30	the City of Havre de Grace and has the duty of general supervision of the City, its employees, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 63 of the City Charter, "The Director of Public Works, shall be responsible for fleet management and the yacht basin and marina, and all matters relating to the maintenance and operation of the City physical environments including, but not limited to streets, water, waste water, sanitation, City facilities, related capital assets, construction management, maintenance and operation of the physical properties of the City and other duties as assigned; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor and City Council believe it to be in the best interest of the residents of the City of Havre de Grace and in the interest of effective and efficient government to adopt the said amendment to the City Charter to clarify the duties of the Mayor and Director of Public Works under the Charter.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is determined, decided, and resolved by the City Council that the following is hereby approved.

Section 65 of the City Charter is to be amended as follows, with the words underscored to be added and the words in bold and brackets to be deleted.

Section 65 Control of public ways.

The City has control of all public ways in the City, except such as may be under the jurisdiction of the Maryland State Highway Commission. Subject to the laws of the State of Maryland and this Charter the [City] Director of Public Works, under the direction of the Mayor and subject to approved budget expenditures, may establish, operate and maintain in good condition the public ways of the City.

Section 66 of the City Charter is to be amended as follows, with the words underscored to be added and the words in bold and brackets to be deleted.

Section 66 Powers of City as to public ways.

The [City] Director of Public Works, under the direction of the Mayor and subject to approved budget expenditures, shall have the power to:

- 66 A. Establish, regulate and change from time to time the grade lines, width, and construction materials of any City public way or part thereof, bridges, curbs and gutters.
- 68 B. Grade, lay out, construct, open, extend, and make new City public ways.
- 69 C. Grade, straighten, widen, alter, improve, or close up any existing City public way or part thereof.
- 71 D. Pave, surface, repave, or resurface any City public way or part thereof.
- 72 E. Install, construct, repair, and maintain curbs and/or gutters along any City public way or part thereof.

- 74 F. Construct, reconstruct, maintain, and repair bridges.
- 75 G. Name City public ways.
- H. Have surveys, plans, specifications, and estimates made for any of the above activities or projects or parts thereof.

Section 67 of the City Charter is to be amended as follows, with the words underscored to be added and the words in bold and brackets to be deleted.

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Section 67 Powers of City as to sidewalks.

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The [City] <u>Director of Public Works</u> <u>under the Direction of the Mayor and subject to approved budget expenditures</u> shall have the power to:

- 87 A Establish, regulate, and change from time to time the grade lines, width, and construction 88 materials of any sidewalk or part thereof on City property along any public way or part 89 thereof.

- 92 C. Require that the owners of any property abutting on a sidewalk keep the sidewalk clear of all ice, snow, and other obstructions.

If, after due notice, the owner fails to comply with the order within a reasonable time, the City may do the work, and the expense shall be a lien on the property and shall be collectible in the same manner as are town taxes or by suit at law.

§97-7 Application for certificate of appropriateness of Commission Review

B. (5) Special considerations.

 (a) If an application is submitted for construction, reconstruction, or alteration affecting a site or the exterior of a structure or for the moving or demolition of a structure, the preservation of which the Commission considers to be of unusual importance to the City of Havre de Grace or of unusual importance to the state or the nation, the Commission shall attempt to formulate an economically feasible plan with the owner(s) of the site or structure for the preservation of the site or structure. Unless the Commission is satisfied that the proposed construction, alteration, or reconstruction will not materially impair the historic or architectural significance of the site or structure, the Commission shall reject the application, filing a copy of its rejection with the Director of [Economic Development and] Planning [of the City of Havre de Grace].

C. Commission decision. The Commission shall file with the Director of **[Economic Development and]** Planning **[of the City of Havre de Grace]** a certificate of appropriateness certifying its approval, modification, or rejection of each application and plans submitted to it for review. Work shall not be commenced on any project until such a certificate of approval has been filed, and the Director of **[Economic Development and]** Planning shall not issue a building permit

or historic work permit for such change or construction unless it has received such a certificate of appropriateness. The failure of the Commission to act upon a completed application within 45 days from the date the completed application was filed shall be deemed to constitute automatic approval of the proposed changes unless an extension of this forty-five-day period is agreed upon mutually by the applicant and the Commission or the application has been withdrawn.

§97-8 Demolition by neglect.

A. In the event of demolition by neglect, the Commission may request the Director of [Economic Development and] Planning to notify, in writing, the property owner of record, any person having a right, title, or interest therein, and the occupant or other person responsible for the maintenance of the property, of the deterioration. The notice shall specify the minimum items of repair or maintenance necessary to correct the deterioration or prevent further deterioration.

B. Prior to the issuance of a written notice, the Commission may request the Director of [Economic Development and] Planning to establish a record of demolition by neglect. Such record may include dated materials such as photographs and written reports of the condition of the property so as to record or measure the deterioration.

D. If, after the public hearing, the Commission determines that the corrective actions remain necessary, the Commission may request the Director of **[Economic Development and]** Planning to issue a second and final notice to the property owner or other responsible person to have corrective action taken to comply with the Commission's determination within 30 days of the receipt of the final notice.

E. Upon failure, neglect, or refusal of the property owner or other responsible person, duly notified to take corrective action specified in the final notice within the time required, the Commission may request that the Director of [Economic Development and] Planning institute any of the remedies and penalties provided by law for such violations.

 §97-10 Appeals

In the event that any party is aggrieved by a decision of the Commission, the party has the right of appeal to the Board of Appeals of the City of Havre de Grace, in accordance with the terms of Article [III] IV, Board of Appeals, of Chapter 25, Boards, Committees and Commissions, of the Code of the City of Havre de Grace, within 30 days from the date of the Commission's decision.

RE: Proposed Budget Amendment 2024-02

Since fiscal year 2018, the City has spent over \$5,800,000 in developing its shoreline to protect the Chesapeake Bay from storm water runoff. Most of the funding for these projects has come from State and County grants. The City has received numerous recognitions from the State for establishing natural filtration methods using indigenous plant species that are both effective and beautiful.

These living shoreline projects will require annual maintenance to maintain their effectiveness and there is no provision for maintenance in the fiscal year 2024 budget. Preliminary estimates are that the City will need to invest \$120,000 during the year to maintain the shoreline.

The City currently has \$163,600 in additional funds remaining from fiscal year 2023 that have not been obligated. These funds resulted from unanticipated additional tax payments from the Comptroller's Office, primarily income taxes and admissions and amusement taxes. I am therefore requesting that we obligate \$120,000 of these funds in order to maintain our living shoreline.

Due to recent events, I believe Budget Amendment 2024-02, Ordinance 1123 needs to be amended.

The City originally requested \$120,000 in order to maintain our living shoreline. Responses to our request for proposals, however, have come in at \$142,000, an increase of \$22,000. This was our initial attempt at shoreline maintenance contracts and I attribute the increase amounts to a combination of inflation and our inexperience with this type of work.

Additionally, the City has identified an additional \$46,700 in fiscal 2023 expenses since we proposed the amendment, reducing the carryover funds available to \$116,900. The remaining funding, totaling \$25,100, will have to come from greater than anticipated property tax revenues. The initial billing for fiscal 2024 was \$260,000 greater than budgeted under the constant yield as mandated by the State.

Approval of Minutes

City Council Meeting Minutes – CM Jones moved to approve the Council Meeting minutes of September 5, 2023. Second by CM Schneegas. Motion carried 5-0.

