Public Contributions on Agenda Items (5 minutes) None		
Agenda Items – Reports:		
1	Andrew Bayne Memorial Library; Ellen Goodman, Director Ms. Goodman reported that she is hoping to open the library for limited use 01.11.2021, but is not publicizing it at this time in case those plans cannot be implemented.	
2	Bellevue Parks; Bryan Churilla, HRG Engineers - Mr. Churilla reported on the status of the pool rehabilitation. He noted that the DPW Superintendent had received a quote from RenoSys for about \$100,000. The Borough Solicitor advised that because it’s a public project, the it must be publicly bid. This adds time and costs to the process, because of engineering, the requirement to pay prevailing wage, etc. Mr. Churilla researched COSTARS vendors; using a contractor from state purchasing cooperative means the Borough does not have to solicit multiple bids. The only COSTARS vendor doing this type of work is Main Line Commercial Pools, who gave a verbal quote of \$300,000 - \$400,000. Main Line agreed to work with RenoSys as a subcontractor on the project, which brought the cost down to about \$200,000. Main Line does provide a better warranty and will provide on-site supervision. RenoSys will complete the design build, and will not require aquatic engineer drawing. Mr. Churilla believes that this is the best option, and Mr. Kelly agreed – he found a quote the Borough received several years ago, which totaled \$300,000. - The waterline replacement project in Memorial Park is scheduled to begin Thursday 01.07.21, and should take about a week to complete.	
Unfinished Business: There were not items of unfinished business.		
New Business: There were no items of new business.		
Public Contributions on Non-Agenda Items (2 minutes) Wendy Blazier, 532 Highland Place: Stated that the parking lot at the Dog Park is a hazard when there is snow or ice, and asked DPW to clear and address the drainage issue.		

- Jillian Edmondson, 173 N. Fremont Avenue: Asked if the pool could be opened without addressing the surface issues; Mr. Kelly responded that it could not as there are a number of issues, including a 3-inch crack in the deep end which is leaking.
- Tom Hrynda, 523 Roosevelt Avenue: Suggested that the Borough tap into the sewer line at the base of the hill beside the Dek Hockey rink to eliminate the pooling water that is causing the drainage issue.
- Joe Scioscia, 256 Lincoln Avenue: Stated that the concrete surface of the pool must be repaired as there are jagged edges that could cause injury, and noted that he is a professional pool installer.
