

- Mr. Pritchard stated that he had 3 things: 1. Stop signs at several intersections create confusion, and suggested adding tags that indicate whether the intersection is a 2-way or 4-way stop. Mr. Kelly responded that the signs can be made in house but that he would need to consult with Chief Sentner; 2. Overgrown brush in bump outs on Lincoln Avenue, which Mr. Kelly noted is on

his list, but that DPW was told several years ago not to cut down the ornamental grasses; and 3. Noted that the sound panels have helped immensely.

- Mr. DiTullio asked about the status of bids for Orchard Avenue and Mr. Kelly responded that no companies want to bid on this work.

Ethics Committee (Ad Hoc):

a. Code of Conduct: Next Steps

Ms. Sloane reported that she has not received any specific feedback from members of Council, only members of the public at meetings. The Solicitor noted that he received comments from one resident. Ms. Sloane stated that the next step is for the Code to go back to Committee for final discussion, and then a vote by Council at the November meeting. Mr. DiTullio suggested that Council wait and vote on it when he is no longer on Council and that members of Council have acted unethically.

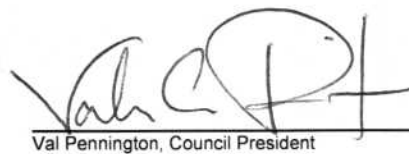
Adjournment