Comments from Citizens

John Giganti, 127 Joe Hill Drive, Havre de Grace, spoke on a recommendation from the Street Traffic & Safety Advisory Board regarding the traffic pattern at Grace Manor and Joe Hill Drive. He appreciated the clarification he received before the meeting and will communicate the clarification to the community to end the rumors. Mayor Martin and CP Ringsaker spoke on the issue.

Debbie Quinn, 217-A Seneca Way, Havre de Grace, had questions about the Green Street pier. Mayor Martin commented that they are looking if there is somewhere else we can move the pier, and Director Johnson explained the federal grant is specific for that location and there were two other projects tied to the grant - the electric shuttle and foot bridge at Swan Harbor and she gave information on the grant criteria and the results if the pier isn't built at Green Street. We are currently waiting for a permit from the state for the pier. Mayor Martin explained why Green Street was chosen for the pier location. Ms. Quinn distributed pictures of the area with the sea grass.

Havre de Grace High School Homecoming Parade, October 27, 2023, 5:00 p.m., 5:30 p.m., Congress Avenue from Hutchins Park to Juniata Street. A motion to approve was made by CP Ringsaker. Second by CM Schneegas. CP Ringsaker encouraged the council members to participate. Motion carried 5-0.

Directors Report

Chris Ricci, Deputy Director of Administration: Dr. Ricci reported in the absence of Mr. Gamatoria. He attended the Almost Queen concert – kudos to Bambi Johnson and her team. He expressed his gratitude to the ambassador team that drives our trolleys – they are a fantastic group of people. Thanked Tammy Brinkman and Adam Rybczynski for their assistance while Steve Gamatoria is out of the office. Planning is beginning for the Christmas season – it takes a bit of planning and an extremely dedicated team of City employees and volunteers; he has been in personal contact with the Big Man at the North Pole and he is very much looking forward to spending Holly Jolly Fridays in Havre de Grace and said, "Ho, Ho, Ho".

Tim Bourcier, Director of Planning: Mr. Bourcier reported we are the recipient of two grant awards through the Maryland Department of Transportation for the Kim Lamphier Bikeways Network Program for a total of \$212,000 and with contributions to the City, there will be \$265,000 of investments into bikeways for the City. Most of the \$200,000 will be direct investment into striping bike lanes and \$65,000 will be to study our problematic areas.

Bridgette Johnson, Director of Economic Development & Tourism: Ms. Johnson reported the quarterly newsletter will go out September 28. Maryland Economic Development Week is October 23-27 – we are working with HdG Chamber of Commerce to plan events – the itinerary will be shared with the Mayor and Council, so hopefully they can attend some of the events. On October 16, Christine McPherson and Bridgette Johnson will participate on a Maryland Municipal League panel in College Park to discuss Main Street programs – we are the third oldest Main Street program in the state. She attended the Merchants Meeting and introduced our new Main Street Manager/Tourism Coordinator, Pam Sickenberger. The RFP for the foot bridge at Swan Harbor was released September 14; four companies have applied to date. They are in various stages of completing grant

applications. The City was in the news for the Public Art Trolley Tour on September 14 to kick off the Arts Across Harford; the trolley driver ambassadors, Vicki and Bruce, were thanked as well as Bill Watson for giving the tour, and Pam and Lauri Orzewicz for the planning and implementation – we hope to offer it again next year - the self-guided public art walking tour is on our website. A press release came out regarding the Department of Housing & Community Development approving our expansion of the Main Street area along Market Street to Girard Street—this opens the businesses up to receive grants such as the Façade and Tenant Fit-out grant. A press release came out regarding the receipt of a \$25,000 grant that goes towards the Main Street Manager's salary and other projects and events within the Main Street district. People were encouraged to follow us on social media and Explore Havre de Grace for information on all upcoming events.

George DeHority, Director of Finance: Mr. DeHority thanked Council for approving the budget amendments on first reading. He reported on the current financial condition of General Fund 1, Water/Sewer Fund 9, and Marina Fund 8. The General Fund 1 balance is \$10,937,800, which is \$42,100 above budget. The Water/Sewer Fund 9 balance is \$1,762,700, which \$232,800 above budget. The Marina Fund 8 balance is \$522,400, which is \$40,600 above budget.

EJ Millisor, Director of Public Works: Mr. Millisor thanked the Administration and Council for the living shoreline maintenance ordinance and the automation of the Rt. 40 meter vault ordinance. The Rt. 155 waterline project is out for RFP. There is a tentative meeting with Sion Hill to go over the different phases of construction and review their utility plans. The new sewer line project in the 800 block of Ontario is completed. Jeff Keithley and Mike Rimel were thanked for helping to install the new hydrant locking systems and monitoring the existing hydrants to help cut down on unmetered water loss – also thanked George DeHority and the Finance team for assisting with issuing the fines to unauthorized users, which helped pay for the new hydrant locking systems.

Chief Teresa Walter, Havre de Grace Police Department: Chief Walter reminded folks this weekend is busy due to the Susquehanna River Running Festival – roads will be closing at 8 a.m. with all races done by noon, the Wine & Seafood Festival starts at noon, and the Farmers Market – pay attention to barricades and road closures. Chief Walter complimented Capt. Alton again - WBAL did a segment on Capt. Alton's Do Good Heroes Award nomination for his work with Special Olympics and CNN did a three-minute story on Capt. Alton and the City. Go O's!

Business from Mayor Martin

Mayor Martin commented it has been an amazing couple weekends. The City was a participant in the Lighted Boat Parade with the City's workboat - we weren't qualified to enter the contest, but it was a lot of fun; there were 18 boats in the parade. In the last two weekends we had the Farmers Market, Children's Art Festival, the Waterfront Festival with fireworks, the Pyrex & Vintage Fest, Dune Buggy Show, and a wonderful concert at the STAR Centre – Almost Queen, which was the first band we invited to play at the STAR Centre last year, we were about 100 tickets shy of selling out this year. Delegates Andre Johnson and Steve Johnson, along with Senator Mary-Dulany James attended to be honored for the funds they acquired for HdG - we are very appreciative of the help. We want to sell the STAR Centre as a regional draw. Bambi Johnson, Barbara Hartzell, Bob Denton, Kiley Earnest, and Jimmy Burrill worked very hard to pull off the Waterfront Festival and the concerts - over 500 people attended the Taylor Swift cover act. The Mayor is proud of our trolleys and our ambassadors; for the 10 days in the month of September, there were 2,500 riders, 1,309 miles, and no incidents. Tickets are available for the Wine & Seafood Festival, which is September 23 at Concord Point Park – this isn't a City event.

Business from Council

Council Member Robertson: CM Robertson reported that the Economic Development Advisory Board meets September 20 at 4 p.m. in the Council Chambers. The American Legion Crab Feast is October 29 from 1-4 p.m. in their pavilion - tickets are available and will be available at the door. The Veterans Day Parade will be November 11 – they will submit the special event application soon.

Council Member Boker: CM Boker wished a happy birthday to former Council President Dave Glenn. He and CM Schneegas attended the Underground Railroad exhibit at the Maritime Museum, also in attendance was County Executive Cassilly to give a proclamation – it is an upscale exhibit. Bridgette Johnson was congratulated for the approval by Maryland DHCD to extend the Main Street area. Bambi Johnson and her small team at the STAR Centre were recognized for the incredible show of Almost Queen. The Masonic Golf Tournament will be October 6 at Furnace Bay with funds used for Masonic Charities in HdG. DPW was thanked for all the work they did for all the recent events. The Susquehanna Hose Company was thanked for keeping us safe at night, our Police Department and first responders for doing an excellent job. Hat's off again to Capt. Joe Alton.

