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COUNTY OF CAYUGA LOCAL LAW NO. 6 OF THE YEAR 2023

A LOCAL LAW NO. 6 IN THE YEAR 2023, A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 6 FOR 2021, AUTHORIZING 12- AND 13-YEAR-OLD LICENSED HUNTERS TO HUNT DEER WITH A FIREARM OR CROSSBOW DURING HUNTING SEASON WITH THE SUPERVISION OF AN ADULT LICENSED HUNTER PURSUANT TO ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW SECTION 11-0935

BE ENACTED BY the County Legislature of the County of Cayuga, as follows:

SECTION 1 – LEGISLATIVE INTENT:

The intent of this Local Law is amend Local Law No. 6 for 2021, which authorized Cayuga County to permit 12 and 13 year old individuals to participate in the new and safe hunting opportunities in accordance with Environmental Conservation Law § 11-0935. The enacted 2021-2022 New York State Budget included a pilot program, allowing the opportunity for young hunters, ages 12 and 13, to hunt deer with firearms and crossbows through 2023 if a county authorizes such action within their municipality. Cayuga County is passing this Local Law as deer hunting is a valued tradition for many families, and this new opportunity allows experienced, adult hunters to introduce the value of hunting to the next generation. Furthermore, teaching young people safe, responsible, and ethical hunting practices will ensure a rewarding experience for the youth, while providing quality food to families and contributing to important deer management population control practices. The enacted 2023-2024 New York State Budget, extended the deer hunting pilot program allowing the opportunity for young hunters, ages 12 and 13, to hunt deer with firearms and crossbows through December 31, 2025, if a county authorizes such action within their municipality.

SECTION 2 - PILOT PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION

Pursuant to Environmental Conservation Law, ECL § 11-0935, Cayuga County elects to participate in and extend the temporary program to allow for young hunters, ages twelve (12) and thirteen (13), to hunt deer with a firearm, to include rifles, shotguns, and muzzle-loading firearms or crossbows through 2023.

SECTION 3 – STATE REQUIREMENTS TO ADHERE TO ONCE AUTHORIZED

Twelve (12) and thirteen (13) year old licensed hunters shall be allowed to hunt deer with the following requirements to be followed:

- Twelve (12) and thirteen (13) year old licensed hunters shall be allowed to hunt deer under the supervision of a licensed adult hunter, age 21 years or older, with a rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm in areas where and during the hunting season in which such firearms may be used; and
- Twelve (12) and thirteen (13) year old licensed hunters shall be allowed to hunt deer under the supervision of a licensed adult hunter, age 21 years or older, with a crossbow during the times when other hunters may use crossbows; and
- Supervision of a licensed adult hunter, age twenty-one (21) years or older, with at least three (3) years of experience who exercises physical control over the youth hunter at all times is required;

- For the purposes of this Local Law "physical control" shall mean that the physical proximity of such minor to the parent, guardian or person (licensed adult hunter) is such that the parent, guardian or person (licensed adult hunter) is reasonably able to issue verbal directions and instructions, maintain constant visual contact, and otherwise provide guidance and supervision to the minor; and
- All licensed twelve (12) and thirteen (13) year old hunters, as well as their adult supervisors, shall be required to wear fluorescent orange or pink clothing while engaged in hunting to an extent and covering so designated pursuant to the law, rules, and regulations promulgated by the State of New York; and
- All licensed twelve (12) and thirteen (13) year old hunters shall remain at ground level while hunting deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm; and
- Notwithstanding any State or Federal Law to the contrary, this local law shall not authorize the hunting of bear by a twelve (12) or thirteen (13) year old with a firearm or crossbow.

SECTION 5 - EXTENDING LOCAL LAW

This Local Law amends and extends LOCAL LAW NO. 6 FOR 2021, AUTHORIZING 12- AND 13-YEAR-OLD LICENSED HUNTERS TO HUNT DEER WITH A FIREARM OR CROSSBOW DURING HUNTING SEASON WITH THE SUPERVISION OF AN ADULT LICENSED HUNTER PURSUANT TO ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW SECTION 11-0935.

SECTION 6 – LOCAL LAW FILING REQUIREMENTS

A copy of this Local Law shall be sent to the New York State Department of Conservation as well as the New York State Department of State.

SECTION 7 – SEVERABILITY

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, effect or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

SECTION 8 – EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing and publication in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule.
