James Slagle, 110 W. Third Street, Hotel Jamestown Building: I want to commend the Fire Chief and his men for putting out the fire we had up on 705 this past week and I want to thank the Chief and his men for the good job they did. Captain Barry Swanson – they were all there to help us get out of the building safe. I do appreciate that we have the wonderful people like you and Mayor, as always, you're doing a fantastic job. If you didn't, I'd let you know about it. But what I want to get at, some of our streets in the City of Jamestown need a little more work done on them before winter like Third Street here. I know there's a lot of potholes going down Third Street here need to be looked at before winter. What are we going to do about Second Street? Is there any hope for that this year or next year or anything? Is there Jeff?

Mr. Lehman, Public Works Director: Second Street is a state arterial and we have requested that the State do some work on that. At this point, there's nothing planned but it's potentially a project for next year.

Mr. Slagle: Okay. Thank you Jeff. One more thing – the light on Cherry and Fourth down by our ramp is not working right. They had men up there today. It used to work real good when Main Street went red, so did the one down on Cherry and Fourth Street. Now what it's doing – it's staying green for a long, long time and we press the button several times and it will not go. I talked to the one who's in charge of it – the Chief gave me his number – and he said that he'd been up there and looked at it and he said this cold weather is causing it, so I don't know any more you can do with it, but that street, we do a lot of walking. We go up and get our cars and it's not just us, somebody's going to get hurt on that street. And another thing Chief, they're speeding down Fourth

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Street very bad – it's getting out of control. You might be walking across and if that light changes just right, they will try to hit you and that's happened to me several times. When you tell them to slow down the just give you the finger and I don't want to see anybody killed on that street because we have to walk up and get into our vehicles. And I want to thank Jeff. We're getting the streets paved in the City of Jamestown – the Fifth Street and Sixth Street – that looks fantastic. I rode up it several times. It's music to my ears when I don't hear no bumps or bruises you know or anything like that. It just takes time to get our City and streets back the way they used to be. I know you're all working Jeff hard to keep the City going and the Mayor and the Police Chief and the Fire Chief and the councilmen. I just want to compliment all you guys up there and women, that you're doing a fantastic job for our town so keep the good work up and I thank you very much.

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of State has solicited grant applications under Title 11 for the completion or implementation of a Local or Regional Waterfront Revitalization Program located on New York State designated inland waterways; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City of Jamestown and a group of community partners to construct and maintain a bicycle and pedestrian, multi-use trail through Chadakoin Park to encourage the future use and improvement of the Chadakoin Riverfront and the Chautauqua Lake outlet basin; and

WHEREAS, said local waterfront revitalization is a key component of the City of Jamestown's Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan (LWRP) and the City of Jamestown Urban Design Plan adopted in December 2006; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the City Council of Jamestown, New York is fully committed to and supportive of the application to the *Local Waterfront Revitalization Program Environmental Protection Fund* for Two Hundred Sixty-Two Thousand Five Hundred Eighty One and 00/100 Dollars, (\$262,581.00), in state assistance to complete the "Chadakoin River Trail" through Chadakoin Park.

WHEREAS, Chapter 204 of the Code of the City of Jamestown provides that it shall be unlawful for any person within the corporate limits of the City of Jamestown to act as a hawker, peddler, solicitor or transient retail business without first having obtained and paid for and having in force and effect a valid, current license therefor, and

WHEREAS, Section 204-2(C) of the Code of the City of Jamestown provides that the Jamestown City Council may grant exemptions from the provisions of Chapter 204 of the Code of the City of Jamestown for special events or occasions, and

WHEREAS, the special event known as the AAUW What's New Fair is presently scheduled to take place on November 14 – 15, 2009, and

WHEREAS, the organizers of the AAUW What's New Fair have heretofore requested exemption from the provisions of Chapter 204 of the Code of the City of

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Jamestown for November 14 – 15, 2009 so as to enable up to sixty (60) transient retail businesses to vend their product during the AAUW What's New Fair activities, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Jamestown that an exemption be and the same hereby is granted to the organizers of the AAUW What's New Fair to have up to sixty (60) hawkers, peddlers or transient retail businesses at the Jamestown Community College for the period November 14 – 15, 2009, without need of obtaining the license required by the provisions of Chapter 204 of the Code of the City of Jamestown, provided however, that the permission herein granted shall apply only to those hawkers, peddlers or transient retail businesses authorized by the organizers of the AAUW What's New Fair, which hawkers, peddlers and transient retail businesses shall total no more than sixty (60) in number and further provided that such hawkers, peddlers and transient retail businesses shall in no way be entitled to obstruct, impair or impede pedestrian traffic on the sidewalks of the City of Jamestown nor in any way obstruct, impair or impede the travel of emergency vehicles upon the public streets of the City of Jamestown, and further provided that such hawkers, peddlers and transient retail businesses shall in all respects accede to the directives of the Deputy Fire Chief and Chief of Police of the City of Jamestown or their designated representatives with respect to the location of any vehicle, trailers or other installations associated with such hawkers, peddlers or transient retail businesses, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the City Clerk be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the American Association of University Women (organizers of the AAUW What's New Fair), the Deputy Fire Chief, the Chief of Police and the Corporation Counsel.
