# **THE YEAR 2005**

A LOCAL LAW, TO AMEND SECTION 123, ZONING THROUGH THE ENACTMENT OF A LOCAL LAW AMENDING PERMITTED USES AND STRUCTURES IN A C-1 LOCAL RETAIL BUSNIESS DISTRICT TO INCLUDE SMALL ANIMAL HOSPITALS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF BOSTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

## LEGISLATIVE INTENT

This Local Law updates the current zoning specification as it pertains to permitted uses and structures in a C-1 Local Retail Business District.

#### Section 2.

#### THE FOLLOWING IS HEREBY ADOPTED:

That Zoning, codified at Chapter 123 of the Boston Town Code is amended as follows:

In Section 123-48 (A) (4), Permitted uses and structures, the words "small animal hospitals" be deleted.

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In Section 123-71((2), C-1 Local Retail Business District Permitted uses and structures Create a new section as follows:

(g) Small animal hospitals provided however, that buildings, pens or runways for the confinement of animals shall be at least 100 feet from the property line of any C District and no manure or other odor or dust producing substances shall be stored within 100 feet of any lot line.

## SECTION 3.

## **MISCELLANEOUS**

- A. This Local Law shall be deemed to supersede and repeal any other Local Laws to the extent therein inconsistent herewith.
- B. If any part of this Local Law shall be judicially declared invalid, void, unconstitutional or unenforceable, all unaffected provisions hereof shall survive such declaration and this Local Law shall remain in full force and effect as if the invalidated portion had not been enacted
- C. Nothing herein shall be deemed to be a waiver or restriction upon any rights and powers available to the Town of Boston to further regulate the subject matter of this Local Law.

## SECTION 4.

#### **EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Local Law shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York, as required by the Municipal Home Rule Law.
