

BOUND BROOK BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING

SEPTEMBER 13, 1990

A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOUND BROOK BOARD OF HEALTH WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT, MARC KISSEL AT THE BOUND BROOK MUNICIPAL BUILDING ON THE ABOVE DATE AT 7:15 P.M.

NOT PRESENT WERE: FRANK GILLY, PAULA ANDRADE, NATALIE BUZBY, CAROL KOUPIARIS AND, BERTRAND LEMASSON, HIGH SCHOOL REPRESENTATIVE.

THE MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 14, 1990 MEETING WERE APPROVED BY A MOTION TO ACCEPT BY JAMES GILRAIN, SECONDED BY IRENE MACKINSON.

VOUCHERS:

VOUCHERS WERE PRESENTED FOR THE ATTORNEY, SECRETARY, VIKING PEST CONTROL, AND THE REGIONAL HEALTH COMMISSION. A MOTION TO ACCEPT WAS MADE BY IRENE MACKINSON, SECONDED BY DR. DAVIS. PASSED.

A REQUEST WAS MADE BY PHYLLIS POURNARAS FOR A LIST OF THE MEMBERS WHO HAVE MISSED THREE OR MORE MEETINGS SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR 1990.

COMMISSION REPORT:

- 1). CODDRINGTON POOL - PH LEVEL WAS 2, TOO MUCH ACID. THE KIDS WERE GETTING SICK.
- 2). ROSINA'S RESTAURANT - A DISCUSSION WAS HELD OVER THEIR UNCLEAN PANS OF GREASE.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- 1). WELL ORDINANCE - THE ORDINANCE WAS PUBLISHED, NEXT STEP IS TO VOTE ON IT TO FINALIZE.

A MOTION TO ACCEPT WAS MADE BY IRENE MACKINSON, SECONDED BY SUSAN WOODRING. A VOTE WAS TAKEN. 5-0 PASSED.

- 2). CAT LICENSING - FEW TOWNS HAVE UNSUCCESSFULLY TRIED TO START THE LICENSING FOR CATS. DR. COHEN WILL SUBMIT SAMPLES FROM OTHER TOWNS ON THIS LAW - WILL DISCUSS NEXT MONTH. IT WAS DECIDED THAT THERE SHOULD BE INVOLVEMENT WITH THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL. THE BOARD


WILL PUT THIS ADVISEMENT TO THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL. DR. COHEN WILL ISSUE A MEMO TO THIS EFFECT. THERE WILL BE A CONTINUED PUBLIC INFORMATION ISSUED TO THE SCHOOLS. DR. COHEN IS TO SEND COPIES OF THE ORDINANCE TO GEORGE PSAK TO READ OVER.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1). MEXICAN RESTAURANT: THE PROBLEM WITH FOOD BEING STORED IN THEIR ALLEY WAY WAS DISCUSSED.
- 2). NEW STANDARDS ON GAS STATIONS WAS DISCUSSED. TO BE EFFECTIVE ON 9-3-91.
- 3). CHIPS AMOCO - DISCUSSED.
- 4). BOROUGH ORDINANCE CONCERNING UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS WAS DISCUSSED. GEORGE PSAK WILL PUT TOGETHER NEW ORDINANCE.
- 5). INSURANCE - GEORGE PSAK STILL FEELS THAT THIS IS NOT WELL SPENT MONEY (\$10,000), BUT WILL CONTINUE TO CHECK INTO IT.
- 6). WATCHUNG TOWNSHIP DID NOT SIGN THE CONTRACT WITH THE COMMISSION.
- 7). NURSES REPORT DISCUSSED - HEAD LICE IN SMALLEY SCHOOL.
- 8). BOARD OF HEALTH EXPENDITURES - DR. COHEN FEELS THAT THE BOARD IS SHORT FUNDED. DR. COHEN AND PRESIDENT, MARC KISSEL ARE TO GET TOGETHER WITH RANDY BARR TO DISCUSS THIS FURTHER.
- 9). EASTGATE PARK LETTERS - STRAIGHTEN UP THE MESS ON MONITORING THE WELLS.
- 10). POOL PROBLEM DISCUSSES THOROUGHLY.
- 11). VENDING MACHINES - CHECK TO FIND WHO IS UNLICENSED. (THERE ARE 12 or 14 WITHOUT LICENSES).
- 12). FARM LANE - CHILD BITTEN BY MOLE, NEGATIVE RABIES.
- 13). LVNN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY - 100 WEST MAIN STREET. A BUILDING IS PROPOSED TO BE PUT ON THIS LOCATION. DR. COHEN PASSED OUT THE ENGINEERS REPORT.
- 14). BAN ON STYRAFOAM - DISCUSSED.
- 15). CAP LAW - DISCUSSED.