Council Member Jones: CM Jones wished everyone a Happy Hispanic Heritage Month, which is September 15-October 15. The Fall Harvest Festival at Steppingstone Museum is September 24. The Civil Rights Bus Tour, sponsored by Harford Community College and Harford County NAACP, is October 21 from 9 a.m.-12 pm., the bus will leave from HCC and tour HdG, Bel Air, and Aberdeen – tickets are available online.

Council Member Boyer: CM Boyer was not in attendance.

Council Member Schneegas: CM Schneegas thanked Tim Bourcier for acquiring the bikeways grant. DPW and team were thanked for completing Ontario Street – the community worked together to make it work. The Chief and Police Department and DPW were thanked for the smooth operation of the Susquehanna River Running Festival. Everyone was encouraged to attend the 60th HdG Art Show on September 30, 10 a.m.-5 p.m. at Tydings Memorial Park and Concord Point Park. Well wishes were extended to the traveling team to Mumbles, Wales and she looks forward to hearing about their trip. She thanked everyone for the opportunity to serve on the Council and the encouragement she gets from the community, fellow Council members, and the Administration team.

Council President Ringsaker: CP Ringsaker reported the HdG High School Football played Patterson Mill, but was canceled for lightening and then they had to forfeit because they couldn't reschedule, they beat Aberdeen 13-10 last Thursday; they play Fallston Friday at Fallston. The Meyers Manx Dune Buggy Show at Concord Point Park had over 50 dune buggies from all over the country. Scout Troop 965 will be picking up trash along Rt. 155 on Saturday for the Adopt a Highway program. CM Boker was thanked for mentioning the Golf Tournament where CP Ringsaker will be volunteering as the beer cart girl and hopes to exceed the \$1,200 he raised last year for Masonic Charities.

- NOW, THEREFORE, it is determined, decided, and resolved by the City Council that the foregoing is hereby approved.
- 1. Section 18 C. of the City Charter is to be amended as follows, with the words underscored to be added and the words in bold and brackets to be deleted.

C. The Mayor, with the approval of the City Council, shall appoint or hire a Director of Administration, Chief of Police, Director of Public Works, Director of Economic Development and Tourism, Director of Planning, Director of Finance and a City Attorney and such other officers as the Charter, resolutions or ordinances of the City may provide. The Mayor, after a hearing to consider charges of neglect or a violation of duties of office, shall have the power to remove officers, with the approval of the City Council and shall appoint others in their stead, subject to the City Council approval. The Mayor shall receive an annual salary as set forth from time to time by an ordinance passed by the City Council in the regular course of business. Any proposed change to the Mayor's salary requires voter approval at a regular City election and is effective at the beginning of the next fiscal year.

2. Section 83 of the City Charter is to be amended as follows, with the words underscored to be added and the words in bold and brackets to be deleted.

Section 83 Department of Economic Development and Tourism; Director of Economic Development and Tourism

The Mayor and City Council of Havre de Grace, Maryland shall establish a Department of Economic Development and Tourism. The Mayor, with the approval of the City Council, in accordance with this charter, shall hire a Director of Economic Development and Tourism. The Director shall reside at a location such that the Director is continually available to meet the needs of the position in a timely manner. The employment of the Director of Economic Development and Tourism shall begin as of the day of Council approval and such position shall be held until removal from office pursuant to this Charter, or upon resignation or death, and the Mayor, with the approval of the City Council, shall fill such vacancy.

3. Section 84 of the City Charter is to be amended as follows, with the words underscored to be added and the words in bold and brackets to be deleted.

Section 84 Director of Economic Development and Tourism; powers and duties

The Director of Economic Development <u>and Tourism</u> under the direction of the Mayor shall be responsible for:

A. All matters related to the advancement or promotion of economic development <u>and tourism</u> in the City;

B. Maintaining liaisons with state and county elected officials and agencies involved with economic development <u>and tourism</u> activities and any related federal officials or agencies, including but not limited to contacts with Aberdeen Proving Ground;

PUBLIC NUISANCE

A premises constitutes a public nuisance where:

A. Criminal violations have occurred on, or emanated from, the premises, including any portion of the laws governing controlled dangerous substances, firearms, stolen property, prostitution, gambling, disorderly conduct, or any other violation of laws, including state, county, or City ordinances, constituting an unreasonable interference with a right common to the general public involving a significant interference with the public health, the public safety, the public peace, the public comfort or the public convenience; and

B. Violations of such laws have occurred, on or emanating from the premises, on two or more occasions within a twenty-four-month period of time prior to the commencement of a proceeding pursuant to §§ 120-3 through 120-6 of this chapter, which have resulted in two or more criminal convictions.

C. Graffiti has been placed on the premises at a location visible from a public right of way or from a neighboring property and has not been abated within ten (10) days from the date of a notice of removal of the graffiti issued by the City.

REMOVAL

With respect to a notice, citation or an order of abatement for "removal" of graffiti issued by City Code enforcement, City police department, or a Court of competent jurisdiction, "removal" means, where practicable, the painting over or washing off of graffiti to restore the affected property to a condition substantially similar to the condition of the property before the application of the graffiti. Where painting or washing would fail to restore the property to its original condition, such as non-water-soluble media on an otherwise unpainted brick wall, removal shall mean removal by chemical or mechanical means. Removal also means, in cases of deep etching into the property or other situations where property cannot reasonably be restored by other means to a condition substantially similar to what it was before the application of the graffiti, replacement of the damaged property.

§ 120-2. Obligations of owners.

A. Every premises owner within the City of Havre de Grace is responsible for monitoring his or her premises and is required to take timely and appropriate action to prevent and eliminate or remove a public nuisance from existing thereon, whether that public nuisance is created by existing physical conditions or by nuisance-creating behaviors and regardless of whether the public nuisance is created by or at the direction of the premises owner or by a third party.

B. Every premises owner within the City of Havre de Grace is presumed to have constructive knowledge of the facts that can be discovered by a reasonable inquiry concerning the condition of his or her premises and activities taking place on his or her premises. Every owner is required to manage and control his or her premises, tenants, and other occupants in a manner so as not to create or allow a public nuisance, or to create or allow his or her premises, tenants, or other occupants to have an adverse impact on adjoining properties or the neighborhood, or to violate the provisions of this chapter. Every owner shall remain liable

- for violations of this chapter occurring on or emanating from his or her premises regardless of any contract or agreement with any party regarding the premises.
- 126 C. Limitations and restrictions on scope of abatement authority. If the premises consist entirely
 127 of residential units or mixed residential and other use units, and the public nuisance has
 128 occurred solely within one or more units, abatement authority under this chapter is restricted

