The City Clerk noted that no correspondence was received to be read at the Public Hearing.

Mayor Sundquist asked three times if anyone wished to speak on the matter.

Mayor Sundquist asked if there were any comments from staff or councilmembers present.

Director of Development Crystal Surdyk provided a brief overview regarding the funding categories. They are seeking to move funding from the Target Area Greenlining Façade Improvement Program to the Downtown Handicap Accessibility Improvement Program to work within the time constraints and projects are available to fit into the funding category.

Councilwoman Ecklund asked if there were projects that are currently in need of funding for the Downtown Handicap Accessibility Program.
