

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 452**

On the motion of Councilman-At-Large Clark, seconded by Councilman Landry, all voting affirmatively, it was

WHEREAS, the Common Council will authorize A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 220-6, ZONING CODE, OF THE CITY OF GLENS FALLS, TO REVISE THE ZONING MAP TO CHANGE THE ZONING DISTRICT BOUNDARY FROM MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTIAL (R-M) TO GENERAL COMMERICAL 1 (GC-1) TAX MAP NOS. 302.20-21-2, 4 SHERMAN AVENUE, GLENS FALLS: and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has held a public hearing regarding the proposed change to the Zoning Law; and

**WHEREAS**, the applicant Stewart's Shop, Inc. appeared before the Common Council and having submitted a completed Short Environmental Assessment Form and explanation of the proposed change in Zoning; and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney having determined the proposed change in zoning is classified as an Unlisted Action in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Stale Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and the City Attorney having reviewed the Part 2 Impact Assessment with the Common Council at the public hearing and the Common Council having answered "no or small impact" to questions 1-11 of Part 2; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED,** pursuant to this Resolution, the City of Glens Falls accepts Lead Agency for SEQRA review of the proposed change in the Zoning Law; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, based upon the Short Environmental Assessment Form Part 1 and Part 2 and upon documentation and discussion, the City of Glens Falls determines that no significant adverse environmental impacts are likely to result in the

change in Zoning for the said parcel and issues a negative declaration: and such determination is reached after careful consideration and analysis of the proposed action; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** the Common Council approves the SEQRA Negative Declaration Determination of NonSignificance and authorizes and directs the City Clerk's Office to file any necessary documents in accordance with the provisions of the general regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

LOCAL LAW NO. 5-2023

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLENS FALLS AS FOLLOWS:

A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 220-6, ZONING CODE, OF THE CITY OF GLENS FALLS, TO REVISE THE ZONING MAP TO CHANGE THE ZONING DISTRICT BOUNDARY FROM MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTAL (R-M) TO GENERAL COMMERCIAL 1 (GC-1) FOR ONE PARCEL, TAX MAP NO. 302.20-21-2, COMMONLY KNOWN AS 4 SHERMAN AVENUE, GLENS FALLS.

Section 1. Purpose.

Because City Code Chapter 220, Zoning, is designed to guide the future growth and development of the City of Glens Falls with a well-considered plan of land use, the Common Council recognizes that certain adjustments to its zoning laws must be made from time to time.

The Common Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City of Glens Falls to make changes in the Zoning District Boundary in the City's Third Ward from Multifamily Residential (R-M) to General Commercial 1 (GC-1) at 4 Sherman Avenue, Glens Falls, New York. Stewart's Shops, Inc., proposes to develop the existing lot to expand the Stewart's Shop located at the corner of Glen and Sherman Avenue, to allow for further expansion and growth of the Stewart's Shop located at that intersection. The parcel is currently used as a parking lot. The Common Council referred this request to the Glens Falls Planning Board for an advisory opinion. The Glens Falls Planning Board issued a favorable opinion to the request to rezone.

Section 2. Section 220-6 titled "Zoning Map" of Chapter of the Glens Falls City Code, the "City of Glens Falls. New York Zoning Law" is hereby amended to provide a new subsection "O" to read as follows:

#### N. The Zoning map is amended in the following manner:

The boundary line between the Multifamily Residential (R-M) to General Commercial 1 (GC-1) shall be amended by changing the zoning of one parcel, tax map no. 302.20-21-2, 4 Sherman Avenue. The zoning of the parcel shall be changed from the current Multifamily Residential to General Commercial 1.

Section 3. When Effective.

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York, as provided in the Municipal Home Rule Law.
