Unfinished Business:		
1.	Fire Department Mediation Nothing to report.	
2.	Establishment of Police Civil Service Hiring List Chief Sentner stated that he will make this hire part of his 2022 budget request.	
3.	3rd Party Building Inspectors Mr. Wissner reported that he is still working on this, and expects to have recommendations in January.	
4.	Street Sweeping Ordinance This will be tabled for January, 2022.	

New Business:	
1.	Traffic Control at Bellevue Elementary ▪ Multiple residents have reported concerns with student safety at drop off and pick up. ▪ Chief Sentner is recommending portable “No Parking” signs at a cost of about \$100 each to create a roadblock; the cost would be shared with the School District. He noted that the only other alternative is to close Lincoln or stagger dismissal times. ▪ Ms. Edmondson stated that people are stopping in the middle of the street to drop off or pick up their children.
Public Contributions on Non-Agenda Items (2 minutes): ▪ Tony Travato, 54 S. Howard Avenue: Stated that he lives on S. Howard, and observes dangerous situations related to students going to and from Bellevue Elementary; suggested that there needs to be a joint solution with the Borough and School District.