- A. Notice: Cease and desist order. Upon a finding by the Chief of Police, or their designee, through a visual inspection of the property, or pursuant to a citizen complaint, or if it involves a public nuisance based on behaviors taking place at the premises, through proof of certified court records, that two convictions have occurred under the circumstances described under Subsection B of the definition of "public nuisance" in § 120-1 of this chapter, the Chief of Police shall prepare a written notice, directed to the owner, setting forth the following:
 - (1) A description of the proof, using photographs of graffiti, eyewitness statements, anonymous citizen complaints, and if related to a public nuisance defined under 120-1(b) of the "public nuisance" definition of this Chapter, [demonstrating] documentation that two convictions have occurred under the circumstances described therein; [under Subsection B of the definition of "public nuisance" in § 120-1 and the violation(s) of this chapter being charged;] and
 - (2) A [An] notice and cease and desist order requiring the owner to abate the nuisance in or on the premises where the public nuisance exists, within 30 days following the service of the notice, by removing, discontinuing, ceasing, and desisting the public nuisance and the behavior, activities, and other circumstances giving rise to the public nuisance.
 - (3) The **[order]** notice issued pursuant to this subsection shall be immediately posted on the premises and served on the owner as provided in § 120-3D.
- B. Additional orders. In the event the behavior, activities, and other circumstances giving rise to the public nuisance have not been removed or discontinued within the thirty-day period provided in § 120-3A(2) above, the Chief of Police or their designee shall file a written report with the Mayor of the City of Havre de Grace with a statement as the level of potential harm to the health, safety and welfare to the community if the public nuisance is not abated immediately. The Mayor, after consulting with the Chief of Police and the City Attorney, shall decide whether to issue an emergency Executive Order, prosecute the matter criminally, issue a civil citation, or seek an order for abatement from a court of competent jurisdiction. § 120-4. Conduct of hearings; evidentiary matters.

A. All contested hearings held under this chapter shall be held in City Hall and shall be open to the public. A record of such hearings shall be kept by typed transcript or transcribeable audiotape. The presiding officer may postpone or continue the hearing if the interests of justice so require.

B. An independent individual designated by the Mayor shall serve as presiding officer, who shall apply the law and determine the facts. The existence of the public nuisance shall be proved by a preponderance of the evidence.

C. The following evidentiary rules apply to all contested hearings held under this chapter:

(1) In general. Each party in a contested case shall offer all of the evidence that the party wishes to have made part of the record.

(2) Probative evidence. The presiding officer may admit probative evidence that reasonable and prudent individuals commonly accept in the conduct of their affairs and give probative effect to that evidence.

(a) It shall be prima facie evidence that a public nuisance exists on a premises upon the second conviction for a violation of any of the provisions of the laws governing the offenses enumerated in, and under the circumstances [described in,] defined as a "public nuisance" under § 120-1A [(6)] and B above, or if graffiti exists and has not been removed within ten days of receiving public notice. Convictions may be proved by certified or true test copies of court records.

(b) Evidence of the general reputation of the premises is admissible to corroborate testimony based on personal knowledge or observation, or evidence seized during

- the execution of a search and seizure warrant, but shall not, in and of itself, be sufficient to establish the existence of a public nuisance under this subsection.
 - (c) Evidence that the public nuisance had been discontinued at the time of the filing of the notice under § 120-3C or at the time of the hearing does not bar the imposition of appropriate relief, including imposition of fines for each instance of public nuisance.
 - (d) The existence of a public nuisance may be established, and appropriate relief ordered under this chapter, without proof that an owner had actual knowledge of the existence of the facts constituting the public nuisance prior to the issuance of the notice and cease and desist order, or that the owner acquiesced or participated therein.
 - (3) Hearsay. Evidence may not be excluded solely on the basis that it is hearsay.
 - (4) Exclusions. The presiding officer may exclude evidence that is incompetent, irrelevant, immaterial, unduly repetitious, or governed by a privilege recognized by law.
 - (5) Scope of evidence. On any genuinely contested material issue, each party is entitled to call witnesses, offer evidence, including rebuttal evidence, cross-examine any witness that another party calls, present summation, and argument.
 - (6) Documentary evidence. The presiding officer may receive documentary evidence in the form of copies or excerpts.
 - (7) Sequestration of witnesses. The presiding officer shall have the power to sequester witnesses at the request of any party to the proceeding.
 - (8) Compulsory attendance of witnesses. If in the event it becomes necessary in the interests of justice that a material witness be required to attend the hearing by subpoena, the presiding officer may postpone or continue the hearing if the interest of justice so require to allow the party a reasonable time to obtain the attendance of such witness through any proper available legal channels.

§ 120-5. Findings and enforcement.

- A. Following the conclusion of the hearing, the presiding officer shall promptly render a decision and the reasons therefor. The presiding officer shall immediately notify all parties to the proceeding of the decision, including the Mayor and the Chief of Police. The decision shall be made orally at the conclusion of the hearing and transcribed as part of the record. The presiding officer may also issue the reasons articulated for the decision in written form within no more than 10 days following the conclusion of the hearing.
- B. No public nuisance established. If the presiding officer finds that the existence of a public nuisance has not been established by a preponderance of the evidence at the hearing, the proceeding shall be closed.
- C. Public nuisance established. If the presiding officer finds that the existence of a public nuisance
 has been established by a preponderance of the evidence at the hearing, an order of [the Mayor

shall be issued providing for the abatement of the public nuisance shall be issued by the hearing examiner, which shall be posted on the premises and given to those persons listed, and in the manner set forth, in § 120-3D of this chapter. On and after the 10th business day following the posting, [and upon the written directive of the Mayor,] the order may be enforced by the Chief of Police or their designee.

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D. Closing order. If the order directs the closing of the premises, such closing shall be for such period and to the extent necessary to abate the public nuisance [as the Mayor reasonably may direct, but in no event shall the closing be for a period of more than one year from the date of the closing. Prior to such closing, the premises shall be inspected by the City Code Inspector and a written inventory made of the contents of the premises. The proper representatives of the City may enter the premises during the closing to inspect the premises.

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E. Owner's continuing obligations during closing. During the closing, the owner of the premises shall be required to maintain the premises in accordance with all City Codes, keep the premises safe and orderly, and secure, and continue to keep and maintain all insurance on the premises in effect prior to the cease and desist order with proof of such insurance to be provided to the City Director of Administration.

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F. Banishment option for elderly and disabled persons. If the [presiding] hearing officer finds that the owner of the premises, due to age or disability, is without actual knowledge of the existence of the public nuisance on the premises, such owner may obtain a stay of the closing order by causing the public nuisance to be permanently abated by causing the person or persons who are or were responsible for maintaining the public nuisance on the owner's premises to permanently leave and not return to the premises. By so doing, the owner shall be deemed to consent to allow the proper representatives of the City to enter the premises and to inspect the premises during reasonable hours and upon prior notice. If the public nuisance is abated to the reasonable satisfaction of the Chief of Police for a period of one (1) year, the closing order [proceeding] shall automatically terminate. [be closed.]

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G. Nature of closing. A closing directed pursuant to this chapter is not an act of possession, ownership, or control by the City of Havre de Grace.

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H. Use and occupancy permit. [Prior to the termination] After the termination of a closing order, the owner of the premises shall apply for and obtain an applicable use and occupancy permit from the City before the premises may be occupied.

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§ 120-6. Vacating order to close.

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The [Chief of Police] hearing officer may [shall] vacate the closing provisions of the order if an 337 338 interested person:

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A. Posts a bond for the period of the ordered closing in an amount of the full assessed value of 340 the premises as shown in the tax assessment records of the Maryland State Department of 341 Assessments and Taxation, prorated for the proportional assessment of units closed if less than 342 all units therein are closed, but not to exceed \$1,000,000 in any case; and 343

B. Submits adequate proof sufficient in the judgment and discretion of the [Chief of Police] hearing officer that the behavior, activities, and other circumstances giving rise to the public nuisance have been discontinued and will not be maintained or permitted in any unit of the premises during the period of the ordered closing.

§ 120-7. Notice to owners and tenants.

