**SUBJECT:**

Ordinance amending Schedule XI of Chapter 10.96 entitled "Resident Parking Only" by adding:  
W Pleasant St along the south side from the alley east of Harrison St east to Main St; and  
W High St along the south side from a point 76 feet east of Harrison St east 86 feet.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt the ordinance.

**BACKGROUND:**

Both of these zones are affected by spillover parking from St. Ambrose University. No one in either zone objected to this ordinance. There is no off-street parking available to the two residents on W. High Street. The residents on W. Pleasant have either very limited or no off-street parking available to them.

ORDINANCE NO. 06-227

Ordinance amending Schedule XI of Chapter 10.96 entitled "Resident Parking Only" by adding:

W Pleasant St along the south side from the alley east of Harrison St east to Main St; and

**SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.** If any of the provisions of this ordinance are for any reason illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this ordinance, which are separable from said unlawful provisions shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions.

**REPEALER.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

**EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effective after its final passage and publication as by law provided.
