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Mayor Hand called the public hearing to order at 8:15 P.M. She noted that this was a continuation of the public hearing from January 12, 2004, concerning a proposed Local Law revising Chapter 310, Section 310-42A, Satellite earth stations and communications facilities, of the Zoning Code of the Village of Bronxville. (Copy of the Local Law is annexed to the official minutes.)

Village Clerk Peter Woodcock verified that due notice of the public hearing had been given by posting and publication.

Mayor Hand stated that this law has been on the agenda for the last few months and just a couple of changes were made since the last meeting. She said we received a letter from the County Planning Board referring to the law. We filed another copy of the law with the County because there were a couple of amendments. The County Planning Board said they have reviewed this matter and continue to find that there are no County or inter-municipal planning issues of concern to the County Planning Board.

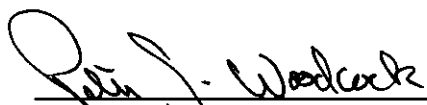
Mayor Hand asked if there were any further public comments.

Thomas Wolff, a resident, said he would like to commend the people who have been working on this law and the addition of a new paragraph that states: "Notwithstanding the foregoing, in connection with each recertification, the Planning Board shall consider changes to wireless technology since the date of issuance or last recertification, as applicable, of the Special Permit and determine whether the Special Permit should be modified or terminated as a result of such change." Mr. Wolff said he thinks that takes into account the rapidly changing technology of wireless telecommunications and it's very appropriate.

Mayor Hand said the Board has had plenty of time to review this law over the last few months after a lot of work on the part of the Planning Board. The Trustees recommended a few changes and it went back to the Planning Board to take another look at it. The Planning Board came back with the final draft.

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There being no further comments, the public hearing was adjourned at 8:18 PM.