Prior to the effective date of this chapter, the Mayor and City Council of Havre de Grace shall prepare a written notice outlining the provisions of this chapter. Such notices shall be contained on the City's Web site, distributed to all property owners in the City, and a reasonable number of copies shall be made available for free to the public at City Hall, the City Police Station, the public library, and disseminated through the media.

§ 120-8. Rules and regulations.

Prior to the effective date of this chapter, the [Chief of Police] the Director of Administration or their designee shall promulgate procedures, rules, and regulations that may be necessary or proper to effectuate the purpose and the provisions of this chapter, including reasonable means of advising premises owners or their agents of any first or second arrest or conviction for the criminal conduct defined in § 120-1 of this chapter occurring in those premises which the [Chief of Police] Director of Administration determines will or may be subject to this chapter, and the procedures and terms for the posting of bonds.

§ 120-9. Judicial review.

Any person aggrieved by any final decision made pursuant to this chapter, has the right of appeal to the Circuit Court for Harford County as may be provided by law for appeals from municipal administrative actions.

§ 120-10. Prohibited conduct; penalties.

A. Destruction, etc., of posted order. Any person who intentionally destroys, removes, or defaces an order posted by the [Chief of Police] <u>City under authority of this Chapter 120</u>, shall upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$300 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both.

B. Failure to obey order.

(1) Any person: (i) who intentionally disobeys any proper order issued [by the Chief of Police or his designee] under this chapter; or (ii) who uses or occupies or permits any other person to use or occupy any premises ordered closed [pursuant to proceedings under this chapter], shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.

(2) Each day a violation of this subsection occurs or continues is a separate offense.

C. Imprisonment in default of fine and costs. Imprisonment in default of fine and costs shall be regulated by the provisions of Article 38, Section 4 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as the same may be amended from time to time.

10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, the City is the owner of certain real property, including the associated pier, pilings, moorings, and riparian rights, and other related improvements located within Hutchins Park and along the shoreline at the foot of Congress Avenue in the City, as more particularly described herein ("Pier"); and					
14 15 16	WHEREAS, the Lessee is the owner and operator of a historic skipjack sailboat named MARTHA LEWIS ("Boat") and wants to dock the Boat at the Pier where it will be used for commercial purposes; and

- 1. Any improvements to the Pier must be approved in writing by the Marina Manager and the Planning Department.
- 2. Any improvements necessary will be paid in full by the Lessee.
- 3. Any improvements required will be completed by a contractor approved by the Marina Manager.
 - a) Submittal of a design will be required, to include all specifications, maintenance requirements and estimated costs.
 - b) Upon termination of this agreement for any reason, the City will decide whether to keep the improvements or require the Lessee to remove and properly dispose of the improvement (s).
- G. Prior to mooring the vessel in the City owned slip, the Lessee must provide the City of Havre de Grace the following documentation: (a) a Certificate of Good Standing from the State of Maryland; (b) Current Maryland Boaters Registration and Title (See Section 13); (c) Current Insurance Certificate (See Section 9); (d) US Coast Guard Vessel Certification; and (e) a captain's license if required by the State or other regulatory authority.
- 4. INDEMNITY. The Lessee shall indemnify and save harmless the City and its employees and agents from all claims and demands suits, actions, loss, damages, recoveries, judgments, costs or expenses in any injury, death, loss or damage related to the Lessee's use of City property or breach of this Lease Agreement.
- 5. RESTORATION. The Lessee is responsible for all costs or expenses to restore the City's property after termination of the use under this Lease.
- 6. MAINTENANCE. The Lessee shall maintain any facility or object in, above, or on the City's property and related to the use in a manner that is clean, workmanlike, in good repair and safe.
- 7. PERMITTED USE. The temporary permitted use allowed by this Lease is the following: the docking, maintenance and operation of the Boat, only at or about the dock located at Hutchins Park, which does not interfere with the docking, mooring, or operation of emergency vehicles.

- 8. BOAT MAINTENANCE. No heavy boat maintenance, such as major engine repair, shall be permitted at the Pier. The City reserves the right in its sole discretion to determine what type of maintenance and repair shall be permitted.
 - 9. INSURANCE. Lessee shall keep in full force and effect and provide to the City insurance policies and certificates, which provide protection and indemnity coverage of no less than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) for personal injury and for property damage to the City Pier. The City shall appear as an additional insured on any policy of insurance for your operations. The Lessee shall also provide proof of workers' compensation coverage. Failure to maintain insurance as set forth herein will result in immediate termination of this Lease.
 - 10. SPECIAL EVENTS AND PROMOTIONS. The Lessee agrees to cooperate with promotional and special events that may occur throughout the City, including those that occur in or near Hutchins Park. For special events in the City, additional landing sites may be permitted but only with prior written permission of the City. Lessee agrees to permit the City to photograph or otherwise produce a likeness of the Boat for publication or promotional purposes and shall permit the erection of signs and other promotional displays on or near the Pier promoting seasonal events authorized by the City.
- 11. UTILITIES. Lessee will not be responsible for utilities for the 2023-2024 calendar years. In the event the City receives utility bills that are unreasonably high, the City may, without notice, temporarily shut off utilities as may be necessary to access the need for repairs and/or use.
- 12. PARKING. This Lease does not include any parking areas as a matter of right. The privilege granted to the Lessee's patrons to use City parking lots is solely as an accommodation to the Lessee, and may be restricted by the City at any time without notice.
- 13. BOAT TITLE. As a condition of this Agreement, Lessee shall provide the City with proof of title and length of Boat. Failure to provide proof of title will result in immediate termination of this Lease.
- 14. CONDITION OF DOCKING AND ADJACENT FACILITIES. Lessee acknowledges that it has inspected the Pier and adjacent facilities and is satisfied that the Pier is adequate for safe mooring of the boat. The Lessee is accepting the Pier in "as is" condition. The City shall designate the location of loading ramps. Lessee shall not alter the Pier or bulkhead without written permission of the City.

15. RESPONSIBILITIES REGARDING SAFETY AND DAMAGE.

A. This contract is not a bailment of the Boat but a Lease to use City dock space. Such space is used at the sole risk to the Lessee and no additional responsibilities are assumed by the City by entering into this Agreement. The City shall not be liable for the care of the protection of the Boat, including the gear, equipment, and contents, or for any loss or damage of whatever kind or matter to the Boat, contents, gear or equipment. The City shall make available temporary dockage inside the City Yacht Basin during significant impending weather events, such as extreme dam releases where 16 gates or more will be opened; high wind conditions that are greater than 60 mph sustained.

