

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-4

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF DOYLESTOWN,
BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING
CHAPTER 15, SECTION 312 CREATING A HANDICAPPED
PARKING SPOT ON MAPLE AVENUE AT EAST STREET**

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Borough Code provides that the corporate powers of the Borough Council (the “Borough Council”) of the Borough of Doylestown (“Borough”) include the ability to make regulations as may be necessary for the health, safety, and general welfare of the residents of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 15 of the Borough of Doylestown Code of Ordinances (“Borough Code”) regulates motor vehicles and traffic, including parking; and

WHEREAS, Section 312 of Chapter 15 of the Borough Code provides for special purpose parking zones with parking otherwise prohibited; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to add a handicapped parking spot on the northwest side of Maple Avenue east of the intersection with East Street; and

WHEREAS, the Borough determined that these changes promote the health, safety, and general welfare of Borough residents; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment has been advertised, considered, and reviewed in accordance with the Borough Code.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, be it **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Doylestown, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

- I. Chapter 15, Section 312, of the Borough Code entitled “Special Purpose Parking Zones Established; Parking Otherwise Prohibited” is hereby AMENDED by ADDING the following to the table in Section 312:**

Street	Location	Purpose
Maple Avenue	Northwest side, beginning at a point seventy-nine (79) feet northeast of its intersection with the east side of East Street and extending northeast twenty-two (22) feet	Handicapped parking

II. Partial Repealer

All other provisions of the Borough’s Code of Ordinances, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect. All other Ordinances or provisions of the Borough’s Code of Ordinances inconsistent herewith or in conflict with any of the terms hereof are hereby, to the extent of said inconsistencies or conflicts, specifically repealed.

III. Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If any section, clause, sentence, part or provision thereof shall be held illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision of the court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences, parts or provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Borough Council that this Ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional section, clause, sentence or part of a provision had not been included herein.


IV. Effective Date


