Materials such as leaves, branches, and any other items designated as yard waste with the 105 exception of grass clippings shall be source separated and collected for organics recycling or 106 composting. Designated composting materials for the composting program established 107 pursuant to this Chapter shall be determined by the rules and regulations promulgated by the 108 109 Director DPW. 110 **** 111 112 113 § 9-307.3 Composting Disposal. A person may not use another person's 134 receptacles without permission, or place refuse in front of a premises other than the building 135 136 in which he resides or works. A violation of this provision involving construction and 137 demolition waste or hazardous waste shall constitute a Category 1 violation; an offense subject to a non-traffic summary citation and penalty pursuant to § 9-311.4(B). A violation 138 of this provision involving electronic waste or tires shall constitute a Category 2 violation; 139 an offense subject to a non-traffic summary citation and penalty pursuant to § 9-311.4(C). 140 Municipal waste which is not bagged and placed in the cart shall constitute a Category 2 141 violation; an offense subject to a non-traffic summary citation and penalty pursuant to § 9-142 311.4(C). 143 144 **** 145 146 147 SECTION 2.
