7	WHEREAS, previously Jefferson County, Missouri, established a conflict-of-interest	
8	policy, procedure, and Ordinance applicable to certain officials of Jefferson County which is	
9	mandated by state law at Section 105.483 et seq. RSMo. (2023); and,	
10	WHEREAS, the Jefferson County, Missouri, Council desires to renew and readopt	
11	the conflict-of-interest policy, procedure and Ordinance which must be renewed every two	
12	(2) years as mandated by the State of Missouri, via the Missouri Ethics Commission under	
13	and pursuant to Missouri State Law; and,	
14	WHEREAS, the Jefferson County, Missouri, Council models the instant Ordinance	
15	after the recommended Ordinance as drafted by the Missouri Ethics Commission.	
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE JEFFERSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, COUNCIL,	
17	AS FOLLOWS:	
18	Section 1. The Jefferson County, Missouri, Code of Ordinances are hereby

renewed, readopted, and shall be continued to be codified as follows:

#### **SECTION 115.010: DECLARATION OF POLICY**

The proper operation of county government requires that public officials and employees be independent, impartial, and responsible to the people; that government decisions and policy be made in the proper channels of the government structure; that public office not be used for personal gain; and that the public have confidence in the integrity of its government. In recognition of these goals and in accordance with the provisions of Section 105.483 et seq, RSMo., there is hereby established a procedure for disclosure by certain officials and employees of private financial or other interests in matters affecting the County.

#### **SECTION 115.020: CONFLICTS OF INTEREST**

- A. All elected and appointed officials as well as employees of Jefferson County shall comply with Sections 105.450 et seq of the Missouri Revised Statutes on conflicts of interest as well as any other state law governing official conduct.
- B. Each member of the Jefferson County, Missouri, County Council or other required appointee or employee who has a "substantial personal or private interest" in any measure, bill, order, or ordinance proposed or pending before the County Council shall disclose that interest to the Clerk of Jefferson County and such disclosure shall be recorded in the journal of the County Council.
- C. Substantial personal or private interest is defined as ownership by the individual, his/her spouse, or his/her dependent children, whether singularly or collectively, directly, or indirectly, of:
  - (1) 10% or more of any business entity; or

1	(2) An interest having a value of \$10,000 or more; or
2	(3) The receipt of a salary gratuity or other compensation or remuneration of
3	\$5,000 or more, per year, from any individual, partnership, organization, or
4	association within any calendar year.
5	SECTION 115.030: DISCLOSURE OF REPORTS
6	All Jefferson County elected officials, its chief administrative officer, its chief
7	purchasing officer, its County Counselor, officials, or employees authorized to promulgate or
8	vote on rules and regulations with the force of law shall disclose in writing the following
9	information by May 1st, or the appropriate deadline as referenced in Section 105.487 RSMo,
10	if any such transactions occurred during the previous calendar year:
11	1. For such person, and all persons within the first degree of consanguinity or
12	affinity of such person, the date, and the identities of the parties to each
13	transaction with a total value in excess of five hundred dollars (\$500), if any,
14	that such person had with the political subdivision, other than compensation
15	received as an employee or payment of any tax, fee or penalty due to the
16	political subdivision, and other than transfers for no consideration to the
17	political subdivision; and
18	
19	2. The date and the identities of the parties to each transaction known to the
20	person with a total value in excess of five hundred dollars (\$500), if any, that
21	any business entity in which such person had a substantial interest, had with
22	the political subdivision, other than payment of any tax, fee or penalty due to

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the political subdivision or transaction involving payment for providing utility service to the political subdivision, and other than transfers for no consideration to the political subdivision; and

- 3. The County Executive, Director of Administration, the members of the County Council, The Auditor, the chief purchasing officer, and candidates for those positions, also shall disclose in writing by May 1<sup>st</sup>, or the appropriate deadline as referenced in Section 105.487, RSMo., for the previous calendar year the following information:
  - a. The name and address of each of the employers of such person from whom income of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more was received during the year covered by the statement;
  - b. The name and address of each sole proprietorship which he/she owned; the name, address and the general nature of the business of each general partnership and joint venture in which he/she was a partner or participant; the name and address of each partner or co-participant for each partnership or joint venture unless such name and addresses are filed by the partnership or joint venture with the Secretary of State; the name, address and general nature of the business conducted of any closely held corporation or limited partnership in which the person owned ten percent (10%) or more of any class of the outstanding stock or limited partners' units; and the name of any publicly traded corporation or limited partnership which

1		is listed on a regulated stock exchange or automated quotation system
2		in which the person owned two percent (2%) or more of any class of
3		outstanding stock, limited partnership units or other equity interests;
4		c. The name and address of each corporation for which such
5		person served in the capacity of director, officer, or receiver.

7	The r	eport(s) shall be filed with the Jefferson County, County Clerk and with the
8	Missouri Eth	ics Commission. The reports shall be available for public inspection and
9	copying duri	ng normal business hours.
10	SECT	TION 115.050: WHEN FILED
11	A.	The financial interest statements shall be filed at the following times, but no
12	person is requ	aired to file more than one financial interest statement in any calendar year.
13	1.	Every person required to file a financial interest statement shall file the
14		statement annually not later than May 1 and the statement shall cover the
15		calendar year ending the immediately preceding December 31; provided that
16		any member of the (council/board) may supplement the financial interest
17		statement to report additional interests acquired after December 31 of the
18		covered year until the date of filing of the financial interest statement.
19	2.	Each person appointed to office shall file the statement within thirty days of
20		such appointment or employment covering the calendar year ending the
21		previous December 31.
22	3.	Every candidate required to file a personal financial disclosure statement shall
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1		file no later than fourteen days after the close of filing at which the candidate	
2		seeks nomination or election or nomination by caucus. The time period of this	
3		statement shall cover the twelve months prior to the closing date of filing for	
4		candidacy.	
5	B.	Financial disclosure reports giving the financial information required in	
6	Section 3 shall	ll be filed with the Jefferson County, County Clerk and with the Missouri	
7	Ethics Commi	ission. The reports shall be available for public inspection and copying during	
8	normal business hours.		
9	SECT	ION 115.060: FILING OF ORDINANCE	
10	The Cl	lerk of Jefferson County shall send a certified copy of this Ordinance to the	
11	Missouri Ethio	cs Commission within ten (10) days of its adoption.	
12	Section	n 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full effect from and after	
13	the date of its	enactment and passage and shall remain in effect for two years after the date of	
14	its passage or ı	until amended or repealed, but in no event for more than two years. If any part	
15	of this Ordinar	nce is invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the remainder of	
16	this Ordinance	<b>.</b>	
17	Section	n 3. Governing Law. This Ordinance shall be governed exclusively by	
18	and construed	in accordance with the applicable laws of the State of Missouri.
