

**BOROUGH OF BOUND BROOK-**

**AGENDA/WORKSHOP MEETING MINUTES –JULY 8, 2008**

Mayor Pilato called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with a reading of the Open Public Meetings Law Statement, Opening Prayer read by the Borough Clerk and Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Pilato recognized Ryan Clancey, former honorary mayor on July 3<sup>rd</sup> to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Engineers Report –June 1-June 30, 2008**

**Mr. Keady reported -**

- Update on Army Corps of Engineers Flood Control Project –August 1<sup>st</sup>- temporary bridge design plans complete; New Jersey Transit closure gate plans in September; south main gate also; levee behind west main street area awarded around August 15th
- Capital Improvement Program –working with C. Lefkowitz on road classification which has been distributed for review and comment
- Sanitary Sewer- problems with inflow and infiltration; working with C. Lefkowitz on this; submitted a draft proposal for review to delineate items I&I Study
- Highland Place Phase One- Route 28 to West Maple- removing curb
- Improvements to West Main Street- will be discussed in executive session
- Route 28-DOT expects completion next few weeks with final paving; operation of new traffic signals

C. Vasquez asked the engineer about an infiltration study done by Middlesex Sewerage Authority- 5-6 years ago. He would like the engineer to investigate that study. Mayor stated that study 5-6 years ago re-read the meters. This infiltration study will break up the borough in sections and figure out where our INI is. He stated this study needs to be done as sewer is one of the largest growing costs. The borough engineer will give Middlesex County Sewerage Authority a call on the prior report.

Page Two-July 8, 2008

C. Lefkowitz reported hopefully we will have our aid numbers in because we need to finalize capital commitments for this year. He asked council to call or e-mail the engineer with any questions on the capital plan for roads. Questions from the public to the engineer were addressed.

**Greetings of the Public and Invitation for Discussion**

Jim Crane- Project Manager for Ridewise; an affiliate of Somerset County Business Partnership- He stated the County is offering three months of free parking. The County agrees with carpooling to decrease traffic congestion. Any questions on this please call. He handed out pamphlets on Ride wise for the public to be placed in borough hall.

Holub- 518 West Second Street-

She was sorry to hear Mr. Hasting is leaving. He has done a wonderful job. He cares about the community and the people and has always given thorough committee reports.

Cerminara-759 Watchung Road-

She asked is she could break the Center Island to seed and plant flowers. Mayor Pilato asked that she contact C. Lefkowitz to proceed on this request. She also said there was no stop sign for Watchung Lane/Farm Lane. Mayor stated Wahnetah and Church could also be looked at for a stop sign. She asked if the paving of Watchung Road will be revisited.

John Ruckey- Represents Statewide Organization-New Jersey Citizens for Immigration Control-

He understood a resolution was on the agenda for Federal Immigration Law. He asked if action will be taken on this resolution.

Mayor Pilato stated that the resolution is on the agenda under "Old Business". It will be council's decision whether or not this resolution will be taken up at the business meeting. There will be a vigorous discussion on this.

Mayor Pilato stated he has strong opinions on this resolution. This borough is complying rather aggressively with the Consent Decree. Do not want to be sued by the Department of Justice. We have spent a lot of time on legal costs on getting to a Consent Decree. He would rather move forward as opposed to moving in an opposite direction. We have been advised by legal there would be some negative repercussions with a potential of the DOJ coming back and private organizations wishing to sue the borough.

We do not have the legal resources to fight those legal battles.

If we did not have code enforcement currently, I would agree that this resolution might make sense. In the past three years our code enforcement has tripled. He does not agree that this resolution is at the right place at the right time.

Page Three-July 8, 2008

C. Lefkowitz stated that under "Old Business" on the agenda he will offer a motion on this resolution and asking for a second.

Mr. Ruckey stated hundreds of this resolution has been adopted across the country.

Mayor stated that this resolution can be discussed this evening but not introduced this evening. It can be brought up for the business meeting. This is a discussion whether or not this resolution will be on the agenda for the business meeting. C. Lefkowitz disagreed stating that it was put on the agenda at the last meeting. Mayor stated at last meeting it was discussed and that we were only taking action on the ordinances on the agenda because of a timing issue and nothing else.

