Public Contributions on Agenda Items (5 minute) There was no public contribution on agenda items.		
Agenda Items – Reports:		
1	Engineer; Bryan Churilla, HRG Engineers - Mr. Churilla reported that the waterline replacement in Memorial Park is tentatively starting 01.07.2021. - He also noted that the manhole project is underway, and includes the replacement of 12 manholes. Upon a request from Ms. Cerminara, Mr. Churilla will provide a list of manhole locations and a timeline for completion.. - The Dawson Avenue sewer lining project by Jet Jack is progressing. - In terms of the pool renovation project, Mr. Churilla will have a scheduling deadline for the Pre-Council meeting.	
2	Public Works; Jim Kelly, Superintendent - Mr. Kelly reported that Public Works spent about 200 hours over the Christmas holidays clearing Borough streets of snow and ice. - Columbia Gas has expressed a willingness to overly Kendall Avenue with asphalt upon completion of the gas line replacement work there. - Mr. Kelly would like to engage an arborist to evaluate the trees in Bayne Park; he believes that they are showing their age, and one has a hole in the center. He does not have any quotes for this work yet. - He provided an update on the hiring of a laborer: Mr. Kelly and Ms. Bahn interviewed 5 candidates on 12.21.2020 and agreed that one candidate stood out. His references are being checked, and Mr. Kelly would like to move forward with his hire. - Mr. Kelly reported that carbon monoxide detectors have been installed in the DPW garage. - Mr. DiTullio asked if the pool renovation project was put out to bid, would the cost to engage RenoSys increase; Mr. Kelly and Mr. Churilla both responded that it would, as there would be increased costs for engineering the design, and prevailing wages would need to be paid, in addition to the cost of the bid bond.	
Unfinished Business: Ms. Edmondson requested a refresher on the Streetscape Project, and was told that the CEC engineer on the project, Brad Hazelwood, would like to continue work in the spring, but the sinkhole needs to be addressed first.		

New Business:

- There were no items of new business.

Public Contributions on Non-Agenda Items (2 minutes):

- Joe Scioscia, 260 Lincoln Avenue: expressed his opinion that pouring concrete in the sinkhole in the Lincoln Avenue bumpout is just putting a bandaid on the issue. He also provided his opinion on the pool project.
