

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-09

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRISTOL, BUCKS COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 191, "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC", SECTION 73, "SCHEDULE IX: STOP INTERSECTIONS" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRISTOL BY ESTABLISHING STOPS SIGNS AT THE INTERSECTION OF GREEN LYNNE DRIVE AND PATRICIAN STREET AND SECTION 86, "SCHEDULE XXII: SIGNS RESTRICTING THOROUGHFARE" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRISTOL BY ESTABLISHING SIGNS AT BOTH BEAVER DAM ROAD AT BOTH SCHUMACHER DRIVE INTERSECTIONS

WHEREAS, the First Class Township Code permits the Council for the Township of Bristol to establish vehicular regulations; and

WHEREAS, Council has reviewed the traffic situations at both Patrician Street and Green Lynne Drive and Beaver Dam Road and Schumacher Drive intersections and consulted with Township Consultants and Police Department that the restrictions set forth within this Ordinance are in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the Bristol Township residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BRISTOL:

Section 1. Chapter 191-73, Schedule IX of the Bristol Township Code is hereby amended to include the following streets:

<u>Street</u>	<u>Direction of Travel</u>	<u>At Intersection Of:</u>
Green Lynne Drive	South	Patrician Street
Green Lynne Drive	North	Patrician Street

Section 2. Chapter 191-86, Schedule XXII of the Bristol Township Code is hereby amended to include the following streets:

<u>Street</u>	<u>Location of Sign</u>	<u>Language</u>
Schumacher Drive	Intersection of Beaver Dam Road and Schumacher Drive	No Trucks – Weight Limit 3 ½ Tons

Section 2. The appropriate Township Officials and employees are hereby authorized and directed to erect appropriate signs at the above-mentioned location.

Section 3. Whenever the requirements of this Ordinance are in conflict with other requirements of the Ordinances of the Township of Bristol, the most restrictive, or those imposing the higher standards, shall govern.

Section 4. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If any section, clause, sentence, part or provision hereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision of the court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences, parts or provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Council of Bristol Township that this Ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, clause, sentence, part or provision had not been included herein.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately.
