The City of Dover Ordains:

1. Purpose

As set forth in the background, which is incorporated by reference, the purpose of this ordinance is to repeal the Dover Pool Advisory Committee and merge/consolidate the current members of same with the Recreation Advisory Board.

2. AMENDMENT

Chapter 9 entitled "Boards, Commissions and Committees" is hereby amended by revising Section 9-20, "Dover Pool Advisory Committee", as follows:

THE FOLLOWING ARE AMENDED:

§ 9-20-Dover Pool Advisory Committee (Reserved).

- A. Membership. The Dover Pool Advisory Committee shall consist of seven members and two alternate members. In addition, there shall be one City Councilor appointed on an ex officio nonvoting basis.
- B. Terms of members. Members shall be appointed to terms of three years. Subsequent appointees shall be appointed to three year terms or less, if necessary, to achieve a membership with staggered terms.
- Authority and duties. The Dover Pool Advisory Committee shall study, consider and recommend to the City Council and City Manager, or designee, general policies for the operation of the Dover pools.

6.3. AMENDMENT

Chapter 9 entitled "Boards, Commissions and Committees" is hereby amended by revising Section 9-5, "Recreation Advisory Board", as follows:

a. THE FOLLOWING ARE AMENDED:


§ 9-5 Recreation Advisory Board.

- Membership. The Recreation Advisory Board shall consist of nine eleven members and three alternates, appointed by the City Council. There may also be a City Council liaison who shall be nominated by the Mayor and appointed by the City Council for the length of his/her Council term.
- Terms of members. Members shall be appointed to terms of three years. В.
- C. Authority and duties. The Recreation Advisory Board shall perform the following functions:

(1) Study, consider and recommend, to the City Council and the City Manager, or designee, general policies for the provision of recreation programs and facilities.

- (2) Review programs and recommend additions to or deletions of those programs in the City of Dover; advise and recommend to the City Council and the City Manager, or designee, of such improvements.
- (3) Aid and assist the City Council and the City Manager, or designee, in the formulation of future plans and programs for the ultimate benefit of all users of recreational facilities.
- (4) Study and recommend methods for financing proposed recreation developments.

7.4. TRANSITION PROVISION

As this ordinance repeals the Dover Pool Advisory Committee, the currently appointed and serving members of the Dover Pool Advisory Committee are, with passage of this ordinance, hereby reappointed to the Recreation Advisory Board for (and to the extent of) the remainder of their existing terms for the repealed Pool Advisory Committee.

8.5. TAKES EFFECT

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage. The City Clerk shall cause publication of notice as required by RSA 47:18.

ORDINANCE BACKGROUND MATERIAL:

This ordinance repeals and consolidates/merges the remaining members of the Dover Pool Advisory Committee with the Recreation Advisory Board, as part of the City Council's ongoing effort to re-organize and streamline City boards and commissions. The authority and duties of the Recreation Advisory Board have not been amended by this ordinance, as it is understood that the existing provisions in Dover Code § 9-5 encompass the Dover Pool Advisory Committee's preexisting role and duties. There are currently five active and serving members of the Dover Pool Advisory Committee and no alternates, so this ordinance provides for slightly increasing the membership of the Recreation Advisory Board.

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
