Chapter 486

Rules for Public Safety Committee

I. Name of Committee

The name of this committee shall be the "City of Fulton Public Safety Committee" (hereinafter known as "PSC").

II. Powers and Duties

The PSC has been established pursuant to Mayoral Directive and Common Council Resolution. The PSC shall have all the powers and duties conferred upon it by Local Legislation, as it may periodically be amended. The principal duty of the PSC shall be to develop, evaluate and maintain public safety and emergency preparedness for the City of Fulton. The committee is to review and establish agreements for emergency preparedness annually. The committee is to review and establish corrective action plans to ensure the public safety of the community.

III. Membership

A. The members of the PSC have been appointed by the Mayor, the Fulton Fire Chief, and the Public Safety Committee. This membership should consist of:

1. Elected Local Official
 - Mayor or Designee
 - 3 Councilors appointed by the Mayor
2. Emergency Management representative (Currently the Fire Chief)
3. Fire & Emergency Services representative (Fire Chief)
4. Community Group representative (Appointed by the committee)
5. EMS representative (Menter Ambulance)
6. Facility Owner representative(s)
7. Facility Operator representative(s)
8. Local School District representative(s)
9. Secretary
10. Law Enforcement representative (As Requested by the committee)

IV. Officers

A. The PSC shall have a Chairperson who will serve an approximate two-year term until December 31st of the next election cycle. The Chairperson shall be a member of the City Council that is appointed by the councilor on the committee. The appointment of the Chairperson shall occur as an agenda item of the committee.

B. The PSC shall have a Vice-Chairperson who will serve an approximate two-year term until December 31st of the next election cycle. The Vice-Chairperson shall be appointed by the Committee. The appointment of the Vice Chairperson shall occur as an agenda item of a committee meeting.

C. The powers and duties of the Chairperson shall be to preside at meetings of the PSC, appoint such standing and special subcommittees as needed to conduct the business of the PSC, serve as the (nonexclusive) spokesperson for the PSC, act as the coordinating official, and have such other powers and duties as are customary for the presiding officer of similar committees and boards.

D. The powers and duties of the Vice-Chairperson shall be to preside over meetings of the PSC in the absence of the Chairperson and to carry out such other duties as may be directed by the Chairperson.

V. Conduct of Meeting

A. The PSC shall meet as often as necessary to conduct its business, and in no event less often than once quarterly.

B. The PSC shall conduct no business in the absence of a quorum of its members, a quorum being set at 4.

C. The PSC shall conduct its business by means of resolutions duly adopted by a majority of the membership. No motion, resolution or other parliamentary instrument shall prevail unless it receives a majority of the votes of the membership.

D. The PSC shall be deemed to be a “public body” of the City of Fulton, within the meaning of the New York State Open Meetings and Freedom of Information statutes, except as those statutes may be superseded by applicable Federal Law.

E. Except as otherwise provided in these Rules, the PSC shall conduct its business in accordance with Robert’s Rules of Order.

VI. Public Participation and Access to Information

A. The public is encouraged to participate in the work of the PSC by attendance at meetings, and when in order, by addressing the PSC.

B. The public shall be notified of meetings of the PSC in accordance with applicable provisions of the New York Open Meetings Law, specifically by advance notice given to the local public media by the City of Fulton.

WHEREAS, Mayor Rice asked for a motion to close the public hearing, which was offered by Councilor Chapman

And seconded by Councilor Patrick and unanimously carried.

Councilor Avery introduced the following and moved its adoption:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the proposed addition to the City of Fulton Charter of the Public Safety Committee is hereby approved.
