At a regular City of Glens Falls Common Council meeting held on Tuesday, March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at 7:30pm at City Hall, 42 Ridge Street, Glens Falls, New York 12801, the following resolution was passed:

### **RESOLUTION NO. 74**

On the motion of Councilman-At-Large Clark, seconded by Councilwoman Gooden, all voting affirmatively, it was

**RESOLVED THAT,** the Glens Falls Common Council hereby the adoption of **Local Law # 1-2024** to amend Chapter 189 Streets & Sidewalks Part 3 Snow and Ice Article XIV Removal. And to authorize the Clerk of the City of Glens Falls to take all necessary actions to file this with the office of the Secretary of State of NY, the Local Law shall take effect as of October 1, 2024, as provided in the Municipal Home Rule Law.

A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND Chapter 189 Streets and Sidewalks, Part 3 Show and Ice, Article XIV Removal.

#### Section 1. Purpose.

Because City Code Chapter 189 Streets and Sidewaiks, Part 3 Snow and Ice, Article XIV Removal, is designed to ensure proper snow removal on sidewalks after each snowstorm by an owner, occupant or person in charge of a lot adjoining a City Street, the Common Council recognizes that certain adjustments to its Snow and Ice Removal must be made to gain compliance with the requirements of the Code and provide the City with the ability to charge and collect fees from property owners who are not in compliance.

The City of Glens Falls Building and Code Committee has reviewed certain public safety concerns and the City's ability to address property owners who are not in compliance with the Code relative to Snow Removal and having made a recommendation to enact the Amendments to Chapter 189 Streets and Sidewalks, Part 3 Snow and Ice, Article XIV Removal.

#### Section 2. Amendments

Based upon the recommendations of the City of Glens Falls Building and Codes Committee, the Common Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City of Glens Falls to amend Chapter 189 Streets and Sidewalks, Part 3 Snow and Ice, Article XIV Removal, by adding additional provisions as follows:

#### § 189-34. Removal by City.

In addition to court action, in the event the owner or person in charge of a lot adjoining. City property fails to remove the snow and ice from the sidewalk adjoining City property, the Buildings and Codes Department shall issue a Notice of Violation, by posting said Notice of Violation at the property on the main entrance to said property which is in noncompliance. Whenever the owner or person in charge of a lot adjoining a City Street fails to remove the snow and ice from the sidewalk adjoining the City property with the time period specified herein under §189-31, and after twenty-four hours of posting of the Notice of Violation being posted by Buildings and Codes, the City may cause the sidewalk to be cleared at the owner's expense.

#### § 189-35. Collection of Costs.

The City Controller shall be notified of the expense incurred by the amount of labor, equipment and materials used by City employees or by invoice from City designated independent contractors. The Building and Codes Department shall maintain reasonable records of any work performed under this section.

The City Controller shall send an invoice notice to the owner via first class mail to the property owner's address as listed on the city's real property tax records for the removal of snow and ice as certified by the Building and Codes Department. If not paid within 30 days, the cost thereof shall be assessed against the property added to their tax bill and become a lien thereon, collectible in the same manner as delinguant City taxes.

#### § 189-3[4]6. Penalties for offenses.

Any person, firm or corporation convicted of violating the provisions of this article shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$250 or imprisonment for a term not to exceed 15 days, or both.

A complete copy of Chapter 189 Streets and Sidewarks, Part 3 Snow and Ice, Article XIV Removal is annexed hereto.

Section 3. When Effective

This Local Law shall take effect as of October 1, 2024, upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York, as provided in the Municipal Home Rule Law.
