Mayor King called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

Mayor King asked for a moment of silence in memory of those lost in the September 11, 2001 tragedy.

Teen Center Programs

Karen Musson reported on youth activities held at the Lions Den. She stated that at the end of the year of 2000 they had 6,000 teenagers participate at the Lions Den and by the end of August 2001 they have had 7,000. Bart Hallings stated he enjoys the drop in program at the teen center and thought the program helps keep teenagers out of trouble. Karen Musson reported on the L.I.O.N.S. P.R.I.D.E. a program that is funded through a grant from Monroe County. The teens participated in community service projects. She discussed the trips they took including white water rafting

and the 35 mile canoe trip through the Adirondack Mountains. She distributed information regarding the objectives they had for the teenagers, activities that are held, and reports on the trips.

Youth and Fairport Village Partnership

Bob Cantwell reported that the seniors at Fairport High School have to participate in community service projects as part of their graduating requirements. He discussed how the Fairport Partnership has become involved with the youth. He stated they will put together a list of community projects pertaining to the Village for them.

Fairport Village Partnership

Kal Wysokowski gave an update on the Village Partnership and showed pictures of facade improvements that included the Fairport Village Inn and Rainy Day Mercantile.

Fairport Fire Halls

Tom Santillo reported on the progress of the renovations for the fire halls and stated that Administrator Moore, the committee, and he met with the engineers, Bergmann Associates. They expect to bid by the end of the year and hope construction will start by April, 2002.

FMC Operations Center

Administrator Moore reported on the progress of the FMC Operations Center. The engineers are Bergmann Associates. It is a three building project and the construction should begin in the spring. He stated they designed it to specifically reflect a commercial/industrial look that would compliment the canal and downtown areas. He also reported on the cost of the project.

Liftbridge Lane Reconstruction

Kevin Clark reported on the Liftbridge Lane improvement project and stated it would be a total street reconstruction that would be an extension of the canal corridor. He discussed some improvements to be made. The project will be started in the spring.

Street Projects

Administrator Moore reported that the streets planned for significant roadwork would be South Avenue and Summit Street. He stated the consulting engineer would do the inventory and mapping and discussed the improvements.

Planning Board

Ken Rohr introduced Andy Raus, a new member to the Planning Board. He reported that 54-56 Liftbridge Lane East would be renovated, up scaled, and would have more apartments. Kevin Clark and Kal Wysokowski met with the Planning Board regarding the Village Partnership and the Liftbridge Lane Improvement Project.

Comprehensive Plan Review Committee

Mayor King stated that Trustee Ferraro, who is chairman of the Comprehensive Plan Review Committee recommended committees for a central business district plan and a canal district plan. Kal Wysokowski gave an update on the Comprehensive Plan Review Committee. They have been reviewing projects and goals.

Zoning Board

Dale Davis reported that the Zoning Board is very supportive of the project at 54 – 56 Liftbridge Lane East.

UR/IDA Board

Jim Unckless gave an update on the elderly grant program and funding for Section 8. They have applied for a waterfront rediscovery grant for \$25,000 that has to be matched. They have an option to buy the marina property if it goes up for sale.

Fairport Municipal Commission

Bob Cantwell reported they are celebrating the 100th anniversary of Fairport Electric. Leslie White reported on the celebration that will coincide with the Scarecrow Festival which is Saturday, October 13, 2001. It will also be Public Power Week and there will be an Open House at the Service Center from 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. Administrator Moore reported on electric meters being replaced which will result in the meter reader using a remote to obtain a reading.

Cable Commission

Chuck Marino reported that the Commission hired a consultant to observe the cable operations and discussed the results. Paul Kolacki and Ed McClenathan attended a national conference, Alliance for Community Media, in July in Washington D.C. A satellite dish will be placed on the Village Hall since they will have an educational satellite public service. He reviewed other projects they have been working on.

Fairport Perinton Merchants Association

Lorain Francis stated there will be a number of children's activities during the Scarecrow Festival. Santa Claus will be arriving in the Village on the Saturday after Thanksgiving.

Fire Department

Tom Santillo reported that the Fairport Fire Department had recently raised an estimated \$30,000 in conjunction with the City of Rochester and other Monroe County fire departments that raised an estimated \$830,000 for the September 11th tragedy. He reported that some of the firemen would be attending a training and competition conference in Long Island on November 3, 2001. He also stated the Fire Department would be receiving an award from the Fire Chief's Association on October 11, 2001. They had responded to an accident in May at Cantisano's freeing a man caught in a machine in 26 minutes and saved his life. Mayor King congratulated the Fire Department.

Fairport High School

Jack Heisman stated Fairport High School raised \$13,000 in four days and Reader's Digest doubled the amount to \$26,000. The money was donated to the Red Cross for the September 11th tragedy.

Sign Committee

Fritz May gave an update on the sign committee. There will be some new street signs for the business district and new public parking signs.

Mayor King stated the next meeting would be a dinner meeting at the Green Lantern Inn on Tuesday, February 5, 2002.

Executive Session Convened

Motion was made by Trustee Clark, seconded by Trustee May, and unanimously adopted to convene an executive session to discuss current litigation.

Meeting Reopened

Motion was made by Trustee White, seconded by Trustee Clark, and unanimously adopted to reopen the meeting to the public.

Motion was made by Trustee May, seconded by Trustee Clark, and unanimously adopted to adjourn the meeting at 8:50 P.M.