- B Lessee represents and warrants that the Boat is in a seaworthy condition and will be maintained in a seaworthy condition at all times while the Boat is kept at the Pier. Should the City discover the Boat is in peril, Lessee agrees to pay to the City as an additional dock fee, all charges for labor and materials incurred or expenses paid by the City for the Boat in connection with correcting this situation, provided however, the City has no obligation to render aid or assistance of the Boat under any circumstances.
- C. Upon execution of this Lease, the Lessee shall provide the City with the phone number for the Lessee and the Lessee's designated agent for contact in the event of emergencies.
- D. The City is not responsible for losses or damages to the Boat in any way. The Lessee is fully responsible for protection of the Boat from hurricanes, high water, winds, and other natural occurrences. The Lessee is fully responsible for damage to structures, pilings docks, piers, or moorings and any and all other property or persona at the Pier. In the event of an emergency, the City reserves the right but not the obligation to move the Boat to other mooring places. It is expected that if Lessee keeps its Boat at the Pier during the hurricane season, Lessee will have made arrangements for the safe mooring of the Boat on the approach of a storm. In the event of a tropical storm or hurricane, the City reserves the right, but not the obligation to evacuate the Boat at the Lessee's expense and risk.
- E. The City reserves the right, but not the obligation, to expend funds to repair items of loss or damage for which the Lessee remains responsible under this Agreement, and shall be entitled to full reimbursement from the Lessee.
 - 16. TAXES. Lessee agrees to pay when due all appropriate federal, state and taxes, including the admissions and amusement tax, if applicable.
 - 17. LIEN. The City shall have the right to assert a lien against the Boat in the event of a failure to pay the Dock Fee should one become due, or any applicable City taxes when due. In addition, to the extent the City has incurred any expenses under this Agreement which have not been reimbursed by Lessee the City has a right to assert a lien against the Boat for such amounts not reimbursed.
- 145 18. DEFAULT. Upon the Lessee's failure to comply with this Agreement, the City shall have the right to terminate the Lease immediately.
 - 19. RIGHT TO RE-ENTER. Upon a Lessee's failure to pay the Dock Fee, or rectify a dangerous condition, or upon failure to repair damage to the Pier caused by Lessee or the Boat, the City reserves the right to lawfully re-enter the Pier and take possession by removing the Boat from the Pier. Lessee shall be responsible for all costs incurred in such removal and City reserves the right to assert a lien in the event such costs are unpaid.
 - 20. ENTIRE AGREEMENT; AMENDMENT. It is understood and agreed by the parties that this Lease shall constitute the entire agreement between them with respect to the Pier and businesses conducted in conjunction therewith and no verbal statements extrinsic to this Lease shall have any force or effect. No amendment or modification of the terms of this Lease shall be effective until duly approved by the City by resolution at a City Council meeting.

- 158 21. WAIVER. The Lessee agrees that the City's failure to enforce any of the terms herein shall not constitute a waiver.
- 160 22. TIME. Time is of the essence.
- 161 23. VENUE, JURISDICITON, CHOICE OF LAW. This is a Maryland contract and the Courts of Harford County are the sole venue of any dispute. The laws of Maryland shall apply.
- 24. SEVERABILITY. If any portion of this Lease shall be declared invalid, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Lease shall continue in full force and effect.
- 166 25. CONDITIONS: The City agrees to the following conditions:
- A. Sign Board, Feather Flags, Kiosk and Rack Cards The Lessee may include a temporary "sandwich board" or "feather sign" type signage at the intersection of Market Street and Congress Avenue. - B. Rack cards are welcome and may be placed at City Hall and the Visitors Center.

- E. Security Cameras The City has no immediate plans to install security cameras in Hutchins Park. Should the Lessee desire to install security cameras, the Lessee shall approach the Director of Administration with a Security Camera location and installation plan.
- F. Access to Special Events at Hutchins Park The City will make EVERY effort to insure the MARTHA LEWIS has total and complete access to the dock during any event. As discussed, issues arose during those times when events at Hutchins Park were not hosted by the City. Both the City and the Lessee will need to coordinate during those dates; one possible solution could be the distribution of an electronic ticket or paper ticket the Martha Lewis patron could display during such events.
- 188 G. Lighting at Dock The City will maintain adequate lighting in the area of the Hutchins Park pier.

RE: Proposed Budget Amendment 2024-02

Since fiscal year 2018, the City has spent over \$5,800,000 in developing its shoreline to protect the Chesapeake Bay from storm water runoff. Most of the funding for these projects has come from State and County grants. The City has received numerous recognitions from the State for establishing natural filtration methods using indigenous plant species that are both effective and beautiful.

These living shoreline projects will require annual maintenance to maintain their effectiveness and there is no provision for maintenance in the fiscal year 2024 budget. Preliminary estimates are that the City will need to invest \$120,000 during the year to maintain the shoreline.

The City currently has \$163,600 in additional funds remaining from fiscal year 2023 that have not been obligated. These funds resulted from unanticipated additional tax payments from the Comptroller's Office, primarily income taxes and admissions and amusement taxes. I am therefore requesting that we obligate \$120,000 of these funds in order to maintain our living shoreline.

Due to recent events, I believe Budget Amendment 2024-02, Ordinance 1123 needs to be amended.

The City originally requested \$120,000 in order to maintain our living shoreline. Responses to our request for proposals, however, have come in at \$142,000, an increase of \$22,000. This was our initial attempt at shoreline maintenance contracts and I attribute the increase amounts to a combination of inflation and our inexperience with this type of work.

Additionally, the City has identified an additional \$46,700 in fiscal 2023 expenses since we proposed the amendment, reducing the carryover funds available to \$116,900. The remaining funding, totaling \$25,100, will have to come from greater than anticipated property tax revenues. The initial billing for fiscal 2024 was \$260,000 greater than budgeted under the constant yield as mandated by the State.

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31 BE IT ORDAINED, that Chapter 31-2 is hereby repealed and replaced in its entirety as follows:

33 §31-2. Amendments.

The International Property Maintenance Code 2021 shall be adopted with the following amendments:

A. The name of the jurisdiction in the second line of Section 101.1, Title, on page 1 of the International Property Maintenance Code 2021 shall be "City of Havre de Grace, as adopted by the Mayor and City Council of Havre de Grace".

B. Section 102.3, Application of other codes, shall read: "Repairs, additions or alterations to a structure, or changes of occupancy, shall be done in accordance with the procedures and provisions of the International Building Code 2018, the International Residential Code 2018, the City of Havre de Grace Zoning Ordinance, and applicable codes of Harford County, Maryland, and the State of Maryland."

C. Section 103.1, General, shall read: "The Director of the Department of Planning, or the Director's designee, to be known as the *Code Official* is hereby designated as the administrative official in charge of the implementation and enforcement of the International Property Maintenance Code 2021."

D. Section 103.2, Appointment, shall be deleted.

E. Section 103.3, Deputies, shall be deleted.

F. Section 104.1, Fees, shall read: "The fees for activities and services performed by the Department in carrying out its responsibilities under the International Property Maintenance Code 2021 shall be based upon the valuation of staff time required to complete plan and permit examinations, site inspections and enforcement activity and shall be established by the Mayor and City Council from time to time."

G. Section 105.6, Department records, shall read: "An official record shall be kept of all business and activities of the Department specified in the provisions of the International Property Maintenance Code 2021, and all such records shall be open to public inspection at all appropriate times and according to reasonable rules to maintain the integrity, confidentiality, and security of such records."

 H. New Section 105.8, Restriction of employees, shall be added as follows: "An official or employee connected with the Department of Planning shall not be engaged in or directly or indirectly connected with the furnishing of labor, materials or appliances for the construction, alteration or maintenance of a building, or the preparation of construction documents thereof, unless that person is the owner of the building; nor shall such officer or employee engage in any work that conflicts with official duties or with the interests of the Department."

- I. Section 107.1, General, shall read: "All appeals of orders, decisions or determinations made by
 the *Code Official* shall be heard by the Board of Appeals, per Chapter 25 of the City Code."
 - J. Section 108, Board of Appeals, is to be removed.

