ADOPTING A LOCAL LAW CREATING THE CAYUGA COUNTY PURCHASING DEPARTMENT

BY: Cayuga County Legislature

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 1 for the year 2023 was presented to the Cayuga County Legislature on December 13, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to law and after proper notice being duly given, the County Legislature held a public hearing on said Local Law No. 1 for 2023 on January 24, 2023 at 6:00 P.M.; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Local Law No. <u>1</u> of 2023, entitled "A LOCAL LAW CREATING THE CAYUGA COUNTY **PURCHASING DEPARTMENT**" as so designated, be and the same is hereby enacted, waiving any and all defects and informalities in the adoption thereof; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Cayuga County Legislature is directed to publish notice of the adoption of Local Law No. <u>1</u> of 2023 in the official newspapers of Cayuga County, one time per week for each of two weeks, the first publication to be within ten (10) days of its effective date.

LOCAL LAW NO. <u>1</u> FOR THE YEAR 2023

A LOCAL LAW CREATING THE CAYUGA COUNTY PURCHASING DEPARTMENT

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Cayuga, as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent:

The County of Cayuga considered the creation of a Cayuga County Purchasing Department. Cayuga County as authorized by County Law §§ 204, 400(4)(a) and the Municipal Home Rule Law § 10(1), to create and establish appointive positions, define their powers, compensation and duties, and fix their terms of office, so long as it is not inconsistent with the New York State Constitution or general law.

There shall be a Department of Purchasing overseen by a Director of Purchasing who shall be appointed by the County Legislature.

Section 2. Department of Purchasing; Director; appointment.

There shall be a Department of Purchasing overseen by a Director of Purchasing who shall be appointed by the County Legislature and who shall serve without bond. The Director of Purchasing shall: (A) In accordance with the requirements for advertising and competitive bidding, authorize all purchases and sales of materials, supplies and equipment and contracts for the rental or servicing of equipment for the County. (B) Approve and execute certain contracts as shall be prescribed by the County Resolution. (C) Establish and enforce suitable specifications and standards for all supplies, materials and equipment to be purchased for the County. (D) Develop and maintain technology and data to assist and enhance procurement and purchasing practices. (E) Facilitate shared services and shared purchase opportunities. (F) Establish training programs for department employees participating in procurement activities. (G) Implement Countywide procurement procedures in accordance with State Law. (H) Pursue creative procurement opportunities, cooperative purchasing options and strategic sourcing. (I) Perform such other and related duties as shall be required and delegated by the County Legislature.

Section 3. Director; appointment; qualifications.

(1) The Department of Purchasing shall be overseen by a Director of Purchasing. The qualifications of the Director shall be:

A) Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Bachelor's Degree and two (2) years of experience in either:

1) a governmental management or administrative capacity which must have included oversight of fiscal management and/or purchasing functions, or

2) a position responsible for large scale purchasing of a variety of commodities including experience in the preparation of specifications and the awarding of contracts;

OR

B) Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with an Associate's Degree and three years of experience in either:

1) a governmental management or administrative capacity which must have included oversight of fiscal management and/or purchasing functions, or

2) a position responsible for large scale purchasing of a variety of commodities including experience in the preparation of specifications and the awarding of contracts;

OR

C) Graduation from high school or possession of an equivalency diploma and eight (8) years of experience in either:

1) a governmental management or administrative capacity which must have included oversight of fiscal management and/or purchasing functions, or

2) a position responsible for large scale purchasing of a variety of commodities including experience in the preparation of specifications and the awarding of contracts;

OR

D) An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of A), B) and C) above.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT(S):

Certified Public Purchasing Officer (CPPO) or Certified Professional Public Buyer (CPPB) preferred.

After the effective date of this Local Law, the qualifications for the Director of Purchasing will be as set forth in the Cayuga County Civil Service Job Description.

(2) Powers and duties of Director of Purchasing.

(A) The Director of Purchasing shall:

(1) Have charge, oversight and supervision of the Department.

(2) Establish and maintain a central purchasing system

Develop and implement the County Purchasing Policy consistent with all federal, state laws, rules and regulations.

(3) Research and identify commodity, source, and pricing information for all purchases

(4) Determine applicable public advertisement and bid requirements pursuant to General Municipal Law §103 and implementing same

(5) Prescribe the form of requisitions, and of receipts for supplies delivered without requisition, that will be required for all County purchase

(6) Upon request of any city, town, village, school district or any other unit of local government, and upon such conditions as may be prescribed by the County Legislature, act as purchasing agent for the same, either for all or any part of its purchases, coordinates purchasing activities with other municipalities, or the Cayuga Community College.

(7) Shall be the custodian of all vouchers, requisitions, receipts and other papers pertaining thereto which shall be open to the public inspection.

(8) Enforce the procurement and purchasing policies and procedures to be followed by all County. entities and promulgate rules and regulations deemed necessary to carry out the County's procurement policies.

(9) All delegation of powers, duties and responsibilities to the Director of Purchasing shall be subject to Civil Service laws, rules and regulations and such other laws as may be applicable.

(10) Oversee the administration of all RFPs and RFQs issued by the County.

(11) The Compensation for the Director of Purchasing shall be set by the Cayuga County Legislature by resolution.

(12) The Director of Purchasing shall be subject to removal or sanction by the Cayuga County Legislature pursuant to New York State Civil Service Law, Section 75.

(13) Perform all other duties of a County Purchasing Agent under the Laws of the State of New York not inconsistent with the provisions of this Code.

(14) Appoint such deputies, and such assistants and employees as may be authorized by the Legislature, and within budgetary appropriations provided therefore, as he or she may deem necessary for the performance of his duties, and shall have the power to remove the same.

(15) Perform such additional duties as set forth in the Civil Service Job Description for the position of Director of Purchasing.

Section 4: No Divestiture of Power.

- A. Nothing contained in this Local Law shall operate or be construed to divest the Legislature of Cayuga County of any of its functions, powers, or duties.
- B. Nothing contained in this Local Law shall operate or be construed to divest the Cayuga County Treasurer of any his/her functions, powers, or duties.

Section 5: Repealer.

In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between this Local Law and any previous Local Law or Resolution of the Cayuga County Legislature, the terms of this Local Law shall govern.

Section 6: Savings Clause.

It is the intent of the Legislature that in the event that any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Local Law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment, decree or order shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment, decree or order shall have been rendered and that the remainder of this Local Law shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 7: Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State.


