3 (3) When determining a person's residence for purposes of where he or she is  
4 properly registered to vote, the definition for domicile shall be used (Elections Code  
5 Section 349(a)).

6 (4) The term District shall have the same meaning as "by districts" found in  
7 Government Code Section 34871.

### 8 **§ 2-9.03. Election of members of the City Council By-District.**

9 (a) Following the effective date of this chapter and upon the commencement of  
10 "by district" elections in the order established in § 2-9.01 of this code, members of the  
11 city council shall be elected "by district" as defined in California Government Code  
12 Section 34871 or any successor statute. A person shall not be eligible to be elected to  
13 be a member of the city council unless he or she is otherwise qualified as required by  
14 law and both resided in the geographical area comprising the district from which he or  
15 she is nominated to be elected and was a registered voter of the city at the time  
16 nomination papers are issued to the candidate as provided for in Section 10227 of the  
17 California Elections Code. It is the intent of the city council that no term of any member  
18 of the city council that commenced prior to the effective date of chapter shall be  
19 affected by the adoption of this chapter.

20 (b) Registered voters signing nomination papers or voting for a member of the  
21 city council shall be residents of the geographical area making up the district from  
22 which the member is to be elected.

23 (c) The boundaries of the five City Council districts established by the passage  
24 of Resolution 2026-01 of this Council hereby are established as described on the  
25 Council District Map attached as Exhibit "A" to Resolution 2026-01 of this Council and  
26 incorporated by this reference

27 (d) The terms of the office of each member elected to the city council shall  
28 remain four (4) years.

### 29 **§ 2-9.04. Adjustment of District Boundaries.**

30 (a) Pursuant to Elections Code Section 21601, as it may be amended, the city  
31 council shall adjust the boundaries of any or all of the districts following each  
32 decennial federal census. Using the census as a basis, the city council shall adjust the  
33 boundaries so that the districts shall be as nearly equal in population as practicable  
34 and in compliance with all applicable provisions of law. Any adjustment of district  
35 boundaries shall be made by resolution adopted by the city council before the first day  
36 of November of the year following the year in which each decennial federal census is  
37 taken. Prior to the public hearing

1 approving the adjustment of the district boundaries, the city council shall hold a  
2 public hearing on the proposed district boundaries as required by Elections Code  
3 Section 21607.

4 (b) At the time of any annexation of territory to the city, the city council shall  
5 designate, by resolution adopted by a vote of at least a majority of the city council, the  
6 contiguous district to which the annexed territory shall be a part and shall amend the  
7 district boundaries if necessary in accordance with Election Codes Section 21603, as  
it may be amended.

8 (c) Pursuant to Elections Code Section 21606, the term of office of any council  
9 member who has been elected and whose term of office has not expired shall not be  
10 affected by any change in the boundaries of the district from which he or she was  
11 elected. At the first election for council following adjustment of the boundaries of the  
12 districts, a person meeting the requirements of government code section 34882 shall  
be elected to the city council for each district under the readjusted district plan that has  
the same district number as a district whose incumbent's term on the council is due to  
expire.

13 **§ 2-9.05. Limitation of Terms.**

14 (a) No person shall serve more than four full consecutive terms of office as a  
15 City Councilmember (each term is for four years). The completion of any unexpired  
16 term to which such person was elected or appointed to shall not be considered a term  
17 for the purposes of this subsection.

18 (b) A person who has served four full consecutive terms as a City  
19 Councilmember shall be eligible to serve either as an appointed or elected City  
Councilmember after being out of office for at least one General Municipal Election.

20 (c) The term limits established by this chapter shall be applicable prospectively  
21 to all terms of office for City Councilmembers from and commencing with the terms of  
22 City Councilmembers elected at the March 5, 2024, General Municipal Election.

23 **SECTION 2.** If any action, subsection, line, sentence, clause, phrase, or word  
24 of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, either facially  
25 or as applied, by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall  
26 not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, and each and every  
individual section, subsection, line, sentence, clause, phrase, or word without regard  
to any such decision.

27 **SECTION 3.** In accordance with Government Code § 36937, this ordinance  
28 shall become effective immediately after approval by the City Council.


