ORDINANCE NO. 2023- 24

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND LINCOLN MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 10.08.01 REGARDGING WATER METER DEPOSITS, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN, ARKANSAS, THAT:

Section One: <u>Title.</u> This Ordinance shall be known as an Ordinance to Amend Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.08.01 Regarding Water Meter Deposits, Declaring an Emergency, and for Other Purposes.

Section Two: Findings. The City Council finds as follows:

- a. The portion of Lincoln Municipal Code § 10.08.01 dealing with water meter deposits was last amended in 2007.
- b. The City's costs in administering and maintaining its water system increased in the 16 years since the deposit and reconnection fees were last amended.

Section Three: L.M.C. § 10.08.01 Amended. Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.08.01, dealing with security deposits, is amended to read as follows:

Meter deposit required. From and after the effective date hereof, every new connection to the water system shall require payment of a \$150 \$200 minimum security deposit.

<u>Section Four: Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after 91 days following its publication unless an Emergency Clause is appended.

<u>Section Five:</u> <u>Repealing Clause</u>. Ordinances or parts thereof in effect at the time that this ordinance shall take effect that are in conflict herewith, are repealed.

<u>Section Six:</u> <u>Saving Clause</u>. Nothing herein shall be deemed to affect any rights or obligations existing at the time of the passage of this ordinance.

<u>Section Seven:</u> <u>Severability Clause</u>. In the event any portion of this ordinance is declared inoperative or invalid as a result of a statute or judicial decision, then only that portion expressly so declared to be inoperative or invalid shall be affected thereby and all other provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

Section Eight: Emergency Clause. The Lincoln City Council finds and declares that effective, reliable and functioning water service is imperative to the life, health, safety, welfare and commerce of the citizens of the City of Lincoln, and that adequate financial resources are necessary to a functioning water system. The City needs water service that is fiscally sound and selfsustaining, and the current water security deposit and reconnection fee structure falls short on both of those criteria. Therefore, this matter is such pressing business that it is viewed that an immediate solution is necessary thereby creating an emergency. It is hereby declared that based on the conditions set forth herein, an emergency exists and this Ordinance, being necessary for the immediate protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Lincoln, Arkansas, shall be in effect immediately upon its passage, approval, and publication.
