducted a community image survey to learn more about the expectations citizens have about new development in the hamlet; and

Whereas, the Town of Berne Town Board used this information to develop a set of illustrated design guidelines to better convey the goals and expectations for new development in the Hamlet; and

Whereas, the Town of Berne Town Board has drafted and proposed new zoning language to meet the identified needs as follows

1. The Town of Berne has had language in their zoning ordinance establishing a historic district, but this was never mapped. This proposed zoning update maps that district.

2. The Town of Berne zoning ordinance was in need of some organizational and procedural updates. Some procedural issues that have been updated include time frames, voting requirements for Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals, and other changes in language needed to reflect the past few years of state Town Law have been proposed. Further, the current zoning ordinance was hard to find various sections and was in need of further organization. This proposed zoning incorporates those changes.

3. The Town of Berne desired to further its goals as outlined in their comprehensive plan in relationship to rural and small town character, small business development, and historic preservation. As a result of the above planning process, the following concepts have been proposed for the zoning:

a. Treat the hamlet as a distinct area in the Town of Berne. That is accomplished through creation of two new districts: Traditional Neighborhood/Mixed Use 1 and 2 districts that basically follow the traditional boundaries of the more built-up locations of the hamlet.

b. Establish a set of design standards to ensure that new development or conversion of existing buildings is done in a manner that enhances the traditional character of the hamlet.

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c. Develop a use schedule for the TN/MU districts that allow for limited small business development in the hamlet and that encourages adaptive reuse of existing buildings.

d. Develop new density and dimensional standards that will result in new development that is more consistent with the traditional patterns in the hamlet.

f. Develop overall density provisions to allow for more appropriate levels of business development in the hamlet; and

Whereas, the Town of Berne Town Board held multiple public hearings and public meetings throughout the process; and

Whereas, the Town of Berne, Town Board completed Parts I and II of the Full Environmental Assessment Form as per 6 NYCRR Part 617, determined that there would be no significant negative environmental impacts as a result of adopting the proposed zoning ordinance changes, and formally issued a Negative Declaration.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that The Town of Berne Town Board adopt the zoning map indicating the boundaries of a local historic district in the Hamlet of Berne; and

Be it further Resolved that the Town of Berne Town Board adopt the zoning language that incorporates needed organizational and procedural changes; and

Be it Further Resolved that the Town of Berne Town board adopt the zoning language and map that establishes the boundaries, use schedule, density and regulations for the Traditional Neighborhood/Mixed Use 1 and Traditional Neighborhood/Mixed Use 2 in the hamlet of Berne.
