

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 140 LIBRARY ARTICLE I - SECTIONS 140.020 & 140.030, ARTICLE II 140.090.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOUISIANA, PIKE COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS, TO-WIT:

Section 140.020 Use Generally.

The free public library shall be forever dedicated to the use of the inhabitants of the City subject, however, to such reasonable rules and regulations as the Library Board of Directors may adopt in order to render the use of the library and reading rooms of the greatest benefit to the greatest number of people. The Board may exclude from the use of the library and reading rooms any person who shall willfully violate such rules. The Board may extend the privileges and use of the library and reading rooms to persons outside of the City, in the State, upon terms and conditions as the Board may from time to time by its regulations prescribe.

Section 140.030 Funds — Disposition of Fines.

- A. All money received for the Library shall be deposited in the City Treasury to the credit of the Library Fund, shall be kept separate and apart from other money of the City and shall be drawn upon by the proper officers of the City upon properly authorized vouchers drawn by the Library Board of Directors and signed by the President and attested by the Secretary of such Board.
- B. Bequeathed donations or trust funds shall be deposited into reserve accounts. The principal from these funds shall be used for capital improvements or major repairs of the Library, provided this is permitted by the trust. Any interest earned by these reserve accounts or trusts shall be credited to the Library Fund within the City Treasury, to be used according to the purposes outlined in the trust. These purposes must be documented and recorded.
- C. All fines collected under this Chapter shall be deposited in the City Treasury to the credit of the Library Fund and for the use of the free public library.
