Public Contributions on Agenda Items (5 minutes) There was no public contribution at this time.		
Agenda Items – Reports:		
1	Andrew Bayne Memorial Library; Ellen Goodman, Director Ms. Goodman reported that the Library will have expanded hours in April, returning to 45 hours/week, which is what is required under state mandate.	
2	Bellevue Parks Update; Bryan Churilla, HRG Engineer & Jim Kelly, DPW Superintendent Mr. Churilla stated that he will have information to report under “Unfinished Business”.	
Unfinished Business:		
1	Exterior Library Repairs Ms. Goodman and Mr. Churilla spoke about a LSA (Local Share Account) the Borough could apply for which would help to fund the costs of the repairs. This is a new program, and applications are due March 15, 2022. Mr. Churilla has developed a scope for the needed repairs which could be used to create the resolution required with the application. Adoption of the resolution in support of the LSA grant application will be on the agenda for the March Pre-Council meeting.	
2	Bayne Avenue Retaining Wall Mr. Churilla reported that the design will permit 4 parking spaces, and they will be a bit larger than the typical parking space because of the difficulty backing out. In order to keep costs lower, DPW will remove the old wall and excavate for the new parking spaces. The bid will go to the QVCOG March 2, 2022 for advertisement. A question was raised regarding the requirement that 1 space be ADA compliant, and Mr. Churilla will research.	
New Business:		
1	Pool Vacuum The DPW Superintendent obtained quotes for a new pool vacuum, which will be a robotic model. The lowest quote was about \$6,500, and this equipment was included in the 2020 budget. This will be on the March Pre-Council meeting agenda for consideration.	

2	Music in the Park - Ms. Goodman noted that a new banner will be needed, as the old one is not in great shape. She has not yet advertised for bands. In the past, the concerts were advertised via social media, The Citizen, and the banner, but the concerts have not been well attended. At one time, the concerts expended over an 8-week period, from mid-June to mid-August. - This item will be kept in Committee for consideration of how many concerts should be held, when should they occur and how much bands should be paid.
Public Contributions on Non-Agenda Items (2 minutes) John Skovran, 511 Teece Avenue: State that BAGAA will begin practicing March 2, 2022 from 6:00 to 7:30, and opening day is in April. He would like to recognize Bob Loch for his efforts in organizing BAGAA.
