A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 91 OF THE VILLAGE OF HOLLEY CODE PERTAINING TO ANIMALS

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Holley as follows:

WHEREAS, Chapter 91 of the Official Code of the Village of Holley currently regulates issues related to animals in the Village of Holley, and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary to examine changes in certain aspects of the Village of Holley Code as related to animals, and

WHEREAS, this proposed amendment modifies some portions of the current text of Chapter 91 of the Code of the Village of Holley as it pertains to animals, and

NOW, THEREFORE be it resolved that the following proposed local law was published for public review in accordance with the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Village Law, and that a public hearing was held thereupon on the 11th day of May, 2021, for the purposes of consideration of adoption of the proposed local law which reads as follows:

I. <u>AMENDMENT:</u> - The following provision shall replace the existing code section 91.8 in Chapter 91, Article I, of the Village of Holley Code:

91.8. Number of dogs

The maximum number of dogs over the age of four months allowed to be harbored in any single family residence is three. The maximum number of dogs over the age of four months allowed to be harbored in any multi-unit residential dwelling is three.

Persons, who at the time of adoption of this article, shall have more than three dogs as allowed in this ordinance, shall be allowed to maintain said dogs. However, upon the loss of such dog by death, sale, or other transfer, said persons may not replace that dog if the total number of dogs will be more than three.

- II. <u>AMENDMENT:</u> The following provision, currently in the code as 91-8, shall be renumbered and added to Chapter 91, Article I, of the Village of Holley Code:
 - 91.9 Penalties for offenses. The current text of 91-8 Penalties for offenses shall remain. Only the section number shall be changed from 91-8 to 91-9.
- III. <u>AMENDMENT:</u> The following provisions shall be added to Chapter 91 of the Village of Holley Code:

Article III: Other Common Household Pets shall be added.

91.18

Common household pets are allowed in the Village of Holley if confined indoors in the residence and are domesticated. A common household pet is defined, but not limited to hare, rabbit, gerbil, hamsters, ferret, chinchilla, hedgehog.

IV. <u>AMENDMENT:</u> - The following provisions shall be added to Chapter 91 of the Village of Holley Code:

Article IV: Hoofed Animals shall be added.

91.19

Housing of any hoofed animal is not allowed in the Village of Holley. A hoofed animal is defined as, but not limited to, horse, bovine, sheep, goat, swine, reindeer, deer, donkey, mule, mini horse, pony, cow.

V. <u>AMENDMENT:</u> - The following provisions shall be added to Chapter 91 of the Village of Holley Code:

Article V: Fowl shall be added.

91.20

Definition: A chicken is a domesticated hen. A hen is a female chicken.

The following fowl are not permitted in the Village of Holley: rooster, pigeon, geese, swan, duck, turkey.

91-22 Chickens

- 1. A total of six chickens are permitted.
- 2. Chickens shall be contained or kept in a fully enclosed coop or run.
- a. A coop shall provide a minimum of four square feet per hen. A run shall have a minimum of eight square feet per hen.
- b. A coop and a run shall be at the rear of the residence, at least twenty feet from any property line, and at least five feet from and residence.
 - c. The enclosed run must be attached to, or surround, the coop.
- d. The coop and/or run shall be kept clean, dry, and in sanitary condition at all times. Animal waste, uneaten or discarded food, and feathers are to be removed regularly with a minimum frequency of once per week.
- e. Odor from chickens and/or animal waste shall not create a nuisance for occupants of nearby buildings or properties.
- f. A coop shall be designed and built so that it provides ventilation and shade for the chickens and protection from the weather.
- 3. Slaughtering is prohibited.
- 4. Feed must be stored in an enclosed, rodent-proof container.
- 5. The sale of chickens or eggs on residential property is prohibited.
- VI. <u>AMENDMENT:</u> The following provisions shall be added to Chapter 91 of the Village of Holley Code:

Article VI: Cats shall be added.

91.23

Definition. A cat is any member of the species Felis Catus.

All cats, to the extent practicable, shall be restrained to stay within the boundaries of the premises of the owner.

91-24

No house, apartment, store, yard, enclosure, or other place in the Village of Holley shall be permitted to keep or harbor more than five cats over the age of three months. This section does not apply to any approved/licensed animal establishment, animal shelter, pet shop, veterinary hospital or kennel.

91-25

Restricted Acts. It shall be unlawful for any owner of or person harboring any cat to permit or allow such cat in the Village of Holley to:

- a. Be vicious or to spray or to defecate in such a way as to cause annoyance to any person other than the owner or person harboring such cat.
- b. Cause damage or destruction to property or to commit a nuisance upon the premises of a person other than the owner or person harboring such cat.

VII. <u>AUTHORITY</u>: The Legislative body of the State of New York has granted authority to local government units to adopt and amend local laws from time to time as necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the persons and properties within such local municipality. In addition, the Legislative body of the State of New York has specifically deemed that the local government unit shall adopt a local law in certain situations. That, pursuant to such grant of authority, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 714 of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Holley, being the local legislative body of such municipality, is empowered to adopt a local law creating and/or modifying laws, rules, ordinances or regulations in the Village of Holley.

The Village of Holley Board of Trustees has authorized that these changes be made to the Village of Holley Code and that same be implemented into, and enforced as set forth in the Village of Holley Code.

VIII. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE OF AMENDMENT</u>: The amendment as described above shall become effective upon the filing of this local law in the office of the Secretary of State.