**SECTION 4.** The City Clerk shall certify the passage of this Ordinance and  
shall cause the same to be published or posted as prescribed by law.

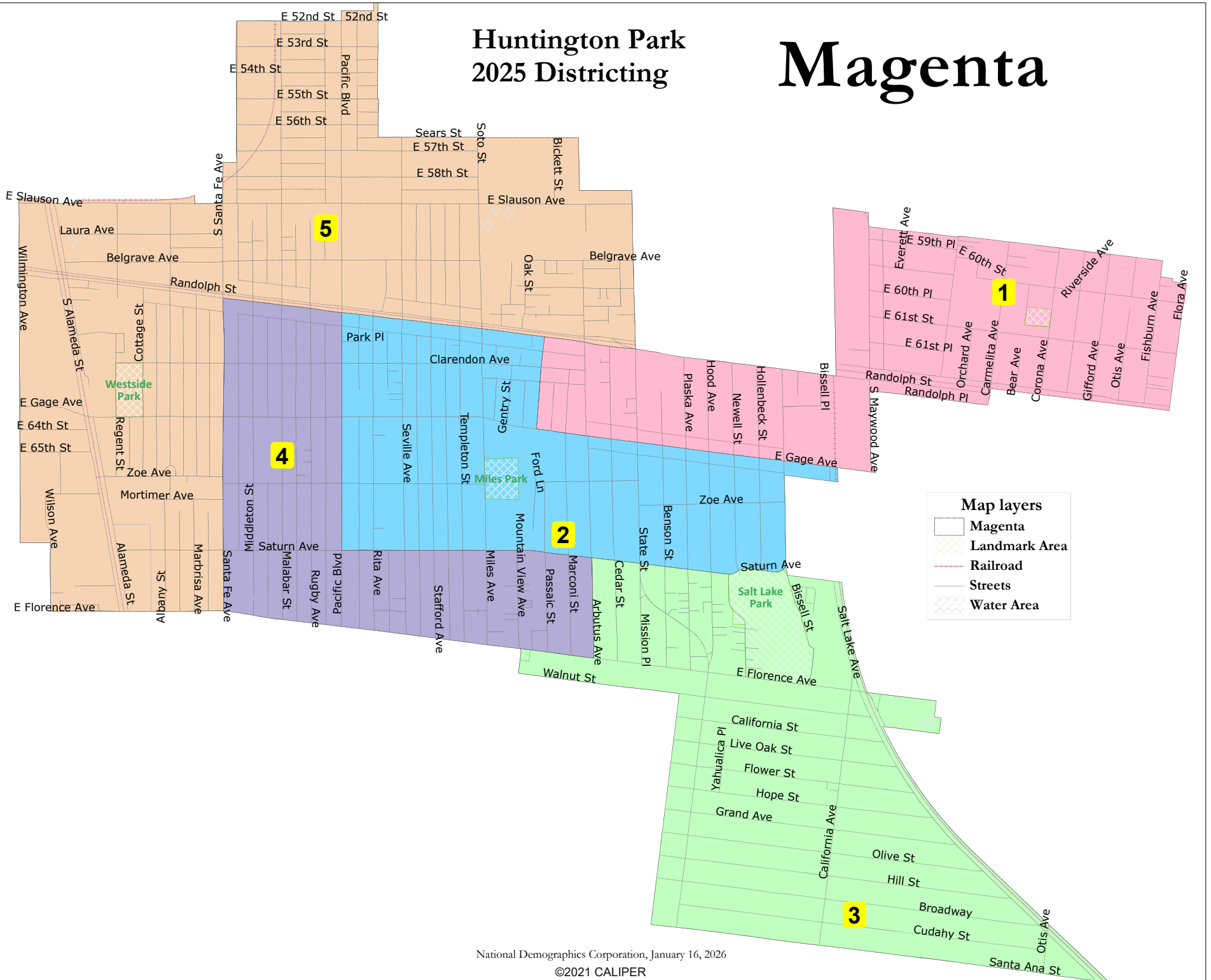