Mr. Ruckey further stated that a study was released out of Washington, D.C. the cost of illegal immigration to New Jerseyites. 2.1 billion of dollars a year which includes education, health care, incarceration. The council's vote should be unanimous. He stated the local governing bodies are struggling to balance services. This is affecting towns at all levels across the country. This resolution should be adopted. He admired C. Lefkowitz for bringing this up.

120 Farm Lane-

He stated he was skeptical about the numbers quoted in studies. Two things- it is easy to forget when we talk about a group and the second is the Constitution of our country. Any person is entitled to rights under the law; not confuse the issue of citizenship. The third is judge people on the basis of what they do in Bound Brook, their behavior.

David Jefferson Harris, Jr. -

President State -wide Minorities Conference in New Jersey-

He thanked members of the governing body. You are more open than my own governing body in New Brunswick. You face the public. He commended the Mayor for the conduct of the meeting allowing all points of view to be taken.

Mr. Harris stated he comes with a heavy heart because you hear from every corner of the nation "what is it about illegal that these people do not understand"-We hear those hard workers, but the people that speak those words do not even know their own history. Remember where we came from, who we are, what we sacrificed. We all came here on different ships but we are in the same boat now.

Carmen Morales- Colonia, N.J.

She commended C. Lefkowitz for his proposal to crackdown on illegal residents. She expressed her concerns of the conditions they live in. Something is to be done about this. We need politicians to acknowledge the fact that this is a huge problem with immigration. Our laws should be enforced for the safety of the citizens not only in bound brook but through out the state. Please stand firm on this proposal.

18 Raritan Avenue; Highland Park

She works for New Brunswick and stated their biggest challenge is overcrowding. We have adopted laws to prevent this. We need to look at the big picture. You do need to look at these issues. It is not just a small issue, it is a challenge. You are creating a law that currently does not exist. Why does it need to exist?

Mayor Pilato stated that what C. Lefkowitz is proposing is a policy for the Borough. If it passes than the council may determine what we need to change in our ordinances to reflect those policy changes.

Father Charlie- St. Joseph's-

He opposed the resolution. Policy now in this country you are to notify immigration if found to be undocumented indictable offenses. We already have a directive in place for The State of New Jersey. Legally those living in our country without documentation according to our laws are not a criminal offense; it is a civil matter for U.S. Immigration. He expressed his concerns that an average landlord-employer is not going to be able to recognize someone that is not here with proper documentation. Also looking at someone's color of skin to make a determination; a lot of prejudicial actions. We do not need this ordinance; just follow with the ordinances already on the books.

North Plainfield, New Jersey

What is the point in introducing this resolution, it has been repealed in other towns.

Grace Duebecke-421 Somerset Street –

She stated she is a homeowner and a landlord. She asked who can give me documentation to determine whether they are legal or not? This will fall on the landlord. Mayor Pilato said that is a good question. Landlords have significant concerns. He discussed policing powers and how they are meted out local, county and state government.

Tomaselli-616 Thomas Place

He said employers have their employees fill out an I-9 form. He suggested maybe the town can look into rules for landlords/tenants. This is a great town.

Linda Brnicevic- 20 Talmage Avenue-

She asked if there were any numbers on illegal immigrants. She expressed her concerns with racial profiling, to embrace diversity and not to wait until you come desperate with housing issues. C. Lefkowitz responded to a study from Somerset County and a Multi-Faith Group.

Carmen –Piscataway, N.J.

She has been working in Bound Brook for the past ten years. The Latinos are here working very hard in Bound Brook. They are doing good work.. She stated that landlords do not live in Bound Brook.

C. Lefkowitz responded stating Bound Brook embraces the legal immigrants, the Latino Community. He stated a lot has been said about the economic contribution. It is very real but not an excuse to be illegal. There is a lot of dissenting opinion that he hears; we seem to merge legal with illegal immigrants. He believes illegal immigrants are causing problems for the legal immigrants.

Officer Fairlie-Bound Brook Delegate Police Department-Local 380

Mr. Fairlie asked for clarification on Ordinance No. 08-11. This ordinance dictates our rate of pay on overtime of outside employment. C. Lefkowitz stated that this ordinance does not set your rate of pay; it is your regular overtime rate. Those are rates we charge the contractor. Your rates do not change.

