Public Works Committee:

- a. Motion to Accept the 2023 Borough Paving Bid in the Amount of \$564,467.05 from El Grande Industries, Contingent Upon the Council Election of Option ____ Via a Change Order to the Agreement. (01.438.100)

Discussion: Mr. Kelly provided information for Council to use in making a decision between 3 options. He did not recommend Option 1, the most expensive option. He explained that the difference between Options 2 and 3 is whether to remove the bricks on Shiloh Avenue or not. Mr. Hrynda stated that he is favor of tearing out the bricks and paving the street because of the higher maintenance costs associated with brick streets, especially streets that transition from asphalt to brick.

Motion to Amend the Agenda to Provide for Option 2.

All voted in favor of the motion. Motion carried, 5-0.
