**CHAPTER 182 STREET PERFORMERS AND ENTERTAINERS**

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**§182-3 Application for license; fee.**

- A. Application for such licenses shall be made upon a blank form furnished by the Mayor, signed and verified, giving the name, address, and telephone number of the applicant. Said application shall be filed with the Village of Lake George offices and accompanied by a fee.
- B. Applicants may be required to perform their chosen skills at a time and place so designated by the Mayor in advance of each season.

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**§182-7 Locations and hours for performances.**

- A. Performances regulated hereunder will take place in the following areas only:

  - (1) Blais Park on or about the parapet area;
  - (2) Lower Montcalm and Canada Street; and
  - (3) Canada Street at the U.S Post Office.
- B. Performances may also take place at a fair or public festival authorized by Village law

and upon written permission of the sponsor therein.  
C. Performance hours shall be approved by the Mayor.