Mr. Fairlie expressed his concerns- for example working traffic control, you are going to charge outside vendor \$70.00 / hour- where do you make up the shortfall?

Overtime is a voluntary sign up.

Evan Carzis- New York

He feels there is no overcrowding in Bound Brook. The enforcement in past years has improved. His family business has been in town since 1973. He has gone through five floods. He felt this whole subject was very distasteful.

Cimino- Dalay Place

He had a question on Ordinance No. 08-11- what is the administrative fee?

Mayor Pilato stated this ordinance would determine whether we want to go to a flat number or percentage of the rate.

Father Charlie-

He asked if any councilmember's have any intention of seconding the motion of C. Lefkowitz's resolution. If not, this becomes a mood point. That answer would solve this mess.

C. Lefkowitz stated there will be a minor change according to the attorney- In the first paragraph of the ordinance it states the borough shall collect administrative fee of 20% then going to number 3 we say the administrative fee is \$10.00 . To resolve this we strike the first sentence of 9-5.4 number 3 in completion; we resolve the inconsistency.

C. Lefkowitz offered a motion to amend the ordinance to strike that sentence; second by C. Hasting

C. Lefkowitz stated the 20% is on the total bill; this is not part of the PBA agreement;

Public Comments:

Deputy Chief White- He stated that he was not aware this ordinance was being introduced. Should go through police committee. He was never consulted on this. This ordinance actually changes how outside employment will be conducted and also puts a burden on the administrator approval. What criteria will be used? He requested a further study on the ordinance.

C. Lefkowitz stated maybe we should suspend outside employment until this is resolved.

C. Thompson stated this was supposed to be a simple ordinance. We are dictating how and when the officer does it. The purpose of this ordinance was simply to raise the cost and the fees in order to ensure the borough is getting its fair share of the use of its vehicle and equipment.

Other Public Comments:

Short- 169 Cherry Avenue- she recalls at budget meeting there was no discussion about policeman working overtime; just discussion on gasoline.

Paterson-526 Vosseller-should not suspend outside contracts; public safety should be considered.

421 Somerset Street- questioned overtime; mayor stated this is overtime on construction; traffic detail.

Cimino-520 Dalay- rethink this ordinance; suggest a committee meeting to resolve and move on.

**OLD BUSINESS**

**Council President Lefkowitz-**

He stated he will offer a motion on the following resolution and will be asking for a second-

Resolution- that creates a borough policy that would seek to implement local illegal alien enforcement and anti-harboring initiatives- should this resolution pass then the council would take steps in the form of ordinances or other legislative action to implement the policies of resolution-

He appreciated everyone's comments this evening. He has heard two distinct sides on this measure. It is his belief that it is unreasonable that the courts are leaving it up to communities to deal with this problem. He believes that there is a real cost involved to Bound Brook by allowing illegal immigration to continue. The 2005 study by the Somerset County Human Services says after Hurricane Floyd there were as least 200 undocumented aliens in Bound Brook. The report also included these families were living from 8 to 15 in one family unit.

The Reverend Clark-Disaster Response Coordinator for New Jersey Conference of United Methodist Church reported half of affected families were undocumented (700). Numbers are rising. The failure to enforce is creating a sanctuary in Bound Brook. Regarding the DOJ Consent Decree he understood that the borough never admitted any guilt as part of the decree. Since entered into and funds set aside there have been no claims made against the borough.

The decree does not prohibit local enforcement. Encourages safe housing, clearly makes provisions in it for life hazard issues such as overcrowding.

When he took the oath as council he swore to uphold the laws of the United States of America. He does not think it is his position and no one else's right to decide which laws are to be upheld. As a citizen, do not feel you have the right to decide which laws you follow and not to follow. As an elected official I do not believe I have the right to avoid this issue.

C. Lefkowitz stated he has received comments from C. Vasquez and C. Pranzatelli and he hopes to hear comments from the rest of council.

Mayor Pilato then asked is there were any further comments. There were none.

Council Lefkowitz then asked for a second on the resolution. He dispensed with reading of the resolution since it was read in full at the last meeting.

