Section 1. Legislative Intent

The New York State Legislature recently enacted a new statute, Section 466-a of the Real Property Tax Law, which authorizes the Village to decrease the number of years volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers must serve to be eligible to receive the real property tax exemption from five (5) years to two (2) years. This Local Law amends the Village Code to provide for this shorter period to become so eligible.

Section 2. Section 83-11 As Amended

§ 83-11. Exemption to be granted

A. Real property owned by an enrolled member of the Village's Volunteer Fire Department or by such enrolled member and spouse residing in the Village of Floral Park shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of ten percent of the assessed value of such property for Village taxes, exclusive of any special assessments. Such exemption shall in no event exceed three thousand dollars multiplied by the latest state equalization rate for the Village.

- B. Such exemption shall not be granted to an enrolled member of the Village Volunteer Fire Department unless
 - (1). The applicant resides in the Village of Floral Park;
 - (2). The property is the primary residence of the applicant;
 - (3). The property is used exclusively for residential purposes; provided, however, in the event any portion of the property is not used exclusively for the applicant's residence, but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section; and
 - (4). The applicant has been certified as a member of the Village's Volunteer Fire Department for at least two years. The Village Assessor shall determine the procedure for certification.
- C. Any enrolled member of the Village's Volunteer Fire Department who accrues more than twenty years of active service and is so certified shall be granted the ten-percent exemption as authorized by this section for the remainder of his or her life.
- D. Un-remarried spouses of volunteer firefighters or volunteer ambulance workers killed in the line of duty. The Village shall continue an exemption or reinstate a pre-existing exemption claimed under this section by an enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service, for such deceased enrolled member's un-remarried spouse if such member is killed in the line of duty; provided, however that:
 - (a). such un-remarried spouse is certified by the board of directors of the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service as an un-remarried spouse of an enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service who was killed in the line of duty; and
 - (b). such deceased volunteer has been an enrolled member for at least two years; and
 - (c) such deceased volunteer had been receiving the exemption prior to their death.
- E. Un-remarried spouses of deceased volunteer firefighters or volunteer ambulance workers. The Village shall continue an exemption or reinstate a pre-existing exemption to an unremarried spouse of a deceased enrolled member of an incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department, or incorporated voluntary ambulance service, provided, however that:

- (a) such un-remarried spouse is certified by the board of directors of the incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service as an un-remarried spouse of a deceased enrolled member of such incorporated volunteer fire company, fire department or incorporated voluntary ambulance service; and
- (b). such deceased volunteer has been an enrolled member for at least twenty years; and
- (c) such deceased volunteer an un-remarried spouse had been receiving the exemption for such property prior to the death of such volunteer.
- F. The application for such exemption shall be filed with the Village Assessors. The Village Assessor shall prescribe the time period for filing for such exemption, but said period shall be no less than 90 days.
- G. No applicant who is a volunteer firefighter, who by reason of such status is receiving any benefit under New York State Law on the effective date of this section shall suffer any diminution of such benefit because of the provisions of this section.

Section 3. Severability

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 4. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
