ORDINANCE 2024-2

Ordinance Vacating Handicapped Parking Space at 125 Kearny Avenue and Reestablishing the Handicapped Parking Space at the Same Location for a Different Person

WHEREAS, the handicapped person for whom a restricted parking space had been established previously by Ordinance 2019-36 at 125 Kearny Avenue has advised that she no longer needs the space; and

WHEREAS, another resident of the property has requested the use of the handicapped space at the same location; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has found and reported that the continuation of the restricted parking space in front of 125 Kearny Avenue hereinafter set forth is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic; now, therefore, be it

ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Kearny, Hudson County, New Jersey that:

1. The restricted parking zone previously established by Ordinance 2019-36 for use by a handicapped person in front of 125 Kearny Avenue be and hereby is vacated for that person.
2. A restricted parking space be and hereby is re-established in front of 125 Kearny Avenue, which is occupied by a handicapped person, at the location specified:

<u>Residence</u>	<u>Location</u>	<u>Handicapped Person</u>
125 Kearny Avenue	Beginning at a point 91 feet south of of the Southwest curb line of Kearny Avenue and Hoyt Street to a point 22 feet south thereof.	Olga Lebron

3. No space shall be established, however, unless a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates have been issued for a vehicle owned by the handicapped person, or by another occupant of the residence who is a member of the immediate family of the handicapped person, by the Division of Motor Vehicles pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-204.

4. No other vehicle shall be permitted to park in the designated space.

5. A sign, as prescribed by N.J.S.A. 39:4-198, shall remain at the place where this ordinance is effective.