Hearing no second, Mayor Pilato stated the resolution is not put up for consideration.

C. Lefkowitz stated that this is not the end of this issue. He will do everything he can to get this on the ballot in November as a non binding referendum.

Council can pass a resolution or 10% of registered voters to get this question on the ballot.

Mayor Pilato stated the council made a choice; your resolution did not have a sufficient second. This body does not agree with your resolution. He stated the borough attorney, after looking at the resolution under a legal perspective advised that this is not a warranted policy decision that the borough should take.

Based on rights and based on obligations there are repercussions, specifically the Department of Justice. We must understand the ramifications moving forward and you are doing this at taxpayer's costs.

C. Hasting comments- C. Lefkowitz has legitimate concerns. A lot of our existing ordinances the enforcement would deal with a lot of these issues. He stated that during the resolution of the Department of Justice suit that lead to the consent decree we used a special counsel for this. Our borough attorney is not of this background. It concerned to him that this resolution was not discussed with an expert on this issue. He felt the resolution was somewhat meaningless; has no force or effect. He would prefer a change in ordinances or new ordinances to discuss the merits of the issues. That is why he did not second the resolution. He gave C. Lefkowitz credit for bringing this issue up and sticking to his guns.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### **Mayor Pilato-reported**

New Jersey Conference of Mayors- They are offering a service to Bound Brook. They will conduct a community marketing video of Bound Brook. We can place this on our website. We will have all editorial rights.

Mayor received communication from the Republican Committee Chair regarding the replacement of C. Hasting. He has submitted three names and this will be placed as the first item on the agenda for the business meeting.

### **OPEN TO THE PUBLIC ON AGENDIZED ITEMS ONLY**

#### **Ruckey-New Jersey Citizens-**

Mr. Ruckey read C. Lefkowitz's resolution. He said it is a good resolution. There is nothing that would be offensive to any taxpayer in the borough; legal or illegal immigrants; contains items that are protective. If passed, simply this governing body would be reinforcing the rule of law, asking for enforcement of our laws as they exist now. You took the oath of office; you have the responsibility to do something about it.

#### **C. Auletta-**

Mr. Auletta stated that Mr. Ruckey was completing inaccurate to characterize the council's decision that we disregard the laws.

#### **R. Short-169 Cherry**

She asked what happens to the money that the town puts aside for this. Mayor stated the administrator/chief financial officer would be the appropriate person to speak with on this. She suggested the town hire an additional code enforcement person to enforce our laws.

Page Thirteen-July 8, 2008

John Patterson-526 Vosseller

He stated if this is the passion of the council that goes into my town he is very proud of the council. Commend council for voting to support /not support the resolution.

He admired C. Lefkowitz for the resolution. That is your conviction.

He recognized council as a good council. If council does not see eye to eye with you on a specific resolution it may service our constituents better if we adopt an approach out of this to unite us not divide us? A referendum would divide us. For now we should accept the outcome of tonight.

David Jefferson Harris Jr.-

He stated he would rise again to thank the council for the opportunity to express his feelings regarding this issue.

He read the resolution; we need to be more careful with our language in the resolution. Appears you have a wonderful governing body; please move forward together.

Grace- 421 Somerset Street –

She asked why we have home inspections.

C. Hasting the motivation is public safety; unsafe conditions; any unsafe housing situation. She asked why she could not have the ability to push this through; to have it reworded. She needed to know who is legal or illegal.

Mayor commented stating home inspections ensure the health and safety that you rent to.

Ortega-

He expressed his comments. You have people turning to vigilantes looking for illegal immigrants. When you bring these issues to a personal level that is when we begin to understand what really happens to those who are affected by these kinds of resolutions. You made the right decision today; local governments cannot enforce immigration laws.

Patterson-

He stated to C. Lefkowitz that you do not deserve the flack you are getting because you are not the resolution you brought and he does think we owe C. Lefkowitz the respect to separate him as a person from the resolution. Just the passion has earned you a lot of credit; everyone has the right to support or protect.

### EXECUTIVE SESSION

Motion moved by C. Vasquez; second by C. Lefkowitz to adjourn to executive session at 11:20 p.m.; all in favor-eyes.
