Public Contributions on Agenda Items (5 minute) There was no public contribution.		
Agenda Items – Reports:		
1	Engineer; Bryan Churilla, HRG Engineers - Mr. Churilla reported that HRG has submitted an Alcosan GROW grant Letter of Intent. - He has a meeting with the contractor engaged for 2020 paving on April 13; he will get a schedule then and get an opinion on the stamped crosswalks. - HRG submitted a proposal to the Borough for 2021 paving; Mr. Churilla is working with the DPW Superintendent to develop a list of streets to be paved. - He will have an engineering proposal for the work to be done at West Bellevue Station for the Pre-Council meeting, added that culvert work will be done first.	
2	Public Works; Jim Kelly, Superintendent Mr. Kelly noted that items from his report will be covered under “New” and “Unfinished” business.	
Unfinished Business:		
1	Police Department Floor Mr. Kelly has obtained bids for flooring in the Police Department; the lowest is \$1,328.58.	
2	Lincoln Avenue Sinkhole Brad Hazelwood from CEC submitted a report to the Borough regarding the sinkhole; he denies that there is an issue with the design of the bumpout. DPW may be able to complete the remedy suggested by CEC, but would need to close Lincoln Avenue. This will go to Pre-Council for a decision.	
3	Dek Hockey Use & Management Mr. Kelly has spoken with Team Pittsburgh, who operates the Dek Hockey rink in Brighton for the City of Pittsburgh; he is trying to get a copy of Team Pittsburgh’s agreement with the City so that Bellevue could execute a similar agreement. Team Pittsburgh would probably not put teams on it this year.	
4	35th Street Potential Name Change Mr. Kelly noted that 35th Street, the address for DPW is the only numbered street in Bellevue. DPW’s address – 35 35th Street – poses confusion for people making deliveries. He would	

	like to see the street name changed; there are no other properties with an address on the street.
New Business:	
1	Retaining Wall on North Jackson There is some uncertainty over whose is responsible for installing and maintaining the wall, which is collapsing at 210 North Jackson
2	Memorial Park Waterline – Pit Hatch The West View Water Authority is requiring the Borough to replace the pit hatch for the new waterline. Mr. Kelly has obtained a low quote of \$1,120 for the hatch itself, which DPW can install.
3	Bellevue Dog Woods Swim Day Mr. Kelly reported that Main Line would not honor the repair warranty for the pool liner if a dog tore a hole in it, and any such damage could violate the 10-year warranty on the liner. A discussion on fund raising alternatives will be on the Pre-Council agenda.
4	QVCOG Mobile Glass Recycling The Borough has the opportunity to participate with other QVCOG communities with PRC's mobile glass recycling program; this will be on the Pre-Council agenda.
5	QVCOG Joint Solid Waste RFP Council needs to decide whether or not to participate in the RFP process for a joint solid waste agreement; this will be on the Pre-Council agenda.
6	Police Department Cell Toilet The toilet in one of the holding cells is non-functioning; Mr. Kelly obtained a low quote of \$3,780.87; this will be on the Pre-Council agenda.
7	Bellevue Sign – Possible LED Conversion The ballast for several of the bulbs does not work, and replacements are nearly impossible to find because of their age. Mr. Kelly will research the cost of converting the bulbs to LED.
Public Contributions on Non-Agenda Items (2 minutes): - Sue Benaquista, 166 Davis Avenue: Due to the Columbia Gas work, there is no parking in her area. - Joe Scioscia, 256 Lincoln Avenue: Was happy to see that DPW installed signs at the sinkhole. - Dave Gillingham, 154 Riverview Avenue: Stated that Columbia Gas had an agreement with Bellevue in 2010, 2011, and 2012 to patch a 10' by 10' area after repairs
