The City of Dover Ordains:

1. Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to revise Chapter 141 of the Dover Code to (i) adopt certain paid parking exemption for vehicles with Veteran license plates, and (ii) impose a one-way restriction on a section of Fifth Street. Further information is in the background section of this ordinance, incorporated by reference.

2. AMENDMENT

Chapter 141 entitled "Vehicles and Traffic" is hereby amended by revising Section 141-30, "Hours of operation and rates", as follows:

a. THE FOLLOWING ARE AMENDED:

§ 141-30 Hours of operation and rates.

- A. Paid parking shall be required daily between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., except on Sundays, with the exception of:
- (1) The Orchard Street Parking Garage where designated as metered or paid parking shall also be required as paid parking at all times, 24 hours a day and seven days a week.
- (2) The following holidays: January 1; the third Monday in January, known as Martin Luther King, Jr. Civil Rights Day; the third Monday in February, known as Washington's Birthday; the last Monday in May, known as Memorial Day, or on a date to coincide with the federal observance if it is held on a different day; July 4; the first Monday in September, known as Labor Day; the second Monday in October, known in Dover as Indigenous People's Day; November 11, known as Veterans Day; Thanksgiving Day; the Friday after Thanksgiving; and Christmas Day. When one of the listed holidays falls on a Sunday, the Monday after shall be observed as a holiday.
- (3) Any vehicle bearing the following special New Hampshire license plates and in use by the person qualifying for said special plates shall be entitled to free parking in metered spaces for no more than three hours each day: Purple Heart (including Purple Heart-Vanity), Gold Star, Prisoner of War, and Pearl Harbor Survivor (including Pearl Harbor Survivor-Vanity). Any vehicle bearing a New Hampshire Veteran or Veteran-Vanity license plates and in use by the person qualifying for said special plates shall be entitled to free parking in metered spaces in the Orchard Street Parking Garage and the Fourth Street Parking Lot for no more than three hours each day. Any vehicle with license plates from another state or United States territory bearing substantially equivalent governmental license plates shall, provided the vehicle is in use by the person qualifying for said special license plates, likewise be

entitled to no more than three hours each day of free parking in metered spaces. <u>This exemption does not apply to parking spaces designated for electric vehicle charging.</u>

- B. Parking meter rates shall be set forth in the annual Fee Schedule adopted by the City Council.
- C. For good cause, the Chief of Police, upon recommendation of the Parking Commission, shall have the authority to temporarily suspend the provisions of this section for specified dates and times.
- D. Free parking permitted for persons with a walking disability under RSA 265:74 shall be limited to a maximum of three hours.

3. AMENDMENT

Chapter 141 entitled "Vehicles and Traffic" is hereby amended by revising Section 141-40, "Schedule A: One-Way Roadways", as follows:

a. THE FOLLOWING ARE AMENDED:

§ 141-40 Schedule A: One-Way Roadways.

In accordance with the provisions of § **141-6**, it shall be unlawful for any person operating a motor vehicle to operate the same on those portions of public highways hereinafter named, in any direction other than as hereinafter set forth:



ORDINANCE BACKGROUND MATERIAL:

141-30: The amendments to Section 30 enable vehicles displaying Veteran license plates to qualify for a three-hour exemption from paid parking. This change was approved by the Parking Commission on February 20, 2024.

141-40: This change imposes a new one-way restriction for a section of Fifth Street (between Chestnut Street and Fourth Street). This change derives from feedback from residents. The City's Transportation and Advisory Commission approved this change on August 22, 2022, which is being brought forward at this time in relation to the Fifth and Grove Street construction project.
