CITY OF HOBOKEN ORDINANCE NO.: 3

ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 190-6 ENTITLED NO STOPPING OR STANDING TO ADD NO STOPPING OR STANDING ZONE TO SEVENTH STREET

WHEREAS, Chapter 190 of the Hoboken City Code regulates vehicles and traffic on public streets in Hoboken; and,

WHEREAS, §190-6B lists locations where stopping and standing are prohibited at all times; and,

WHEREAS, the geometry of the intersection of Seventh Street and Jackson Street makes it difficult for large vehicles to safely make turns, especially for buses and trucks making right turns; and,

WHEREAS, the Hoboken Police Department and the Department of Transportation & Parking recommend extending a no stopping or standing zone by 20 feet along the north side Seventh Street east of Jackson Street to improve intersection safety near a park, playground, and school; and,

WHEREAS, this ordinance will supplement actions the City will take to reduce the occurrence of large vehicles traveling through this intersection; and,

WHEREAS, these actions include the ongoing installation of truck route signage at strategic locations along streets across the city to route large vehicles along designated routes.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Hoboken does hereby Ordain as follows (additions noted in underline, deletions noted in strikethrough):

SECTION ONE: AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 190

§190-6 No stopping or standing

B Stopping or standing prohibited at any time. In accordance with the provisions of this subsection, no person shall stop or stand a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

SECTION TWO: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, it being the legislative intent that all such ordinances or part of ordinances now existing or in effect unless the same are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance shall remain in effect.

SECTION THREE: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance, but shall remaining in effect; it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

SECTION FOUR: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION FIVE: CODIFICATION

This ordinance shall be a part of the Code of the City of Hoboken as though codified and fully set forth therein. The City Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Code.

The City Clerk and the Corporation Counsel are authorized and directed to change any Chapter, Article and/or Section number of the Code of the City of Hoboken in the event that the codification of this Ordinance reveals that there is a conflict between the numbers and the existing Code, and in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental repealers of existing provisions not intended to be repealed.
