Chairman Dolce called the meeting to order.

The Committee reviewed the following:

1. Ratification of approval of amended special event application for Lucy Desi Days.
2. Ratification of approval for a fund raising benefit for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Fund on June 5, 2005 at the Bel View Restaurant.
3. Request from the Jamestown Free Methodist Church to hold their annual block party on E. 7<sup>th</sup> Street between Liberty and Lincoln Streets on August 20, 2005.
4. Special Event Applications for Farmer's Market, June through October; Nature Art Festival, July 15-17, 2005; Thunder in the Streets, July 8-10, 2005; Art in the Streets, June 18, 2005; and Jamestown Jammers Promotion, June 24, 2005.

Carried: 3 ayes, 0 nays

The Committee reviewed a request from a business owner on Fairmount Avenue in West Ellicott to rename a portion of Fairmount Avenue. They also reviewed a report from the Department of Public Works. No action was taken on this request as the City Charter requires a petition by the abutting property owners to change the name of a street. The City Clerk will advise the business owner.

A request from The Resource Center for parking restrictions on W. 14<sup>th</sup> Street was tabled pending the development of guidelines for such requests. Ms. Schulz will be asked to attend the next meeting.

Corporation Counsel Fiore-Nieves apprised the Committee of noise concerns that were brought to her attention by a resident of the downtown. She will respond to his concerns. Councilwoman Bloomquist inquired about loud music in the M-Zone. Captain Davies advised that the noise ordinance applied and complaints should be directed to the Police Department.

Mr. Morgante addressed the Committee regarding his concerns on parking on Lakeview Avenue. He would like to see parking on only one side of Lakeview Avenue between Euclid Avenue and Newton Avenue. His request will be forwarded to the Department of Public Works for review and a report.

Councilwoman Bloomquist expressed concerns over dogs.

Captain Davies requested that the code be amended regarding taxi cab driver licenses to add drug or marihuana related misdemeanor charges within the last 5 years as a condition for denial of a license.

Chairman Dolce commented on compliments he received regarding the use of Lakeview Avenue for the Memorial Day Parade.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
