AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIDGETON, MISSOURI, AMENDING ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 115.280 OF THE CITY CODE AND AMENDING THE NUMBER OF PERSONAL HOURS ALLOCATED TO EMPLOYEES.

WHEREAS, the City of Bridgeton currently allocates 48 personal hours to all full-time employees on January 1 of each calendar year.

WHEREAS, effective June 17, 2021, Juneteenth Independence Day became a Federal holiday and is also a State holiday in the State of Missouri.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRIDGETON, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The current 48 personal hours will be reduced to 40 personal hours and adding June 19th (Juneteenth) as a paid holiday for all full-time employees, which mirrors the Federal and State holiday schedule for that date.
- Section 2. As in the past, personal hours for employees hired between January 2nd and May 1st of each calendar year shall be prorated and available for use after a probationary period.
- Section 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