K. Section 109.3, Prosecution of violation, shall read:

1) Any person who shall be adjudged to have (1) violated any of the provisions of this ordinance; or (2) failed to comply herewith or permitted or maintained such a violation; or (3) violated or failed to comply with any order made hereunder; or (4) built in violation of any details, statements, specifications or plans submitted or approved hereunder; or (5) failed to operate in accordance with the provisions of any certificate, permit, or approval issued hereunder shall, severally for each violation and noncompliance respectively, be guilty of a municipal infraction, for which a fine not to exceed \$1,000 may be imposed for each such infraction, payable to the City of Havre de Grace, with costs imposed in the discretion of the court. Each day that an infraction continues after notice has been served shall be deemed a separate infraction. The imposition of a fine for any violation shall not excuse the violation, nor shall the violation be permitted to continue. Prosecution or lack thereof of either the owner, occupant, or the person in charge shall not be deemed to relieve any of the others.

2) Any person who shall be convicted of willfully (1) violating any of the provisions of this ordinance; or (2) failing to comply herewith or permitting or maintaining such a violation; or (3) violating or failing to comply with any order made hereunder; or (4) building in violation of any details, statements, specifications or plans submitted or approved hereunder; or (5) failing to operate in accordance with the provisions of any certificate, permit, or approval issued hereunder shall, severally for each violation and noncompliance respectively, be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 and imprisonment not exceeding 90 days for each violation, with costs imposed in the discretion of the court. Each day that a violation continues after notice has been served shall be deemed a separate offense. The imposition of punishment for any violation shall not excuse the violation, nor shall the violation be permitted to continue. Prosecution or lack thereof of either the owner, occupant, or the person in charge shall not be deemed to relieve any of the others.

 3) Any order or notice issued or served as provided in this ordinance shall be complied with by the owner, operator, occupant or other person responsible for the condition or violation to which the order or notice pertains. Every order or notice shall set forth a time limit for compliance dependent upon the hazard and danger created by the violation. In cases of extreme danger to persons or property, immediate compliance shall be required. If the notice of violation is not complied with, the Code Official shall institute the appropriate proceeding at law or in equity to restrain, correct or abate such violation, or to require the removal or termination of the unlawful occupancy of the structure in violation of the provisions of this code or of the order or direction made pursuant thereto.

4) In addition to the other provisions set out in this ordinance, the City of Havre de Grace may institute injunctive, declaratory or any other appropriate action or proceedings at law or equity for the enforcement of this ordinance or to correct violations of the International Property Maintenance Code 2021, and any court of competent jurisdiction has the right to issue restraining orders, temporary or permanent injunctions or mandamus or other appropriate forms of remedy or relief.

5) All provisions of Section 6-102 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland relating to municipal infractions are incorporated in this chapter. In the event of any inconsistency between this Section 106.3 and Section 6-102 of the Local Government Article, the provisions in Section 6-102, shall prevail.

L. Section 109.4, Violation penalties, shall be deleted.

M. Section 109.5, Abatement of violation: Add a second sentence which shall read as follows: "Any costs associated with any action taken by the authority having jurisdiction on such premises shall be charged against the real estate upon which the structure is located and may be recovered as a lien upon such real estate. Costs shall also include City inspection fees and reasonable attorneys' fees."

N. Section 111.4.2: At the end of the section, the following exception shall be added: "Exception: Notice of violations requiring immediate attention will be conspicuously posted on the premises and allow up to five days to abate the violations. Such notice shall be used for overgrown grass and/or weeds, untagged or unregistered vehicles, trash and rubbish removal, snow removal, or other violations which require immediate attention."

O. Section 113 General shall read: "The Code Official shall order the owner, or owner's authorized agent, of any premises upon which is located any structure, which in the Code Official's judgment is so deteriorated or dilapidated or has become so out of repair as to be dangerous, unsafe, insanitary or otherwise unfit for human habitation or occupancy, and such that it is unreasonable to repair the structure, to demolish and remove such structure. If such structure is capable of being made safe by repairs, to repair and make safe and sanitary, or to board up and hold for future repair, or to demolish and remove at the owner's option. Boarding the building for future repair shall not extend beyond 180 days, unless approved by the Code Official."

P. New Section 113.1.1, Abatement of unsafe conditions, shall be added as follows: "Abatement failure by the owner of any premises upon which is located a structure posing an imminent danger to human life or the public welfare due to an unsafe condition, the Director or the Director's designee shall cause the necessary work to be done to eliminate the condition, including, but not limited to, the demolition of the structure or structures. The Director or the Director's designee shall cause to be published, for two weekly issues, in a county newspaper of record, notice setting forth the address of the building; a description of the real estate sufficient for its identification; a statement that the property is unsafe and constitutes an immediate and continuing hazard to the community; and a statement that the City intends to demolish same if the owner fails to do so. A person objecting to the proposed actions of the City may file an objection in an appropriate form in a court of competent jurisdiction. If the building is not demolished within 30 days of mailing

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notice to the owners of record, or within 30 days of the last day of publication of the notice in a county newspaper of record, whichever is later, the Director or the Director's designee shall have the power to demolish the structure or structures."

Q. New Section 113.1.2, Creation of a tax lien, shall be added as follows: "There is created a tax lien on real property for monies expended, including reasonable attorney's fees, by the City for the making safe of buildings or structures and/or abatement of other unsafe nuisances or conditions constituting a danger to the public health and safety. The amount of such lien shall be collected by the Director of Finance in the same manner as other City real estate taxes."

R. Section 110.1, Authority, shall read: "Whenever the Code Official finds any work regulated by this code, or other building codes adopted by the local jurisdiction, being performed in a manner contrary to the provisions of these codes, or in a dangerous or unsafe manner, the Code Official is authorized to issue a stop-work order."

S. Section 110.4, Failure to comply: At the end of the section remove, "established by the authority having jurisdiction" and add: "as determined by the Code Official not to exceed \$1,000."

T. Section 201.4: At the end of the section, the following language shall be added: "or as is interpreted by the Director of Planning or Code Official."

U. Section 202, General Definitions, shall have added to it these additional definitions as follows:

1) JUNK YARD. Any land or building licensed and used for abandonment, storage, keeping, collecting or baling of paper, rags, scrap metals, other scrap, discarded materials or junk for the purpose of abandonment, demolition, dismantling, storage, recycling or salvaging. Proper business licensing required.

2) OPEN STORAGE AREAS. Property areas used for storage of materials that are related to the occupation of the property owner and/or lessee.

3) SALVAGE YARDS. Property area upon which any person or business stores three or more wrecked vehicles outdoors for the purpose of dismantling or otherwise wrecking the vehicles to remove parts for sale or for use in an automotive repair or rebuilding business. Any auto salvage business must be properly licensed.

4) SURFACE COAT. All exterior siding and millwork shall be scraped to a sound base and sanded smooth. Scraped and sanded areas shall have joints and cracks filled and shall be primed with exterior primer paint. Following this preparation, all exterior siding and millwork shall be painted with two coats of exterior quality paint.

5) BICYCLES, BOAT TRAILERS, MOPEDS AND OTHER MOTOR VEHICLES. The same as the definitions provided under Title 11 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, respectively.

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6) BOATS. Every description of watercraft, including jet skis, wave-runners, or an ice boat that is used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water or ice but does not include a seaplane, canoe, kayak, sculling boat, paddle board or similar recreational equipment.

