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**SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT & PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the current Section 179-10 of Article II of Chapter 179 of the Code of the Village of Canastota to provide for updated regulations related to existing dumpsters used for commercial or multifamily purposes.

**SECTION 2. AUTHORITY**

The adoption of this Local Law is in accordance with Section 10 of New York's Municipal Home Rule Law.

**SECTION 3. AMEND SECTION 179-10 ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 179 OF THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF CANASTOTA**

Section 179-10, titled "Existing dumpster requirements," of Article II, titled "Dumpsters," of Chapter 179, "Solid Waste," of the Code of the Village of Canastota shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

“§ 179-10 Existing dumpster requirements.

Dumpsters used by commercial and multifamily property owners shall, as of the adoption of this Article, be required to make improvements to existing dumpster locations. Those improvements shall include, but are not limited to, placing existing dumpster on a concrete slab or approved foundation. The existing dumpster shall have an enclosure around the dumpster for rodent control, such as a fence, wall or an approved enclosed structure approved by the Code Enforcement Officer. Dumpsters shall be emptied once a week, and the property owner shall not allow a dumpster to become over full at any time.”

**SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY**

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, article or part of this Local Law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operations to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, article, or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

**SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

**VILLAGE OF CANASTOTA LOCAL LAW NO. C OF 2026**

*("A Local Law to Amend Section 179-10 of Article II of Chapter 179 of the Code of the Village of Canastota")*

The following resolution was offered by Trustee Watkins, who moved its adoption, seconded by Trustee Haddad, to wit:

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law, a proposed Local Law titled Local Law No. C-2026, "A Local Law to Amend Section 179-10 of Article II of Chapter 179 of the Code of the Village of Canastota," was presented and introduced at a regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Canastota held on March 18, 2026; and

**WHEREAS**, a public hearing was held on such proposed local law on March 31, 2026, by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Canastota and proof of publication of notice of such public hearing, as required by law, having been submitted and filed, and all persons desiring to be heard in connection with said proposed local law having been heard, and said proposed local law having been in the possession of the members of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Canastota in its final form in the manner required by Section 20 of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York; and

**WHEREAS**, the enactment of proposed Local Law No. C-2026 has previously been determined to be an unlisted action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act review process and a Negative Declaration was issued by the Board of Trustees; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the public interest to enact said proposed Local Law No. C-2026.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, it is

**RESOLVED**, that the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Canastota, Madison County, New York, does hereby enact Proposed Local Law No. C-2026 as Local Law No.   2  -2026 as follows:

**A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND SECTION 179-10 OF ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 179 OF  
THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF CANASTOTA**

Be it enacted by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Canastota as follows:

**SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT & PURPOSE**
