

ORDINANCE 138
AMMENDING THE VILLAGE OF CASSOPOLIS GENERAL LEGISLATION,
CHAPTER 264; PEACE AND GOOD ORDER

BE IT ORDAINED by the Village Council of the Village of Cassopolis, Cass County Michigan that the Village of Cassopolis Zoning Ordinance is amended as follows:

PART II GENERAL LEGISLATION
CHAPTER 264
ARTICLE I
GENERAL PROVISIONS
§264-1 DEFINITIONS

Add:

SECURE AREA

Any external or internal area within or around a police department or sheriff's department, a municipal or county building, courthouse or library, or other public agency, office, institution, or its environs where public access is limited, restricted, or prohibited due to the need to maintain security protocols for that area. A secure area shall be marked or maintained in a manner to inform the public that the area is secure, and that public access is limited, restricted, or prohibited.

PART II GENERAL LEGISLATION

ARTICLE II

Replace §264-6

§ 264-6 Refusal to leave public property and Trespassing in Secure Areas

A person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor if the person:

- A. Enters and loiters or remains in or about a police department or sheriff's department, a municipal or county building, courthouse or library or any public building agency, office, institution, or its environs without express or implied permission of those in authority or their representatives; and
- B. Refuses to leave the premises when so directed by those in authority or their representatives.
- C. Enters a secure area in or surrounding a police department or sheriff's department, a municipal or county building, courthouse or library, or any public building agency, office, institution, or its environs without express or implied permission of those with authority over the secure area or their representatives or designees; and
- D. Refuses to leave the area when so directed by those with authority over the secure area, their representatives, their designees, or law enforcement.

This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after publication of adopted ordinance.