- 7) INOPERABLE. Unable to function in a manner or condition consistent with or similar to the design operation for which it was intended, regardless of modification.
- 8) NOXIOUS MATTERS. Debris, garbage, junk, noxious odors, rubbish and trash; abandoned or inoperable bicycles, boats, boat trailers, mopeds or motor vehicles; abandoned appliances, furniture or parts thereof; and/or any other matter or condition as determined to be detrimental to the adjoining properties or the public health, safety, and welfare.
- V. New Section 301.3.1, Vacant structure maintenance, shall be added as follows: "All land or improved premises within the City shall be maintained as though said property were being used or occupied. Once vacated or abandoned, the exterior of any structure and surrounding premises must be maintained to the minimum standards required by this code. Except for any structure damaged by fire, flood or natural disaster, the City shall be notified prior to any boarding of windows and doors to secure the structure. Any boarding shall be done in a professional manner, and the materials used shall conform to the overall exterior appearance of the structure. Said structure, except for historic structures as defined by the City, shall be made habitable within three months, or the structure shall be considered in an unsafe condition and subject to the provisions of this chapter. The Code Official shall have the authority to allow a structure damaged by fire, flood or any natural disaster to remain boarded and secure for a period of one year, at which such time the structure shall be made habitable or said structure shall be considered in an unsafe condition and subject to the provisions of this chapter."
- W. New Section 302.2.1, Drainage, general, shall be added as follows: "Stormwater, sump pumps, sanitary systems, and other water-supplied appliances shall not discharge in a manner that is detrimental to neighboring properties or creates a public nuisance."
- X. Section 302.3, Sidewalks and driveways: Add the following section at the end of the paragraph: "It shall be unlawful for any person, incorporated body, public institution or other corporation using or occupying in any manner, or for any purpose whatsoever, any house, store, shop, stable, or tenement of any kind, persons having charge of churches and public buildings of every description and of owners of unoccupied houses and unimproved lots, situated on any street in this City, to fail to remove and clear away, or cause to be removed and cleared away, the snow/ice from the foot pavements fronting the respective houses, stores, shops, stables, churches, buildings or lots so used, occupied or owned by them or under their charge within 24 hours after the end of any weather event resulting in snow or ice." (See City Code § 190-38.)
- Y. Section 302.4, Weeds: Add the language "10" after the words "in excess of" in the second line.
 Add the following after the third sentence: "Trees and shrubs located on private property shall not create a nuisance, shall not create a safety hazard to, and shall not impose on public safety or interfere with any structure on the subject premises or adjoining properties or public utilities. When

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any lot, lots, parcels or tracts of land abut on any public street, avenue, alley, lane, sidewalk or other public right-of-way, the owner, occupant, lessor, lessee, tenant and/or any person, firm or corporation in control of such lot, lots, parcels or tracts of land shall be required to maintain so much of the public right-of-way as lies between the curbline/surfaced edge of the right-of-way and property lines of such lots, parcels or tracts of land as are occupied by or used by such owner, occupant, lessor, lessee, tenant and/or any person, firm or corporation in control thereof. This shall include maintenance to the center line of the unimproved alley by all owners of any abutting lots, parcels or tracts of land."

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Z. Section 302.7, Accessory structures, shall read: "All accessory structures, including but not limited to detached garages, storage buildings, fences and walls, shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair. Fences and walls shall be erected such that a finished side of the structure faces outward from the property on which it is constructed."

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AA. Section 302.8, Motor vehicles, is amended by adding the following to the end of the section: "One unregistered but otherwise operative vehicle and/or trailer, not within a building, is permitted to be stored on the premises for a period not to exceed six months. The vehicle must belong to the current occupant or owner of the property. The owner or occupant must obtain a permit from the Department of Planning for the storage of the unregistered vehicle. After six months, the vehicle must be registered or removed from the premises."

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BB. New Section 302.10, Storage of junk, boats, appliances and furniture, shall be added as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any owner, occupant, lessor, lessee, tenant and/or person, firm or corporation in control of any lot, lots, parcels or tracts of land within the City to permit any junk, trash, refuse, debris, piled brush and branches, unused construction materials, garbage, or rubbish; abandoned or inoperable bicycles, boats, boat trailers, mopeds, motor vehicle parts, i.e., batteries, tires, fenders, rims, etc., or abandoned appliances, equipment, or furniture to remain on any such lot, lots, parcels or tracts of land where the Department of Planning determines that such materials or items are dangerous, detrimental or cause a nuisance to the adjoining properties or the public health and safety and welfare of the City or are the nesting place for vermin. In the case of a boat, it must have a current registration; be situated upon a boat trailer that also has a current registration and is in operational condition. No boat(s) shall be stored on private property that has a hull registration size of 30 feet or greater without first obtaining a permit from the City. All permits for storage of boats 30 feet or greater shall be made, in writing, to the City's Director of Planning with a copy sent to the Director of Administration and Council President. All permits shall be valid for seasonal storage purposes and are renewable upon approval of subsequent letters of request. All requests must contain proof of current registration and are subject to inspection of the boat and property to ensure the boat has not become a nuisance or danger. Any denied or expired requests for permitted seasonal storage require removal of the boat from the property within 60 days. A boat may be placed on blocks or cribbing for not more than one year. A property owner shall not have more than two registered and tagged boats and/or boat trailers parked or stored on a property, unless the property owner is operating as a licensed boat storage or boat operations business in accordance with all applicable zoning and other applicable laws or the property owner holds a valid Maryland State Commercial Fishing or Crabbing License. Boats that are stored inside an approved enclosed structure are exempt from this section of the code."

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304 CC. New Section 302.1, Temporary Storage Containers, shall be added as follows: "All temporary storage containers must be permitted per City Code. Semi-truck trailers used to store goods and other similar containers may be deemed temporary storage per review by the Code Official."

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DD. New Section 302.12, Control of animal waste, shall be added as follows: "No owner of a dog, or other pet, shall allow it to soil, defile, defecate upon or commit any other nuisance upon any public property or private property. The pet owner must take immediate steps to eliminate any such nuisance, including feces caused by the animal, in an appropriate and sanitary manner. The owner or occupant shall not allow accumulation of animal feces on any property in their control."

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EE. Section 304.1, General, shall read: "The exterior of a structure shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and sanitary so as not to create a public nuisance or be detrimental to adjoining properties, or pose a threat to the public health, safety or welfare."

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FF. Section 304.3, Premises identification, shall have the following added to the end of the section:
"in the case of structures with accessory apartments, all apartments with side or rear entrances, or
multiple front entrances, must be clearly identified with their apartment number or letter, in
addition to the premises address."

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GG. Section 304.14: The dates in the first line shall be "April 1" and "November 1," respectively.

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HH. New Section 304.20, Storage areas, shall be added as follows: "All open salvage yards and open storage areas shall be continuously completely obscured from surrounding property by a screened fence approved by the Director of Planning, not less than eight feet and not more than 10 feet in height and/or approved landscaping."

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330 II. New Section 305.7, Mold, shall be added as follows: "Where mold is found due to water 331 damage, improper ventilation, mechanical equipment or other causes, the Code Official may 332 require an inspection be performed by a Licensed Inspector at the cost of the property owner to 333 determine the cause of the mold and for abatement of the causes."

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JJ. Section 307.1, General, shall read: "Handrails and guards shall comply with applicable subsections of the 2018 International Residential Code, Sections R311 and R312."

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KK. New Section 308.3.3, Screening, shall be added as follows: "All permanent dumpsters must be fully screened from public view per the standards developed by the Department of Planning."

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LL. Section 505.3 Supply: Add the following to the end of the paragraph: "Disconnected water supply, due to nonpayment of the utility service to a dwelling, shall be posted with a public notice as unfit after five days without service and subject to the provisions of Section 111 of the International Property Maintenance Code. Owners of residential rental units shall not request water supply disconnection as a substitute to legal eviction proceedings."
