RESOLUTION ADOPTING A LOCAL LAW CREATING A NEW CHAPTER 453, ENTITLED "TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND SMOKING PARAPHENALIA: PROHIBITION OF SPECIFIED SALES, DISPLAY AND ADVERTISING," IN THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF GREENBURGH [TB 22-17]

WHEREAS, even though for health and safety reasons the sale of tobacco products is not permitted in New York to anyone under 21 years of age, new tobacco products are now being marketed in flavored varieties specifically intended to appeal to children under the age of 21; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society advises that "no youth or young adults should begin using any tobacco product, including e-cigarettes," and the U.S Surgeon General advises that nicotine exposure, including through e-cigarettes, can harm the developing brain, which continues to develop until about age 25; and

WHEREAS, under Article IX of the New York State Constitution, municipalities have the right (unless the State Legislature adopts, and the Governor signs, a limiting law) to legislate with respect to "conduct, safety, health and well-being of persons and property therein;" and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that authority to protect the health, safety and welfare of the Town's children, the Town Board hereby finds it in the best interest of the Town to consider a local law which would restrict the sale, display and advertising of certain tobacco products and smoking paraphernalia in close proximity to schools, parks, and houses of worship; and

WHEREAS, a local law was prepared by Town staff, based upon input and research conducted by members of the community, including members of the Edgemont Community Council, a local civic association; and

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2022, the Town Board adopted Resolution CL-5 - 10/26/2022, declaring its intent to act as Lead Agency for review of the Amendment and all related actions under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEORA"); and

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2022, the Town of Greenburgh Town Board held a duly noticed public hearing on the proposed Code Text Amendment; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing notice was additionally sent to various interested businesses in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board conducted a coordinated SEQRA review (Westchester County, adjacent and Surrounding Municipalities - Interested Agencies) and analysis of the entire record, studying and documenting the potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed Zoning Text Amendment, and on December 14, 2022, in connection with adopted Resolution CD-1 - 12/14/2022 made a Negative Declaration with respect to SEQRA; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Greenburgh hereby adopts the attached Local Law creating a new Chapter 453 entitled "Tobacco Products and Smoking Paraphernalia: Prohibition of Specified Sales, Display and Advertising."

A local law to amend the Code of the Town of Greenburgh, pursuant to the New York State Constitution Article IX and New York Municipal Home Rule § 10, by creating a new Chapter 453 entitled "Tobacco Products and Smoking Paraphernalia: Prohibition of Specified Sales, Display and Advertising" in the Code of the Town of Greenburgh.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Greenburgh:

- § 4. Supersession.
- § 5. Severability.
- § 6. Effective Date.

§ 1. Title.

This local law is entitled "Tobacco Products and Smoking Paraphernalia: Prohibition of Specified Sales, Display and Advertising."

§ 2. Legislative Findings and Intent.

The Town Board of the Town of Greenburgh finds it in the best interest of the Town to adopt a local law which would restrict the sale, display and advertising of certain tobacco products and smoking paraphernalia in close proximity to schools and parks.

§ 3. Amendment adding a new Chapter 453 to the Code of the Town of Greenburgh

The Code of the Town of Greenburgh is hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter, Chapter 453, to read as follows (new text underlined):

§ 453-1 Definitions.

Advertising

Any words, pictures, photographs, symbols, graphics or visual images of smoking paraphernalia or specific tobacco products, as defined below, whether solid, liquid or gaseous, or a copy or likeness of an object or any communication of any nature intended to create an interest in or induce a person to purchase or use such an object.

Display

To show or place smoking paraphernalia or specific tobacco products, whether solid, liquid or gaseous, or a copy or likeness of it, in an exterior or interior location visible from any public road or sidewalk.

Smoking Paraphernalia

Any pipe, water pipe, hookah, rolling papers, vaporizer or other device, equipment or apparatus designed or used for the inhalation of tobacco or related smoking products.

Specified Tobacco Products

Tobacco heating systems, e-cigarettes, electronic nicotine delivery systems, vaping products, synthetic nicotine products, or any product containing synthetic nicotine, other than those available from pharmacies by prescription only.

§ 453-2 Prohibited Activities.

- A. The sale or offering to sell of any specified tobacco products and smoking paraphernalia is prohibited within 750 feet from any school which has students below the age of 21 or public park.
- B. The advertising or display of any specified tobacco products and smoking paraphernalia is prohibited within 1,500 feet from any school which has students below the age of 21 or public park.

The distances set forth in subsections A and B of this Section 453-2 shall be measured on a straight line from the nearest property line of the relevant school or public park to the building where the potential sales, display and/or advertising of specified tobacco products and/or smoking paraphernalia occurs.

§ 453-3 Enforcement and Penalties.

- A. The Town of Greenburgh Police Department and Building Inspector shall be charged with enforcement of Section 453-2A of this chapter. Any person violating this chapter shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of up to \$2,500 for the initial day and \$2,500 for each day the violation remains. Any person convicted of a second violation of this chapter within three years of a prior conviction under this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be subject to a fine of twice that imposed for the first offense, up to \$5,000 for the initial day and \$5,000 for each day the violation remains.
- B. The Town of Greenburgh Police Department and Building Inspector shall have the authority to enforce Section 453-2B this chapter. Any person violating this chapter shall be subject to a \$1,000 fine for the first offense and \$5,000 for any subsequent offense.
- C. Nothing herein shall be deemed to preclude the Office of the Town Attorney from seeking the closure, for good cause shown, of any business found to be operating in violation of this chapter. For businesses that are lawfully selling, at the time of the enactment of this local law, specified tobacco products and/or smoking paraphernalia, such sales may continue for a period of one year from the date that the law is filed with the Secretary of State.

§ 4. Supersession:

Pursuant to New York Municipal Home Rule Law Section 22, this law is intended to supersede any other inconsistent provision of law.

§ 5. Severability:

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law or the application to any person or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or its application to the person or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

§ 6. Effective Date:

This law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
