Public Contributions on Agenda Items (5 minutes) There was no public contribution at this time.		
Agenda Items – Reports:		
1	Police Department The Chief provided a written report with both individual and aggregate data for all calls from January 1, 2022 through February 24, 2022	
2	Bellevue Fire Department and Columbia Hose Hook & Ladder - Lt. Davin had nothing to report. - Chief Dailey reported that the Department has received 146 calls year to date.	
3	Code Enforcement Department Mr. Jacobs had nothing to add to the report prepared by the Code Enforcement Officer.	
4	NorthWest Emergency Management Services No report was received as of the date of the meeting.	
Unfinished Business:		
1.	3rd Party Building Inspectors This is on hold for now.	
2.	Short Term Rentals This is also on hold for now.	
3.	Bellevue Elementary School Traffic Safety Chief Sentner reported that the Police Department will have the portable bollards in place as of Monday, March 7, 2022. Ms. Sloane expressed concerns about people parking beyond the school.	
4.	N. Balph Avenue Bollards & Chains The DPW Superintendent is working on getting a quote for Lee Corsello, who owns Classic Chevrolet and is interested in installing the same bollards & chains on his side of N. Balph, at his own expense.	

5.	Forest and N. Balph Intersection ▪ Council voted “no” on the 4-way stop sign at this intersection, but the intersection could be made more visible with painted curbs extending further from the intersection to improve sight lines and more visible intersection markings (“blocks”, not just lines).
6.	Traffic Signal Generators ▪ The DPW Superintendent has received a quote for outfitting the 2 signals on SR 65 of about \$3,000. This will be on the March Pre-Council meeting agenda for discussion.
New Business:	
1.	Lincoln Avenue Brewery Street Closure for 4 Events ▪ Business owner Grant Saylor has requested the closure of Hawley Avenue between Lincoln Avenue and Citizen Way on June 18th, July 23rd (3rd anniversary celebration), August 27th, and October 8th (Octoberfest). Last year, he held 3 events. Portajohns were rented, and he reported that there were no issues from any of last year’s events. All attendees were carded, and those aged 21 and over were provided with wristbands. ▪ Neither the Police or Fire Department objected to the street closures for these events. ▪ This will be added to the March Pre-Council meeting for discussion.
2.	National Night Out ▪ Chief Sentner reported that this event will again be held the first Tuesday in August, which will be August 2nd, 2022. ▪ August Committee meetings will be held August 3rd, 2022 and have already been advertised for that date.
Public Contributions on Non-Agenda Items (2 minutes): ▪ Grant Saylor, Lincoln Avenue Brewery: Reported that he is interested in purchasing the building which previously housed the Bellevue Post Office. He would like to put an offer in by the end of March. Mr. Hrynda suggested that he attend the March JPC meeting. ▪ Jenn Slavicek, 67 S. Bryant Avenue: Reported that vehicles are blocking N. Balph Saturday nights from 9-10 pm.
