13	WHEREAS, the Further Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2020, P.L. No. 116-94,
14	became law on December 20, 2019 and included therein the Transportation, Housing and Urban
15	Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2020, whereunder Title II thereof the
16	annual appropriation for the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for
17	the federal fiscal year ending on September 30, 2021 was authorized; and
18	WHEREAS, the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022, P.L. No. 117-103, became law
19	on March 15, 2022 and included therein the Transportation, Housing and Urban Development,
20	and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2022, whereunder Title II thereof the annual
21	appropriation for the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for the
22	federal fiscal year ending on September 30, 2023 was authorized; and
23	WHEREAS, the 2020 and 2022 Annual Action Plan have been completed, made
24	available for public comment and submitted to and approved by the Council for the City of
25	Harrisburg and so, in consideration thereof, the Council does now make and ordain the following
26	enactment.
27 28	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
29	HARRISBURG, AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED BY AUTHORITY OF THE SAME, as
30	follows:

31 32	SECTION 1. The City of Harrisburg's 2018-2022 Consolidated Plan is required to
33	provide the City's comprehensive vision for the use of federal funds that encompasses a
34	description of the needs related to affordable housing, infrastructure, fair housing, economic
35	development and helping the homeless. Through a process of consultation with the community,
36	the City developed Goals and Objectives for addressing these needs. The 2018-2022 Consolidated
37	Plan and 2020 and 2022 Action Plans were approved in accordance with Title 24 of the U.S. Code
38	of Federal Regulations by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The
39	Consolidated Plan and the related 2020 and 2022 Annual Action Plans chart a strategic course of
40	action for revitalization and community development. Benchmarks for performance of specific
41	goals and objectives have been established by which the City and its citizens should be able to
42	measure and track the performance of the programs established by the City.
43	The 2018-2022 Consolidated Plan, as approved, and the 2020 and 2022 Annual Action
44	Plans, as approved, strive to meet the application requirements for the Community Development
45	Block Grant program (CDBG), the HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) and the
46	Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG). The City of Harrisburg is a formula grantee and
47	receives funding each year in October for the new program year.
48	
49	SECTION 2. Partial HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) funds for Fiscal
50	Year 2020 of \$474,917.00 shall be appropriated as follows:

83	SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.
84	If any provision, sentence, clause, section or part of this ordinance or the application thereof
85	to any person or circumstance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid by
86	a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect
87	or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this ordinance.
88	It is hereby declared as the intent of the Council of the City of Harrisburg that this ordinance would
89	have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid provision, sentence, clause, section
90	or part not been included herein.
91	
92	SECTION 6. REPEALER.
93	All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby
94	repealed.
95	SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.
96	This ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the law.
